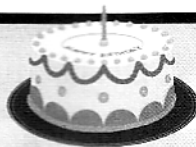
The cemetery which is close by the West Shore Bypass around Reading was the subject of a story in the daily Reading Eagle. The story told of the lack of care for the burial ground.

DAUPHIN COUNTY PASSES QUOTA

Dauphin County was the first in the state to go "over the top" in the Grand Patriarch's campaign, according to a statement by Grand Patriarch R. L. Peters at Harrisburg on Wednesday, February 4th, when Dauphin Encampment had a class of eighteen for admission and one reinstatement. Other counties were expected to have the same distinction within a week, he said.

The Patriarchal Degree was conferred by the staff of Washington Encampment, No 11, of Elizabethtown, in the most magnificent display ever witnessed in the Harrisburg Temple. Unstinted praise greeted the team as they concluded their perfect performance.

In the large audience that crowded the large lodge room were Odd Fellows from Lancaster, York, Cumberland, Perry, and Dauphin Counties, including Grand Patriarch Robert L. Peters, and members of his official staff.

This class was brought together almost entirely through the efforts of Fred A. Weaver, D. D. G. P., and the majority was from Commonwealth Lodge, No. 359, of Harrisburg.

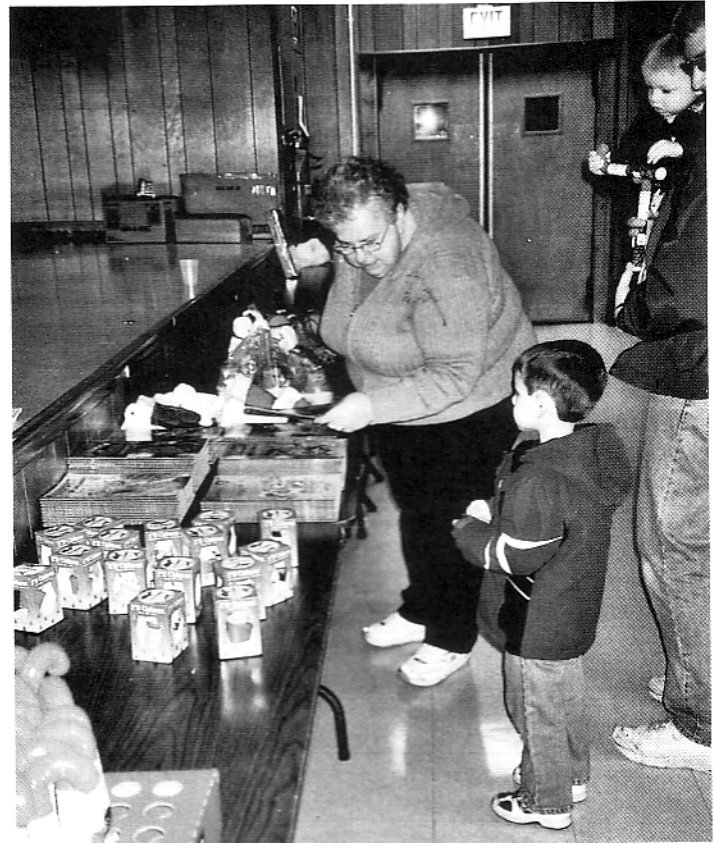
PG Dennis Rahn was the Santa Claus. Rebekah Assembly Vice President Sarah Baer was in charge of the special prize table and door prize drawing.

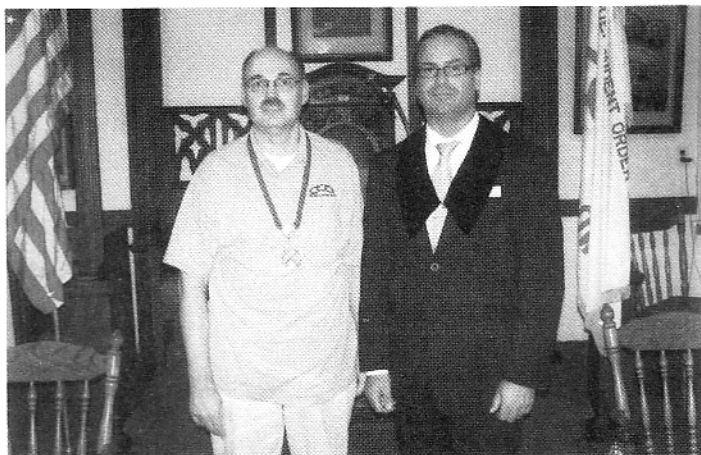

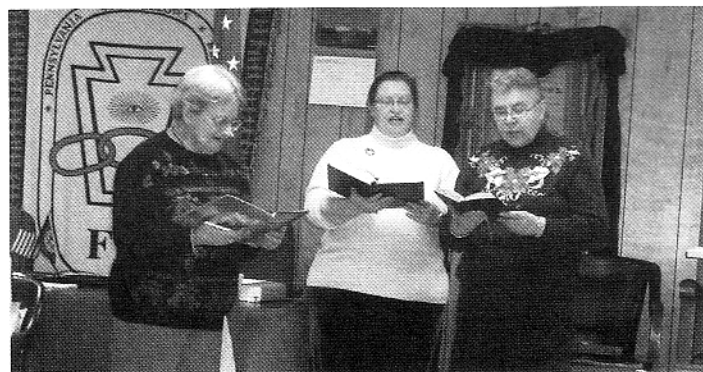
Tribune Lodge recently deonated \$50 to Hospice of Central Pennsylvania. This was in memory of Brother Robert Derr and John Clemons.

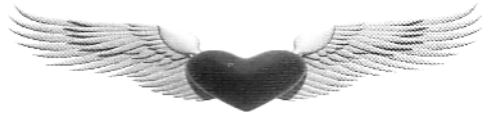


MT. ZION LODGE #74, YORK, PA

PERSEVERANCE #135 MEMORIAL SERVICE AND HOLIDAY DINNER

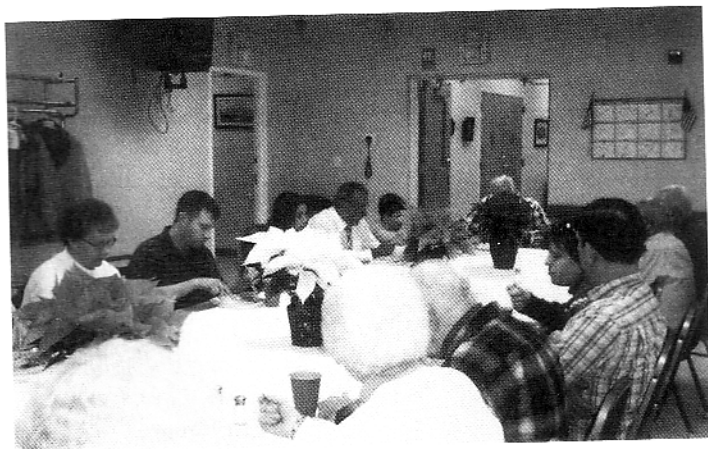

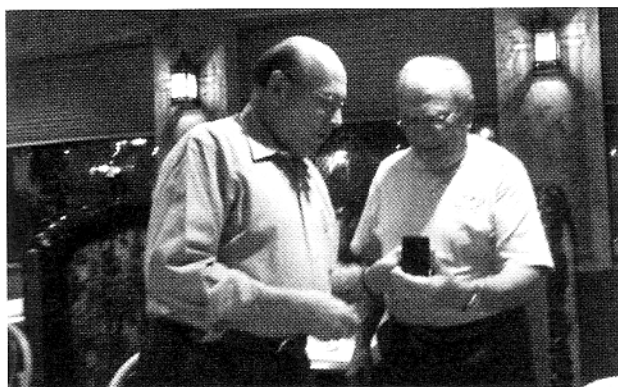

Paoli Lodge #290 is proud to remember our deceased members by presenting their widow with flowers at Thanksgiving, and

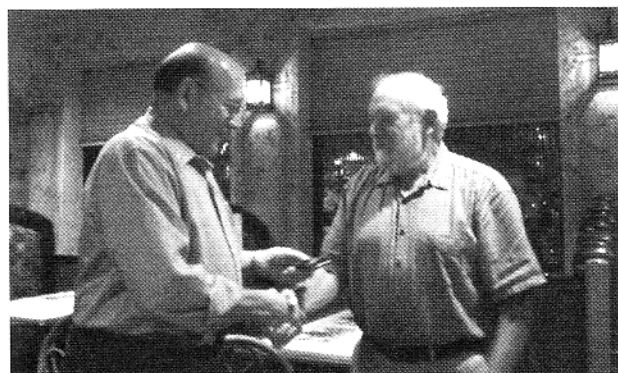

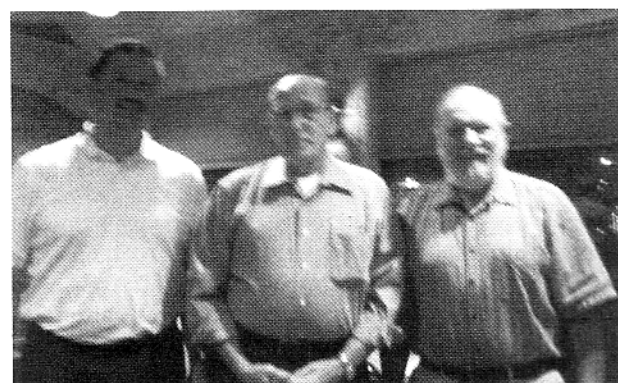
We also welcomed a new member to the Lodge, and hope to continue recruiting new members throughout 2011.

THE GRAND LODGE OF EUROPE, WHY?

The following article was taken out of "Odd Fellow-Wort" (Zeitschrift des Deutschen Odd Fellow-Ordens 2009) In the next few months I will take an article about each of the jurisdictions listed in the Grand Lodge of Europe. You will find some very interesting things that may make you sit up and take notice. Here is the "Grand Lodge of Europe" Thanks to Brother John Oertel of Walker Lodge #306 for lending me this book.

Dear sisters and Brother of the Great and independent jurisdiction of Germany. In connection with the Grand Lodge of Europe's third Conference in Frankfurt the 12th to the 14th of June this year I want to send you the following message:

Saturday the 16th of June 2007 was a milestone for the European part of the international Odd Fellow Order. The Sovereign Grand Lodge instituted a new European Grand Lodge with independence in all matters of the Order in Europe.

But what is the meaning of the new Grand Lodge of Europe? What are the principles, the mission and the goals? As an answer I want to give you the most important bricks in the construct for the Grand Lodge of Europe.

First of all you can read in the Charter that the Grand Lodge of Europe is empowered to direct, supervise and control all matters pertaining to the Odd Fellows Order within and throughout Europe, except the lands known as the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland - because we do not want to annoy Manchester Unity - but maybe we in the future could have some sorts of collaboration with M.U.

The founding members of the Grand Lodge of Europe are the independent jurisdiction of Denmark, Finland, Germany, Iceland, Netherland and Belgium, Norway, Sweden and Switzerland. All the founding members have got new Charters from the Grand Lodge of Europe, replacing the old Charters from SGL.

The mission of the Grand Lodge of Europe is to promote and protect the principles and practices of Odd Fellowship in Europe and to introduce Odd Fellowship throughout the continent of Europe.

The Grand Lodge of Europe is bound to work for establishing a bigger world wide organization of Odd Fellows consisting of all units being part of the Odd Fellows Order working on the same serious, ritualistic and ethical, basis.

The principles of the Grand Lodge of Europe are to ensure European unity, cooperation and respect for international development of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows and maintenance of all rights, benefits and obligations of membership in Odd Fellows.

The supreme leadership of the Grand Lodge of Europe is the Grand Lodge Conference.

At the meetings of the Grand Lodge Conference each member jurisdiction has two representatives, a brother and a sister.

Within the Board are the functions of European Grand Sire, Brother Deputy European Grand Sire, Sister Deputy European Grand Sire, European Grand Secretary, Deputy European Grand Secretary, European Grand Treasurer, European Grand Marshal and European Grand Chaplain.

The European Grand Lodge is a reality. We do offer the Sovereign Grand Lodge, the IARA and the Grand Lodge of Australasia as well as any organization in the whole world, bearing

the Odd Fellow name, our cooperation, for the benefit of the Order and FOR the international Odd Fellowship.

Of course we do acknowledge the right of both the Sovereign Grand Lodge, the IARA and the Grand Lodge of Australasia to decide themselves the way to go towards the goal, however, we consider it an absolute necessity that we all stand together about the values of the Odd Fellow Order - and that we together try to prevent that further differences between us may arise in addition to those which already exist and which may be a danger for the future of the Odd Fellow Order.

We strongly feel the necessity of a close cooperation with all Odd Fellows - only in this way the wish about "the chain around our earth" can become reality!

The European Grand Lodge offers their hand to such a cooperation!

Dear German sisters and brothers, the future of the Orders membership. Our Orders destiny is committed also to your hand. Gather into your lodge-rooms the good and true man and women of the various communities in which you live and call back the brothers and sisters who has wandered from the fold. Gather man and women who, standing shoulder to shoulder with you, will strive with your in the great work of human benefaction. The Grand Lodge of Europe promise you its support to succeed!

Dear sisters and brothers throughout Europe, let us stand shoulder to shoulder and ask the Creator and Preserver of everything to give us the opportunity and the will succeed - and we ask him to bless our Order and all of us!

A brief instruction of the history of the Grand Lodge of Finland

After the Grand Lodge of Sweden was established in 1895 the interest in Odd Fellowship was awakened in Finland, too. A letter from the year 1901 can be mentioned as a first sign of this interest. In this letter, a Finnish railway official inquires about possibilities to become a member of the Odd Fellow Order. The answer of the Swedish Grand Secretary was that, in principle, there was no obstacle to become a member. However, taking into consideration the political and social situation of Finland as a part of the Russian Empire, the applicant was advised to abandon the whole idea.

After Finland had declared independence in 1917, the idea of an Odd Fellow lodge in Finland was raised again. A few interested brother from the town Taasa in Ostrobothnia province had sought their way to the Swedish lodges, especially Lodge 89 Tomedalen in Haparanda. The Grand Noble of this lodge, Karl Rudber, influenced very strongly in establishing a lodge in Vaasa.

Before a lodge subordinated to the Grand Lodge of Sweden could be established in Finland it was necessary to obtain, from the Sovereign Grand Lodge, an amendment to Charter of the Swedish Grand Lodge. After receiving a formal application form the Grand Sire of Sweden the sovereign Grand Mater hesitated for a while, mainly for reasons of formality. However, after some correspondence he finally, in July 1925, gave Grand Lodge of Sweden the permission to establish lodges in Finland.

THE GRAND LODGE OF EUROPE, WHY?

The first Odd Fellow Lodge in Finland (Lodge Nr. 1 Wada) was established in the coastal town of Vaasa in August 1925. The seven founding members of this lodge had been initiated as Odd Fellows in the Swedish Lodge 89 Tornedalen in the town of Haparanda. After the Order had so laid foot on the Finnish soil it soon expanded to the capital, Helsinki, so that first lodge there was established in 1927. After the third lodge, Nr. 3 Brahea, had been established in Turku in the year 1931, a rather long pause followed.

Odd Fellows in Finland encountered great difficulties in 1930s and during the wartime. Especially the question of premises was quite difficult for many years. However, all three lodges which has been established before the war continued their activities almost without interruption. Only after the war in the year 1951 was the next lodge established. Since then, the development has been steady and quite rapid.

There are about 5.1 million inhabitants in Finland. Of the Finnish population about five percent have Swedish as their mother tongue. The most part of the Swedish speaking people live in the coastal areas of the Gulf of Bothnia and of the Gulf of Finland as well as in the archipelago. For this reason, it is natural that, in the early decades, the Odd Fellow activity was concentrated in those areas.

By the year 1965 there were 13 lodges altogether. What was common to all these lodges was that they worked in Swedish language. Since it was deemed necessary to expand Odd Fellowship in the Finnish speaking part of population as well, the first Finnish speaking lodge, 14 Mikael Agricola, was established 1965 in Helsinki. This event was an epoch-making one, in the sense that it was followed by a period of strong expansion into the Finnish speaking population. The Order began to expand in the inland areas as well.

It might be somewhat surprising that not until 1960s was there any Rebekah activity in Sweden or in Finland. However, some Finnish sisters were members in Norwegian and Danish lodges. Thanks to their activity the three first Rebekah lodges in Finland were instituted 1967. It might be of interest to note that Rebekah activity was established at the same time both in Finland and in Sweden. First Finnish speaking Rebekah lodge was instituted in 1974.

Over the years the expanding Odd Fellow activity in Finland had gained more and more quasi-independent status under the Grand Lodge of Sweden. In the beginning of the 1980s the number of brother lodges was 35 and the number of sister lodges 19. The time was deemed to be ripe for establishing an independent Grand Lodge of Finland. On the 2nd June 1984 Sovereign Grand Master Ronald W. Hughes proclaimed "the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows in Finland to be duly constituted Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows".

The Rebekah Assembly of Finland was instituted on 24th November 1984. In the early years, the formal relationship between Grand Lodge and Rebekah Assembly was somewhat unclear. However, the Grand Lodge Meeting 1993 accepted the independence of the Rebekah Assembly. Since then, Finnish sisters have had total independence in relation to brothers. Grand Lodge and Rebekah Assembly together constitute the

Jurisdiction of Finland IOOF. The combining link between these two organizations is Grand Sire, who is responsible for the Odd Fellow activity in Finland to be compatible with the Charter.

At the moment, there are 57 brother lodges and 48 Rebekah lodges in Finland. Grand Lodge of Finland has activity also in Estonia, where lodges were instituted, a brother lodge in 1995.

In the year 2008 the total number of Odd Fellows, sister and brothers altogether, is about 8,200. Of these brothers and sisters approximately half are Swedish and half Finnish-speaking. Lodges are divided in two sections according to the language, Finnish or Swedish, they work with.

One special feature worth to be mentioned is that in both Grand Lodge Meetings and Rebekah-Assembly Meetings 40 delegates are elected to the decision-making body, which is called Council. Of these delegates, 20 are from the Swedish-speaking section and 20 are from the Finnish-speaking section. With this arrangement we want to guarantee that both language sections have equal rights in decision-making.
