FROM THE DESK OF THE DEPARTMENT COMMANDER



One Cold Day

Barney was cold. He was wet. He was very tired. He was hungry. It was January 1929 and Barney had been coerced into sponsoring the ski club at the high school where he taught. His wife's sister's daughter was a student at the same school and she wanted to learn to ski. Her name was Emily and she always was able to get Uncle Barney to do things for her. Barney was in charge of 16 high school sophomores, juniors and seniors, spending a January weekend in the Poconos.

They left New Jersey immediately after school on Friday, January 18, 1929 and were to return on January 20, 1929. The other chaperone came down with the flu. The train tickets were purchased and Barney was there with 16 teenagers. Conveniently, there were 8 boys and 8 girls. The majority of the members of the ski club were on the trip. Barney did not know how to ski. He was not used to the harsh winter weather in the mountains.

When they got to the lodge, the ski instructor who was arranged for the group came to the lobby and greeted them. He told them that breakfast would be at 7:30 a.m. and they would be out on the slopes till dark on Saturday. The train ride only took three hours so they were being indoctrinated in skiing by 8:30 p.m.

Barney took all of them for a late dinner and cocoa and thought he could have them all in bed by 10:00 p.m. Barney's children were very small and he had never been the chaperone at a high school event before. There were four rooms with girls and four rooms with boys at 10:00 p.m. It took Barney walking the halls all night to keep it that way. He didn't know whether the Ski Club was a Ski Club or dating club.

With less than two hours sleep, Barney dragged himself out at 6:30 a.m. for breakfast at 7:30 a.m. The students seemed quite awake. Barney didn't plan on doing any skiing so he didn't bring any ski gear. He though he would watch the lessons and the students on the slopes. Much to his dismay, pairs of students would wander off into the pines from time to time. He had to make sure they came out of the pines before too much time passed. This was not fun. He did not have snow boots and he was not prepared to chase through the woods.

By 6:30 p.m. Barney had marched the students into the restaurant for dinner and was feeling exhausted. At least Saturday was over and he would put the students on the train at 8:30 a.m. the next day. He fell asleep at the dinner table. The waiter noticed Barney's Odd Fellows ring and mentioned it to the manager. The manager came to Barney's table and told him there would be free pumpkin pie after dinner. As Barney got up to settle the account for the ski club, the manager took him aside and identified himself as an Odd Fellow.

Barney spent fifteen minutes watching the students in the lobby while talking to the manager. He lamented the behavior of the high school students and the fact that he was falling asleep every where he went. The manager listened attentively and pondered what solution he could offer. It wouldn't be safe to lock the doors and he didn't want to make his staff seem like the police. He finally came up with a solution. He put an easy chair in the hallway and Barney could sit their for an hour then the manager would sit for an hour, then each of the other two Odd Fellows on the staff would sit their for an hour. If there was a problem, the other proctors would notify Barney immediately. Barney drank coffee while he was there and the restaurant sent up a pot every half hour.

Things settled down by 2:00 a.m. He didn't think any of the students had done anything to cause him a problem. He was not sure he would ever chaperone a group again. When he awakened in the morning, Barney was able to get the student to breakfast, packed and down to the train by 8:30 a.m. He arranged for the boys to be in a different car from the girls. He sat in the middle of the group of boys and slept all the way to the train station.

Barney was never so glad to get home. He made sure that all of the students were picked up at the train station by the adult designated to perform that duty and went home and fell asleep in his chair. His wife awakened him for dinner, but Barney passed and went up to bed. He got enough sleep on Sunday to get up and do his job teaching on Monday morning.

The next Sunday, Barney's sister-in-law and family came over for dinner. The meal was in full progress when Emily stated, "The trip last weekend was so much fun. When do you think the club can take another, Uncle Barney?"

Barney paused to think. He felt like saying "never" or "when you get a new faculty sponsor." But was reluctant to say anything. He discussed the matter with his wife, after dinner. She didn't have any suggestions except that the other club sponsor should do the next field trip by herself. Barney went to the next faculty meeting and suggested that Miss Walker should chaperone the next Ski Club trip. Miss Walker was young and fresh and thought she could handle this. There was a February ski trip to the same area but a different lodge. Miss Walker resigned the week after the ski trip. The principal asked Barney if he had any idea why Miss Walker quit. Barney replied, "No idea." The next year, Barney was the sponsor of the coin collecting club.

P.O.F. DAYS GONE BY (72 Years Ago, January 1937)

A NEW DEGREE FOR ODD FELLOWSHIP

Some time ago some waggish (or was he waggish?) brother suggested that a new degree be provided for a certain class of members and that said degree be known as the "Past Usefulness Degree". The more though we have given to the subject the more we realize the far reaching effect such a degree might have. Past Usefulness! How many of our members might qualify? How many who, after receiving all the honors that might reasonably be expected, have allowed their interest to lapse and have ceased entirely to give their lodge the benefit of their knowledge and experience? How about the degree? An obligation somewhat like this.

I _____ (Name), being an Odd Fellow who has been honored by this lodge and the Order of Odd Fellows, do hereby renounce any and all future interest in said Order, except that of receiving from my brethren attentive and financial benefits should I find

them necessary.

I do further agree to refrain from any participation in lodge activities which may require my time or entail any expense, except that I agree to attend every free entertainment provided by the lodge and to do my full share toward disposal of whatever refreshments may be offered.

I shall refrain from visiting my more unfortunate or sick brother, from attending his funeral, and from contributing in any manner to the relief of his stricken family. I do agree also to advise my family that they are to expect prompt and generous assistance should the occasion offer. That my lodge will promptly pay to them a funeral benefit and that my kiddies will be educated and maintained in a home provided for that purpose should such be necessary. All this I solemnly promise to fulfill and do agree to pay my dues before the fourteenth meeting night should I not forget so to do.

The candidate, after subscribing to the prescribed obligation, shall have placed upon hid head a halo of lettuce leaves, shall be clothed in garments of deepest purple (signifying his royalty) and shall be led around the room solemnly while a funeral dirge is played.

Each officer and member shall grasp his right hand with the brothers' right hand and in mournful tones bid the brother's usefulness a fond farewell. The following song may, or may not, be sung:

Farewell brother we shall miss you, No longer hear you rant and rare, No more listen to you argue We shall fill your vacant chair

We shall miss you, oh my brother Else some night a feed is on. Then we'll find you with another Doing an eating marathon.

We shall not forget to tell you When the banquet dates arrive If we forget advice to send you You can skin us all alive.

Farewell brother you may wander Anywhere in any land. And you need no longer squander Time in lending helping hand. Now your usefulness is ended We know now what to expect. Until when you must be suspended We will treat you with respect.

The candidate shall then be led to the desk of the Secretary and given a receipt for all dues paid to date. Mean while each brother will station himself at the inner door and as the candidate emerges, give him one good kick in the pants. Any candidates?

ALMA LODGE TO ADMIT FIRST DOG AS BENEFICIAL MEMBER

Well, I'll bet that headline got your attention. I couldn't wait for April Fools Day. No, we're not admitting our canine friends into the Lodge yet, although I have the feeling that some of these special dogs—police dogs—could make it through initiation after a little coaching.

What Alma Lodge did do is make a donation (see photo) to help the City of Johnstown purchase a new police dog—two, in fact. And, after researching this story, I believe it was one of the best gifts we ever made.

It seems the K-9 division needed some help in replacing their K-9 officers due to retirement and job related disabilities. The dog in the photo is named Xander, a German Shepherd, and suffered from the hip problems German Shepherd frequently acquire.

Xander's partner, also pictured with our Lodge Secretary, John Pearce, is K-9 Officer Michael Kanuch (pronounced Kan'you). I spoke with Officer Kanuch about his job and the dogs and I have never spoken with a more grateful recipient of a donation from our Lodge.

He repeatedly thanked the Odd Fellows for their contribution and wanted us to know how much it helped the city and the K-9 Division. It seems there's a shortage of money for use in the police department (there's a lot of that going around these days), and some of the expenses of purchasing and caring for these dogs just isn't being met. The officers have to foot some of the costs personally. They hold fund-raisers, raffles, and ask for donations to help offset the cost of maintaining these dogs, but the dogs get cared for properly regardless of how much money their handlers can raise.

There are 2 new dogs on the force now, Belgian Malinois, about 2 ½ years old, and they cost between \$6,000 and \$7,500 each. They will serve about 8 years. There are 7 K-9 officers on the force and 7 dogs. Another will retire in January, 2009. These

dogs are used for apprehension of suspects, building searches for suspects who run into a building and hide, possibly armed, and to sniff out narcotics. One is especially trained to detect bombs. These dogs can save the life of an officer but I got the impression that the officers would risk their lives to save their dog if it came to that. These guys love their dogs and provide a real asset to the force.

What happens to the older dogs when they retire? The city allows the officer who worked with the dog to buy it for \$1.00 and take it home and care for it until its life is over. That's exactly what Officer Kanuch did. Xander now stays with Officer Kanuch's mother because the new dog Officer Kanuch is working with and Xander don't get along too well.

Odd Fellows have a mission to visit the sick, relieve the distressed, bury the dead and educate the orphan. I would say donating to a cause that helps all the honest citizens of a city remain safe from crime comes under relieving the distressed. I am very glad we were able to help the Johnstown City Police Department's K-9 Division and hope we will do so again in the future.

Officer kanuch offered to put on a demonstration for our Lodge of what his K-9 partner can do and I'm thinking that we just may take him up on that offer next summer at our annual picnic if the scheduling works out. Maybe our Noble Grand at the time could wear some heavily padded clothes and attempt to flee when Officer Kanuch orders him to "freeze". That would be neat to watch. Heh heh heh.....
