

FROM THE DESK OF THE DEPARTMENT COMMANDER



Finally Spring

Barney was off in February. He was planning on doing a diatribe against Cupid, because he had to plan the Valentine's Day party each year, but he got overwhelmed and just left it slip.

The beginning of spring is always an anticipated event. It marks a change in the weather and the beginning of the gardening season. Barney did a fair amount of farming as well as teaching, so spring was a busy time. The first adventure was to clean up the area for planting. Winter seemed to leave a lot of debris on the ground. He tried to have a cover crop to plow under, but usually got side-tracked with the fall degree rally, his duties as a teacher and other things. This story takes place in March 1938, so the hard economic times did nothing to make his life less hectic.

Barney always planted his onion sets first. He raised the sets on his enclosed porch. He kept a wood burner on the porch to keep it warm. He planted the seeds and raised his own sets or small bulbs. Since he sold a few onions, he planted three acres with onion sets. He planted another ten acres with peas. He

planted two pea crops, but the first had to be in the ground in March, just like the onions. Corn, peppers, tomatoes and pumpkins went in later. The incidental crops he planted for personal use went in the ground later, too.

Barney was active in the American Legion and had been working on a high school oratorical contest. He was asked to serve on the oratorical contest committee for his Department, since he was an English teacher and a natural for the position. He was District Deputy Grand Patriarch and took part in the conferral of the degrees five times in his district during March 1938. All of these social activities and his teaching made farming a real challenge.

Barney was a mild fellow with almost no temper, after all he worked with high school students all day. If he had been temperamental, he would have gone crazy in his first five years. March always tried his patience. Everything was happening and he needed the onion and pea crops to keep his farming going. Barney had a Fordson tractor that he usually had to build a fire under to start in March. Today was no exception. Barney worked at starting his tractor on March 1, 1938, from the moment he got home from school till a half hour before dark, when it finally started. He began to plow and did not stop until he had the onion and pea patches both plowed and harrowed for planting.

On Wednesday, March 2, 1938, Barney had to take part in conferring the Patriarchal degree, no farming that night. On Thursday, he began the back breaking job of planting onion sets by hand. Three acres is a lot to plant by hand. Friday, Barney began to plant the onion sets again, hoping to finish on Saturday, before he had to go to the degree rally. He almost met his goal but still had a few more sets to plant. Then there was the ten acres of peas. The peas were planted away from the house, barn and woods so that they got full sunlight. He always planted dwarf peas so that he did not have to erect support for the vines.

After taking part in the Golden Rule and Royal Purple degrees on Saturday, Barney was drinking a cup of coffee and munching on a doughnut with the members, when he started talking about manually planting ten acres of peas. Most of the members thought this was a terrible job. He did not hear an encouraging word until one of the new members asked if he could afford to pay a small amount for help. Barney said he could, but not much.

Patriarch Jennings seemed to have a solution. "I am a juvenile probation officer. I have oversight responsibilities for about two dozen boys who need to experience some hard work. If you are willing to pay the five cents an hour, I can put at least a dozen in your field every Saturday and after school most days. It is my job to supervise them, and they need to learn some honest work."

Barney was ecstatic. "When can they start/" he asked.

"Next Monday." Brother Jennings replied.

The farming venture became easier and a bit more successful for Barney in 1938. He had to scratch up the money to pay the boys who worked his fields, but the supervision was great and the boys concentrated on the job because they knew they had to.

After everything was planted, Barney arranged to bring the boys back for harvest. At the end of harvest, he gave each boy a pumpkin. One of the boys asked Mr. Jennings how he found Barney's farm to give them a job. Mr. Jennings explained that he and Barney were members of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows and that is how he became aware Barney could use the help.

Barney used the boys in 1939 and 1940 as well. In 1941 Barney mechanized and was ready to burst into production during the war years. Barney forgot about the boys who helped him until 1953. At the end of the Korean War, Barney was conferring with the Royal Purple degree on a class of ten new members, one of whom stayed after the meeting to speak to him.

He asked Barney if he remembered him. Barney said he did not, but wondered if he had taught the man in school when he was a boy. The man replied Barney had not taught him, but he had planted and harvested crops on Barney's farm. He told Barney that the pumpkin he had given him was the first and only Jack O'Lantern he ever had. He told Barney he remembered it so well, that when he was captured during the Korean War and spent eight months in a prison camp he carved the pumpkin over and over in his mind to keep from going insane. He wanted to thank Barney for the pumpkin and the opportunity to do something with his life. He remembered Mr. Jennings telling him about the Odd Fellows so he joined as soon as he got home from the Army.

Barney did not know what to say. He was overcome with emotion and sat quietly with a tear welling up in his eye.

"You did the right thing." Barney said. "You could do nothing better to learn how to live your life than to join the Independent Order of Odd Fellows."







Tangy Pot Roast

3 Medium Potatoes, sliced

1 1/3 cups sliced carrots

2/3 cup sliced onions

1 (3 lb.) boneless beef chuck roast

1 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. pepper

1/2 cup Catalina salad dressing

1/4 cup beef broth


