

# WE WILL NOT FORGET

**SEPTEMBER 11, 2011:** A day that most Americans cannot and should not forget. It was one of the most tragic days that ever occurred in the history of the United States. A day of horror and sadness almost unimaginable. I remember it well, as I do the days that followed. Those following days filled us all with emotions of sadness, uncertainty, and even anger. But these feelings were soon overwhelmed by a need to honor those who died, and a need to show the world that we stand for our country, our flag, and what they stand for.

My story begins, the week following that horrible day, in a small central Pennsylvania town. Some local town leaders wanted to have a parade to honor the dead and show a spirit of patriotism. On short notice, word of this parade soon spread quickly. A local Odd Fellow Lodge was contacted, and they in turn notified their affiliate Canton, who immediately went to work to become one unit in that parade. One Chevalier donated a huge American Flag, that would spread from sidewalk to sidewalk. Other Chevaliers passed the word to the Department Council asking for assistance in getting enough personnel for this marching unit. Quickly a Canton of Chevaliers was formed to march in the parade, followed by the American Flag, carried by sixteen people, and followed by the local Rebekah Lodge, (who also wanted to participate) dressed in white.

Brother Edward R. Beach, Jr., 82, of North Wales, PA, was initiated an Odd Fellow into Walker Lodge #306, Philadelphia, on the eighth day of September, 1947 where he became a Past Grand and received his Grand Lodge Degree on June 22, 1978. He later joined Perseverance Encampment #135 in where he became a Past Chief Patriarch. He immediately became active in the Encampment branch, serving from 1977-1984 as District Deputy Grand Patriarch. He also served as Grand Outside Sentinel in 1981-1982 under PGP Muller and as SGL Representative to the Grand Encampment of Pennsylvania from 1989-1991. From 1986 to 1987 he proudly governed our Jurisdiction as Grand Patriarch. He always remained faithful to the Encampments, serving as Representative from Perseverance #135 to the Grand Encampment and serving on numerous Session and various committees within the Grand Encampment and was also active in their degree work. He was a

Chevalier of Canton Philadelphia #1 where he served many years as clerk and became a Past Captain. He excelled to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel® and Quartermaster of the Department Council of the Patriarchs Militant of Pennsylvania.

Brother Stewart L. Brenneman, Sr., 77, of Dover, PA, was initiated an Odd Fellow into Mt. Zion Lodge #74, York on the seventeenth day of August, 1998 where he became a Past Grand and Received his Grand Lodge Degree on November 17, 2001. He was the Secretary of Mt. Zion Lodge #74 for several years. He immediately became active in the Grand Lodge serving as Grand Guardian for PGM Joseph M.

Strausser from 2002-2003. After that, he served as District Deputy Grand Master from 2003-2006. He then went on to serve our Jurisdiction as Grand Master from 2007-2008. He was also elected as Alternate SGR for several years, a position which he held at the time of his death, along with being a Representative to the Middletown home as a director.

He also held active roles in Salome Rebekah Lodge #30 of York, where he was initiated a Rebekah on September 26, 2002. He received his RA Degree in October 2008 and became a Past Noble Grand on October 22, 2009. He was also a Patriarch of Mount Vernon Encampment #14 of York where he joined on November 20, 1999 and served as a Past Chief Patriarch and held the position of Scribe for several years. He served under Grand Patriarch William S. Mooney as his Grand Outside Sentinel

from 2009-2010. He also held an associate membership in Triune Lodge #307, Middletown PA. He served on many committees in all branches of the Order and still held many at the time of his death.

On July 24, 2000, he became a Chevalier of Canton Philadelphia #1 and then transferred membership as a charter member of Canton York #14 when they reinstituted. He became a Past Captain and held the office of Clerk for several years. He later excelled to the rank of Colonel and was installed as Department Commander of the Patriarchs Militant of Pennsylvania in June of 2010. At the time of his death, he was our leader for the Cantons.

He was a U.S. Army veteran of the Korean Conflict and a member of the York Bible Church.

Odd Fellow services were performed by the members of his Lodge.

He was the last surviving sibling of six. Surviving is his wife of 58 years, the former Catherine "Sis" Naylor, who is also very active in the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs, one son, two granddaughters, and numerous nieces and nephews.

This Brother was a dedicated member to our Order and will never be able to be replaced by one person alone. His motto during his term of Grand Master was proudly displayed on his pins reading "Believe in our Order." 


'When I became Past Grand, I don't know.My first job was Outside Guardian of our lodge.I went on to hold about every chair and office in the lodge.I was asked to be the Chaplain of the Initiatory Degree.At that time, no books were allowed in the lodge hall for Degree work, so I had to memorize the Chaplain's part. What a job!I ended up being the Chaplain for all three Degrees.

I travelled to many lodges to install officers, for Degree work, and many other duties in the Lodge. Eventually, I was elected District Deputy Grand Master and installed officers in seven or eight lodges. I was Representative to Grand Lodge for twelve to fourteen years. I was asked to serve as Grand Chaplain of Grand Lodge by Grand Master Ernest Nelson and travelled to many lodges across the state.

I helped to dedicate a new building for West Virginia Grand Lodge, and I helped to install the first new officers. When travelling in Florida, I stopped at the I.O.O.F. home and spent three days there.It was a great experience.I also have attended the Placing of the Wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Washington, D.C.

I have served on many of the Boards and Committees at the Grove City and Meadville homes, and I helped a group of Odd Fellows repair, wallpaper, and paint the rooms that were rented to schools.'

Outside of the Order, Blake served as a Lay Speaker in the Methodist Church, as well as Sunday School Leader and teacher, and is a Past President of Church Council. Blake married his wife Naomi on April 24, 1937 and they recently celebrated their 73rd wedding anniversary.



#### DAVID W. MILLS

Mr. David W. Mills enlisted into the Army on 6 October, 1952. After completing basic training at Camp Breckenridge, Kentucky, PVT. Mills arrived in Korea through the Port of Inchon, reporting for duty as a rifleman with F Company, 2nd Battalion, 15th Infantry, 3rd Infantry Division on 7 April, 1953. At the time of his arrival, the company was holding Outpost Harry, a forward position in front of the Main Line of Resistance, on a dominating hill near the North Korean village of Surang-ni, across from the Iron Triangle.

On 24 April, PVT Mills was in a bunker in one of the trenches with his M1 rifle. When the nearby BAR man was wounded, PVT Mills was ordered to take over his position and weapon as the only man in his fighting position. At approximately 2230 hrs., a massive enemy artillery bombardment hammered the company position, followed shortly thereafter by a major Chinese assault in battalion

strength. PVT Mills remained at his position as all other automatic weapons were knocked out in brutal hand-to-hand fighting. He continued to fight despite being surrounded by the enemy until his BAR became inoperable. He was taken prisoner while searching for another usable weapon. PVT Mills had been wounded nine (9) times in the fighting, twice in the head, six (6) times in the legs, and once in the arm. He was seventeen (17) years old.

PVT Mills left Outpost Harry in Chinese custody believing he was the last remaining American alive. In actuality, his company had suffered seventy-two (72) casualties out of the eighty-eight (88) men on the position. PVT Mills was a Chinese Prisoner of War for four (4) months and was repatriated 24 August, 1953. He had received no medical treatment of his wounds. He served the remainder of his enlistment as a Military Policeman.


