

Chairman Grant reported this "news" to the Board during its August 2008 meeting. A discussion by the Board resulted in the unanimous decision to continue offering the Awards and to do so without any "rule" changes at the present time. The Board also agreed to look into utilizing our website, http://www.grandlodgeofpennsylvaniaioof.org, to help in promoting the Awards for 2009.

Therefore, the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs Association of Western Pennsylvania will once again be offering \$2,000 music awards to a maximum of three (3) students who fulfill the specified requirements of the award. 

FROM THE DESK OF THE DEPARTMENT COMMANDER

April Again



Barney Wells was used to pranks. He was an experienced teacher and had encountered any number of stunts in his class room. The great depression was looming in 1933 and there were many young people with no work or hope for a job. Idle minds are the devil's workshop. The truth of this became apparent in 1933.

On April Fool's Day, one or more juvenile delinquents had painted a line over the two O's in the IOOF sign at Barney's lodge hall and filled the O's in to look like eyes. The image looked like the sign outside an optometrist's office. Barney and the remainder of the house committee met on the Monday after Easter to discuss the method of cleaning up this mess.

The first possible solution they came up with was to remove the paint applied by the graffiti artists. This did not work. The paint in the sign was the same type and the attempted repair looked bad. The second suggestion was to paint over the sign. This would work but would take a lot of work, more money and look terrible, unless the whole sign was repainted.

The house committee decided it would throw the matter to the whole lodge for a decision. The lodge met and spent over an hour discussing the matter. Brother Martin was a regional sales manager for a national paint manufacturing firm and he offered to donate the paint to redo the entire sign. The lodge accepted his offer.

Two weeks later, Barney came home from school and his wife told him there was a delivery on the back porch. Barney was thrilled to see two cases of five-gallon cans of paint. His excitement waned when he opened the cases to find that one case contained mint green paint and the other case contained deep purple paint. His despair was punctuated when his wife told him there was another case of paint on the steps because she didn't want it brought in the house, there was mud on the case. Barney went out and opened the third case, it was deep purple too.

Barney called another house committee meeting. The house committee didn't want to spend the money buying paint, the economy was rough. The green and purple paint just didn't meet the taste of the committee. Barney called Brother Martin. He didn't know what he could do. The factory would only send him free paint of the overruns. If the overrun of the month was purple, that is what he got samples.

The committee next thought about a paint swap. Maybe there was someone else who could use green and purple paint. Each committee member was assigned to a different retail outlet or painting contractor. Extensive contacts for two weeks brought nothing. Barney was stumped.

He called Brother Martin to see if he could get more free paint. A little more than a week later, he came home from school and his wife told him there were three cases of paint on the back porch. Barney went out to see what arrived. There were three cases of sun yellow paint on his back porch. This was not going to go over well with the house committee either. Barney called another meeting and asked Brother Martin to attend. There was a long discussion and finally Brother Martin had what he thought might be the answer. He was the factory sales manager for the largest region in the country. He could get one-fourth of the entire factory overrun sent to him. On April 28 Barney came home from school and his wife told him that there were two trucks that covered the first floor of Barn with cases of paint. Barney found red, white, blue, black, orange and six colors of paint he never saw before.

The first Saturday in May, the lodge painted the entire sign with a royal purple back and red, white and blue links. The Lodge name and number were painted in white. The sign looked beautiful. Now all the lodge had to do was find some use for 162 five-gallon buckets of many different colors of paint.

The next lodge meeting was well attended because the new sign attracted the attention of all passers by. Barney announced the problem and asked Brother Martin if he could help. Brother Martin said he had pulled every trick he knew as regional sales manager to get the paint and he was afraid he wouldn't be regional sales manager any longer if he tried to send the paint back.

Barney did not want the paint sitting in his barn forever. The lodge did not have the space anywhere for that amount of paint and the cans were marked "not for resale" so they couldn't sell them. Brother Johnson remarked that his chicken coop needed painting. Lights and bells went off in Brother Clancey's head. He asked, "Why don't we paint chicken coops to raise money for the lodge?" Thus began the Odd Fellows chicken coop adventure. The project lasted the entire spring and summer with Barney's lodge raising enough money to pay the Grand Lodge taxes, real estate taxes on the building and prepare a community Thanksgiving dinner for the needy in the community.

The lodge had charged less to paint a chicken coop than the normal retail cost of paint, so the color of the paint was the choice of the lodge. When Barney would drive to work each morning that fall, he would see the multi-colored handiwork of his lodge. All the colors of the rainbow; this seemed appropriate to Barney as he remembered the signs of the degrees.

They will have Thomas Wildey's chair, apron and collar and a model of the Seven Star Tavern, The Traveler and many other items on display. There will be a guided bus tour of Baltimore which will include the Wildey & Ridgley Monuments, Thomas Wildey's Tomb and Water Street where the Tavern was located along with many other historical sites in Baltimore.


Preceding the evening meeting the Rebekah Assembly Degree was given to six Past Noble Grand's.




