



THE HEAT OF SUMMER

Barney was off in July. He was planning the big July 4th celebration and burned his finger on a match while lighting a Roman candle. It put him a day behind on cultivating the corn and, well, the rest is history.

In August 1918 the Canadian and Australian troops reached the Hindenberg line and the allies seemed on the path to victory. Barney was sitting in the trenches, performing maintenance on his weapons and trying to get prepared for action he anticipated in the Argonne Forest. Barney had met Pennsylvania native, Hunter Liggett, in his travels and was impressed by the General.

The trenches could get fairly boring. Barney tried to think of ways to keep his men from getting stale and disorderly. The primary amusement of soldiers not actively engaged in something constructive was gambling. Barney was somewhat religious and hated gambling. He tried to keep the men occupied. He was a newly-made company commander and had some deep feelings of responsibility for his men.

He thought the best way to keep all the men busy was to have them perform. He thought back over the degrees he had received and decided that the story of David and Jonathan was the best way to entertain the troops and instill some interdependence among the men. He pulled out his ritual and began to write a play that would carry the story line but differ enough from the degree that he wouldn't be revealing anything.

Being a playwright is hard work. Barney labored for hours getting the dialogue just the way he wanted it. He didn't have any way of copying the script so he would have to make the men memorize their parts.

He called for volunteers to participate. This was the beginning of the hard part. Men seemed more willing to volunteer for a charge from the trenches than to participate in a play. He had to use force and guile to fill his cast. He had Sergeant Browning saw the handle off a trenching shovel so that it barely had enough to grab onto. He told the men that he needed someone to shovel out the latrine so that he could move it. They had to use the shovel with no handle. Of course, volunteers for the play would be exempt from that particular work detail. This inspired many to become thespians.

This had to be a no-costume play. Barney spoke with several other officers in his regiment and set a date to perform the play. There was no hard fighting so he could rehearse at will, for a while anyway. He had the men at a particularly quiet, wooded area early in the morning and began his duties as director. Barney had been told that no officers were to be actors in the play, so he was the director.

Rehearsal was a disaster. It was good that he didn't have printed scripts because most of his cast could barely read. Instilling enthusiasm was not something that Barney excelled in. The motivational techniques from his officer training were ill-fitted for a stage production. Barney tried to exemplify each part of the play but it seemed to be without success.

During the second day of rehearsal, a sniper took a shot at the cast rehearsing. The men quickly retreated to the trenches, with two men carrying their wounded comrade. After about ten minutes the sniper was dispatched and the wounded soldier taken back to the aid station.

Barney thought about the incident and prepared a rousing speech to encourage the men to put the same feelings into the play that they had felt when they came under fire that day. His speech seemed to go over quite well. The men appeared to be picking up on the theme and were acquiring an interest in performing, so long as they weren't being shot at.

The rehearsal went fairly well the next few days and the play was ready to be presented. The ultimate interference would come from the enemy. This did not occur. Barney, however, felt almost as bad when the play was over.

The play began with King Saul lamenting his mental state. This went poorly. The character of King Saul could not remember his lines. He became befuddled and started to invent dialogue. This threw the other actors off and caused a great confusion. After a much too long scene one, the herald was dispatched.

The herald was bright and had performed in a high school play. He was also drunk. This made for terrible dialogue and had Barney contemplating how he could discipline the herald. Sergeant Browning was Jesse and he was flawless. David was a fairly good soldier and Barney thought he would do well also. His estimation would probably have been correct if David had not suffered an infected tooth. The dentist was far enough away that he could not rotate the soldier back in time for the play.

Back in the court of King Saul, the guards were reasonably proficient in their brief dialogue and the drama centered on Jonathan. Jonathan was a fairly good soldier but a reluctant actor. He stammered and mumbled his lines and became completely confused when he played opposite King Saul, who was writing his script as he went along. This made Barney feel that he had truly met his calling and he should be a soldier or a teacher or a farmer or anything but a stage director.

Before the play could be concluded, the Germans began shelling the positions and the men all ran for cover. As luck would have it, the barn where the play was being performed did not get hit. The trenches where the men would have been had there been no play, were flattened. Barney had been very lucky.

Barney gathered all the men back in the barn after the shelling had stopped. He took center stage and began his sermon:

"We have been spared destruction from an artillery bombardment because we were in this barn. It is fitting and appropriate that we should have avoided injury while studying a great lesson in brotherly love from history. We should look out for one another, for this is the only way any one of us can survive this war."

The whole incident made the men more reliant upon one another and improved morale.


"It was a real good way to start the week," Lititz skipper Frank Camera said. "I was a little disappointed after last week. We're still coming together as a team relatively early in the season, but we have a lot of games packed in, so we don't have the time to just slowly get game ready. We have to get game ready. Right now, we're still not playing up to our potential. We still have a lot of room to grow."

That was evident in the early stages of Monday's game, as the Odd Fellows (2-1-1) left six runners on base in the first two innings against CV starter Joe Moyer while failing to execute bunt plays and falling behind 2-1.

"We've been slow adjusting to pitchers every game we've played so far," Camera said. "It's been one time through the lineup before we've made the adjustments. The way the season has gone, we had a weak pitcher, we had a good pitcher that we saw, we had a weak pitcher, we had a good pitcher. BUS TRIP TO PIRATES GAME



- 5. Make whoopee pies by spreading filling on flat side of one cookie and making a sandwich with another cookie. Makes 2 dozen cookies.




Pinwheels

2 cups sifted flour	4 tsp. baking powder
1/2 tsp. salt	1/2 tsp. cream of tartar
2 tsp. sugar	1/2 cup shortening
2/3 cup milk	
2-3 Tbsp. butter or	margarine, melted
2 Tbsp. sugar	1 tsp. cinnamon, raisins, opt.

- 1. Sift together flour, baking powder, salt, cream of tartar, and 2 tsp. sugar. Cut in shortening until mixture resembles course crumbs. Add milk and stir until dough follows fork around bowl.
- 2. Turn onto lightly floured surface. Knead gently for 1/2 minute. Roll ouut dough to 1/4 inch thickness.
- 3. Spread with melted butter. Sprinkle with 2 Tbsp. sugar, cinnamon, and raisins. Roll up and seal edges. Cut into 1/2 inch slices. Arrange, cut side down, on a greased baking sheet.
- 4. Bake at 450 degrees for 12-15 minutes.

Makes 4 dozen cookies.



- 1. To prepare dough cream together butter and powdered sugar until fluffy.
- 2. Sift together cornstarch and flour and add to batter, beating until well mixed. Refrigerate at least 1 hour.
- 3. Shape batter into walnut size balls. Arrange on lightly greased cookie sheet.
- 4. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 minutes or until light brown. Cool before frosting.
- 5. To prepare frosting combine all ingredients except pecans and mix well. Spread frosting over cookies. Dip top of each cookie in finely chopped pecans.
