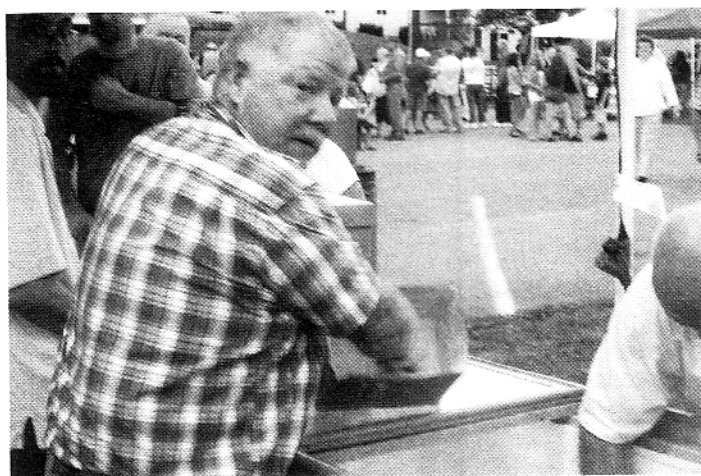

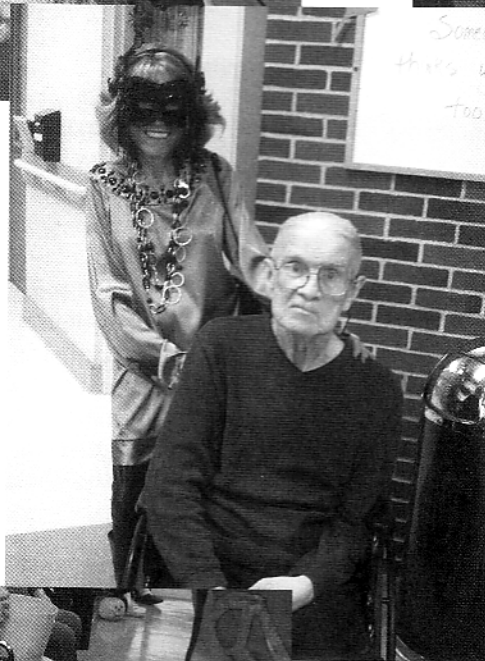
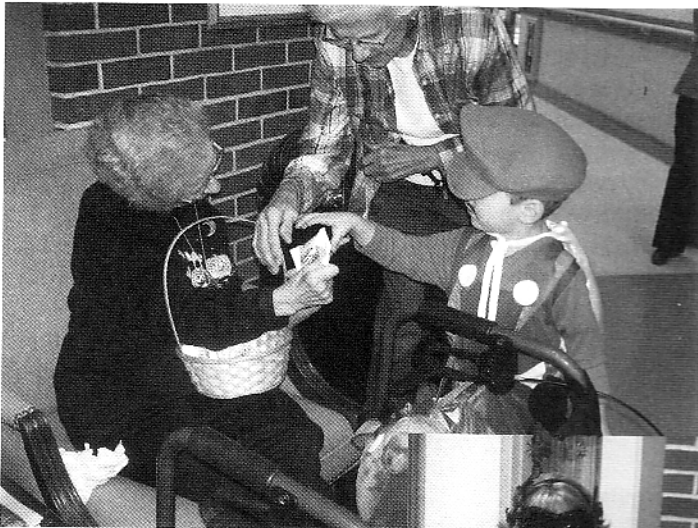

The 2011 Pilgrimage will take place on Sunday, May 8 at Arlington National Cemetery. The ceremonies will begin at 1:00 P.M. with a Parade from the USS Maine Mast staging area, followed by the Memorial Service and Wreath Laying Ceremonies at the Tomb. The Pilgrimage Address at the Tomb will be delivered by the Honorable George L. Glover III, Sovereign Grand Master.

The Hilton Alexandria Mark Center, at 5000 Seminary Road, Alexandria, VA 22311, will be our headquarters. Room reservations are to be made directly with the Hotel, at toll-free 1-800-Hiltons (1-800-445-8667) or 1-703-845-1010. 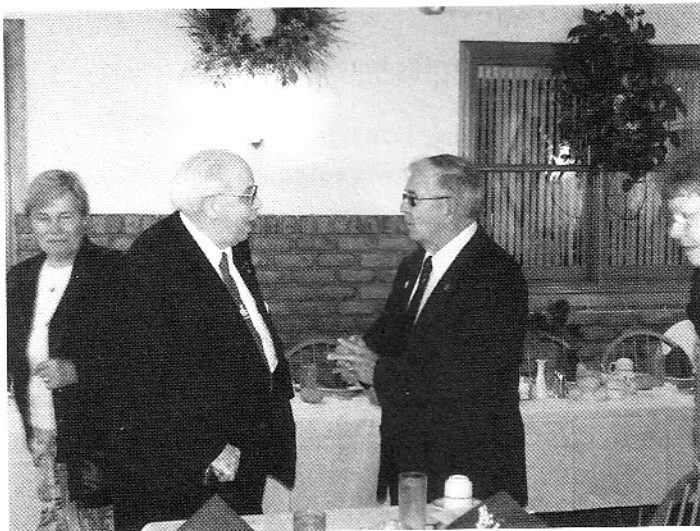

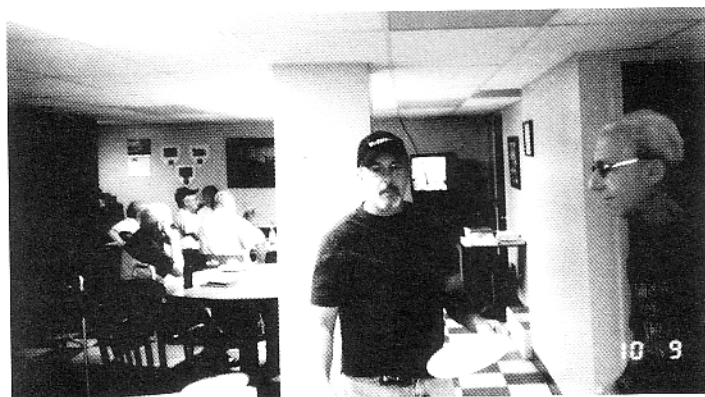
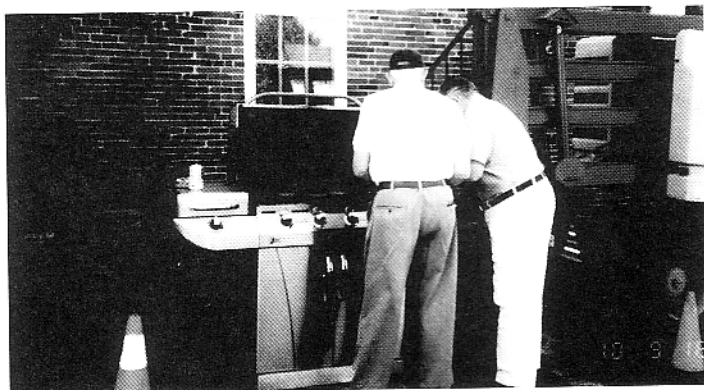

The group displayed all of the personal equipment used by each firefighter. They also told of some of their personal experiences.

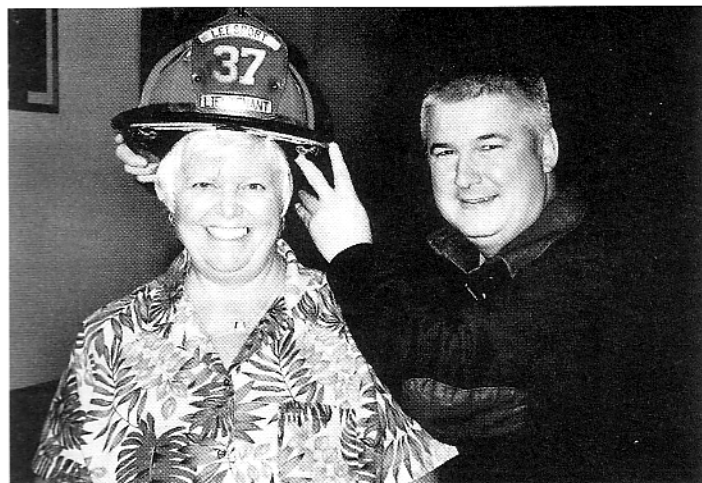

LEESPORT #141 CLEANS CEMETERY

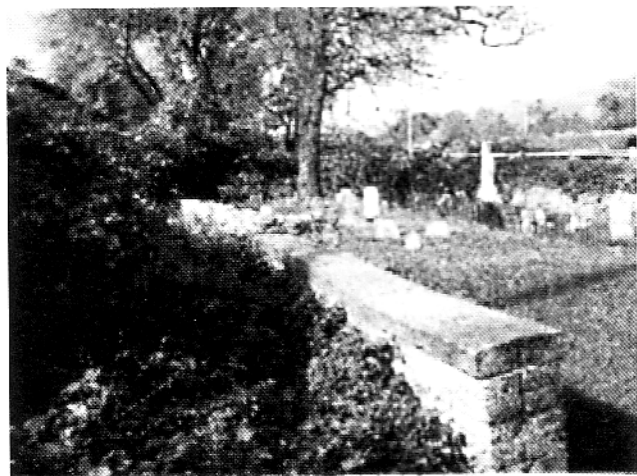
A month has passed since the first article and there has been a lot of improvement to the way the cemetery looks since Neil began his project.

The cemetery was established in 1816 by an Amish farmer by the name of John Gerber and his neighbor, Daniel Bitting. In 1873 Gerber's farmland was sold to John Fix, who added his own family cemetery. The cemetery is now known as the Fix-Gerber-Bitting Cemetery. When you look at the pictures, you can see an iron fence within the stonewall of the cemetery, this I believe was the original cemetery. There is one memorial stone that stands out and draws your attention. It is a memorial to Samuel Fix and his wife.

Samuel was born in 1803 and died in 1895, I believe that the life span back then was about 45 to 50 years of age; he had lived for more than 91 years. The cemetery was large enough to contain 200 graves, but as time has changed and developments of canals and four lane highways have come to the area a lot of the space has been lost.

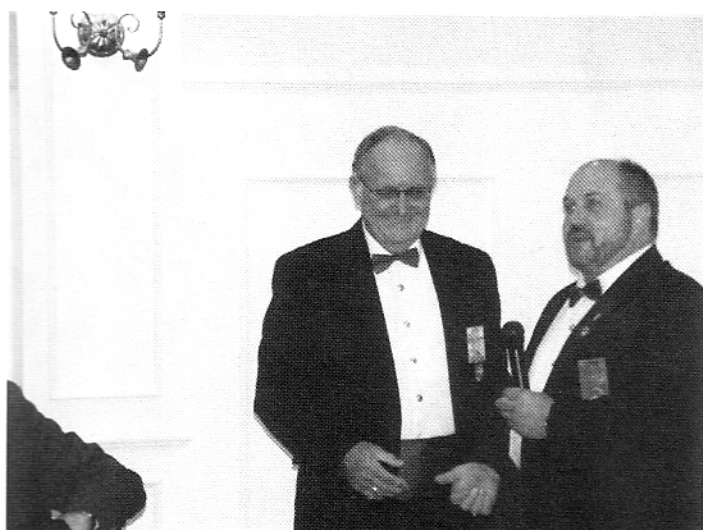
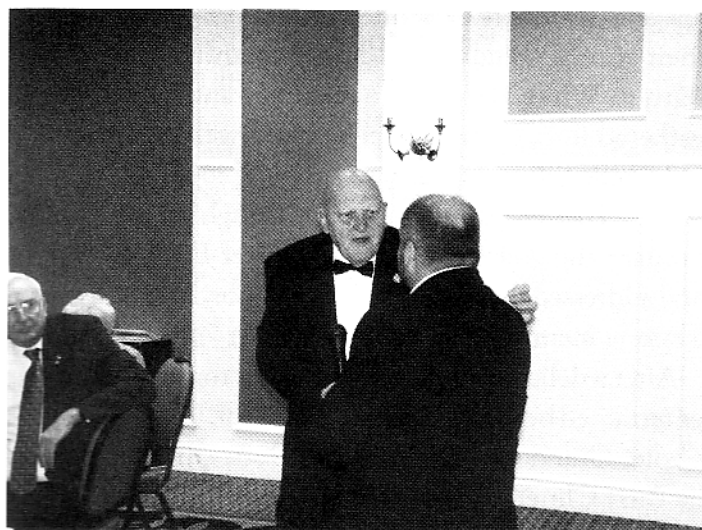
