

FROM THE DESK OF THE DEPARTMENT COMMANDER

THE MERRY, MERRY MONTH OF MAY



May is usually overshadowed by spring activities culminating in Memorial Day celebrations and picnics. Most folks want to get out of the house and enjoy the warm weather. Barney Wells was no exception.

Lodge meetings are inside affairs. There needs to be a way to close the door and keep intruders out. Our secrets are not so great that a legion of spies surrounds our temples but there are an idle few, spurred on by curiosity, who would seek to discover our ancient mysteries so they could reveal them to world.

In 1919 Barney was fresh from his exploits in Europe. He thought it would be grand to hold a lodge meeting outside. His lodge was picking up steam and had 500 members on the books with an average attendance of 60. The chairs were always filled and those coming late had to use folding chairs.

After some discussion, it was decided that the last meeting in May would be held outside. This brought the unanimous consent of the membership. A dispensation was obtained and arrangements were made to secure a small field on the back of Barney's farm. There were enough extra guardians that no intruder would crash this lodge meeting, well maybe.

The first thing that was necessary was to make sure that the weather would co-operate. There were no radio or TV broadcasts in 1919, so the newspaper and the almanac were the only sources of information. The day of the meeting, it rained buckets. By 7:00 p.m. the rain was over but the grass was soaked. Barney had cut the field two days earlier, so things weren't too bad. The rain kept the committee from setting up the chairs until 15 minutes before the meeting at 7:30 p.m. The lodge used

small pedestals in place of the ornate stations in the lodge hall. The hour having arrived, there were fewer members than a normal meeting but still a good turnout. As the meeting began a flock of ducks flew over the assembly. The ducks had been eating seeds in the field of a neighboring farm. The ducks were full. This was bad. 
