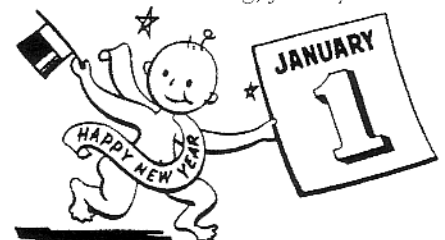

ORCHARD MANOR - RESIDENTS BLANKET HOME WITH MEMORIES

The halls of Orchard Manor have been brightened and made a little cozier by a new resident and staff joint initiative, "A Life of Memories."

Together, the residents and staff have fashioned their memories into quilt squares depicting things close to their hearts, from sports or hobbies to a beloved occupation or home.

Some of the residents are able to complete the quilt squares themselves, while others require the help of an aide. The fabric squares symbolize their lives. And while some of the residents who created squares have since passed away or have been discharged to home, their memories live on in the home's halls.

Staff members are able to contribute their own quilt patches for a donation of \$1, as a fund-raiser for the activity department.

Emily Robinson, the activities director at the facility, created the idea.

"I think my favorite part of working here is getting to know the residents and what they did in their past and what means the most to them," Robinson said. "Just having one square, one opportunity to tell somebody what means the most to them is a great idea."

The project is about reminiscing but it also helps with memory and cognition.

Both male and female residents have participated, as have different units. The home's Alzheimer's unit also has contributed a few squares.

Nothing like this has been done in the past, Robinson pointed out.

"The main thing is, looking at it, it's such a variety. Everybody has something different, but altogether the memories come as one. The quilt symbolizes the population as one," she said.

Dorothy Mazza, born in Mars and a Pittsburgh resident, has been at Orchard Manor for the last four years; she has completed a quilt square that expresses her love of crochet with a cream and blue doily.

"I just thought it was a nice idea because you figure everyone has had a different life and it is nice to know what is important to different people," Mazza said.

Each time she looks at the display, Mazza said she discovers something different.

Robinson plans to expand the project's concept by someday completing a scrapbook for each wing of the manor. Then, the visitors or family members can get to know those who share a home with their loved ones, and perhaps learn new things about their own loved ones.

The activity is just one among others in which residents participate at Orchard Manor, like bingo, music programs, and table top bowling. From seminars Robinson has attended, she has learned of a new favorite physical activity among residents known as "noodle ball" — which she hopes to include. But the quilt project will continue for some time.

The activity gives residents who are less physical or group-oriented the opportunity for one-on-one contact with the staff or other residents.

A monthly newsletter highlights when a new quilt patch is added. The newsletter is drawing new interest from the staff and more residents willing to try, Robinson said.

Other facilities have expressed an interest in beginning similar projects, and Orchard Manor recently held a seminar on how it's done.

"It's unbelievable the amount of residents that come up to look at the quilt, and the ones that you don't think remember say, 'I started this,' or 'Mine was the first on,'" Robinson said.

The facility has no plans to combine the quilt squares into one piece; however, due to rapid growth of the project, it will soon be moved into a display in the great room.

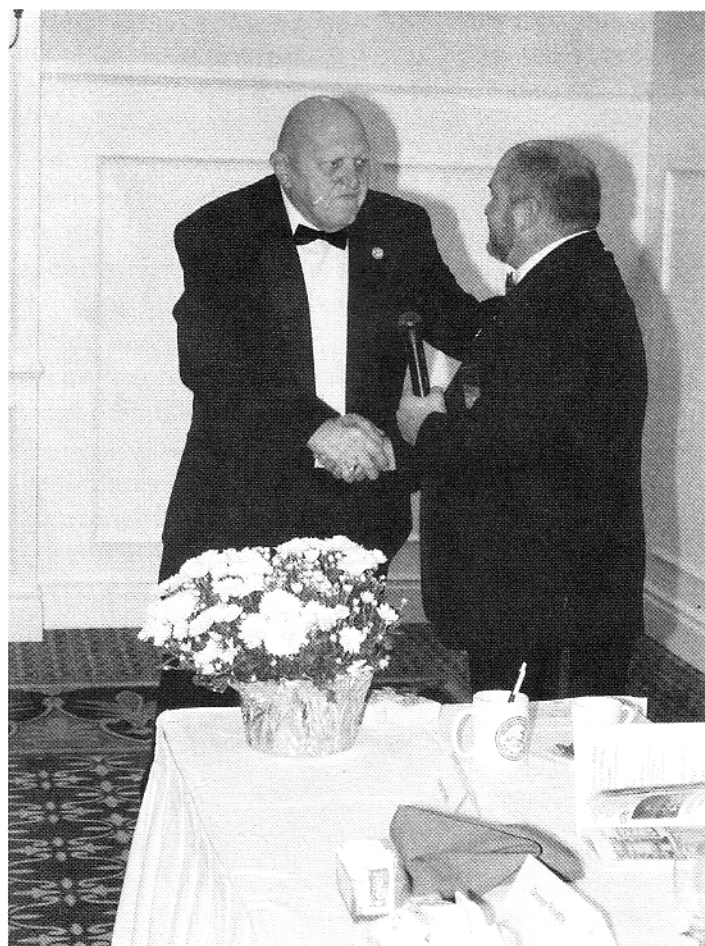

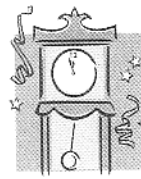

Services were held by the members of her lodge and internment was held at the Orchard Manor Cemetery, Pine Township.

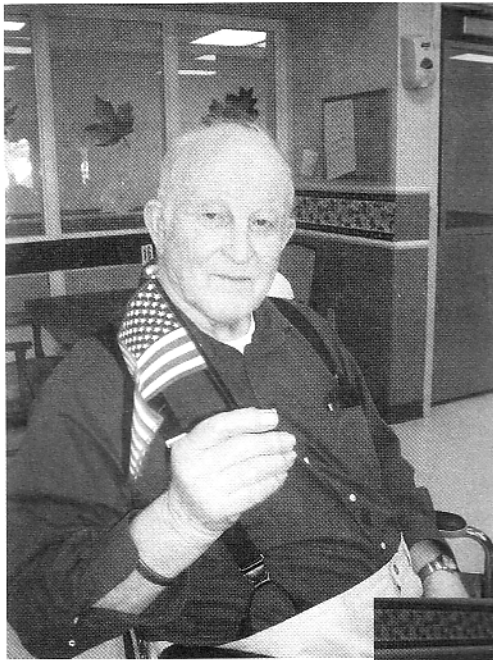
HARRY E. MARTIN

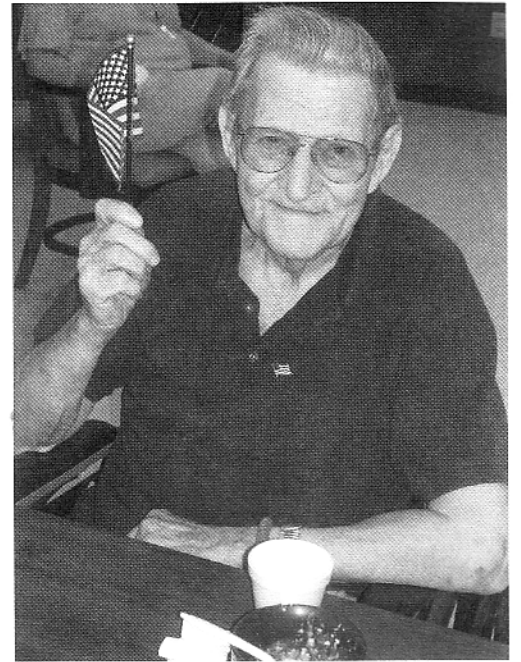
He was a U.S. Veteran. He was preceded in death by his wife, Josepha.

Internment was held at the Jefferson Memorial Park, Pleasant Hills.

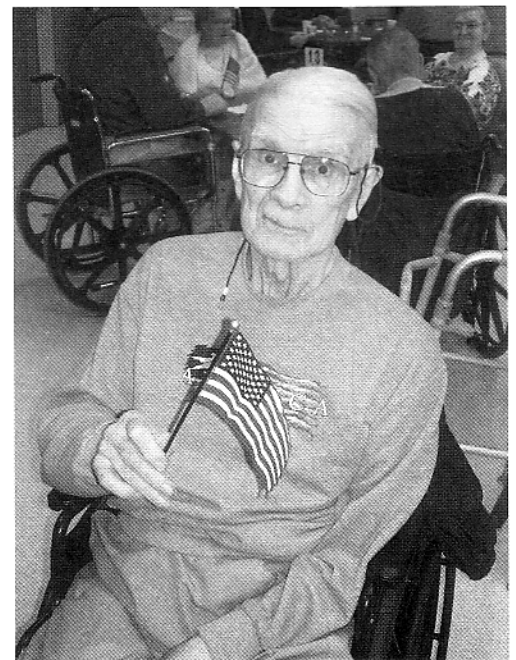
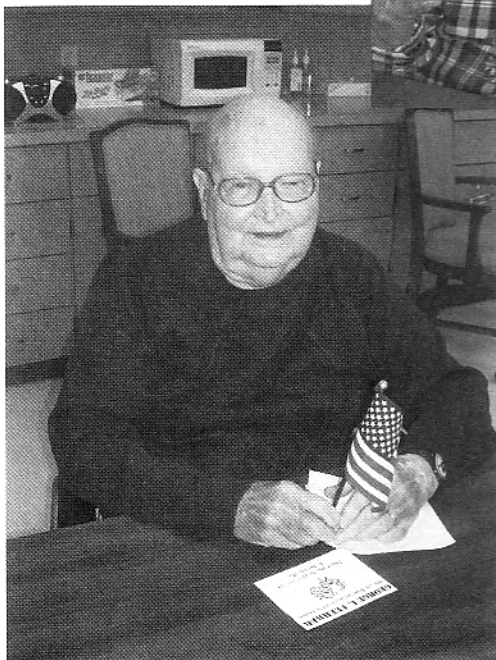

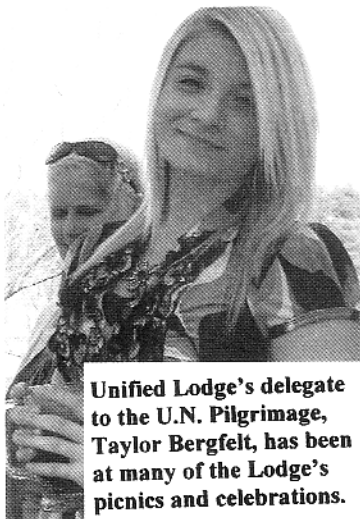

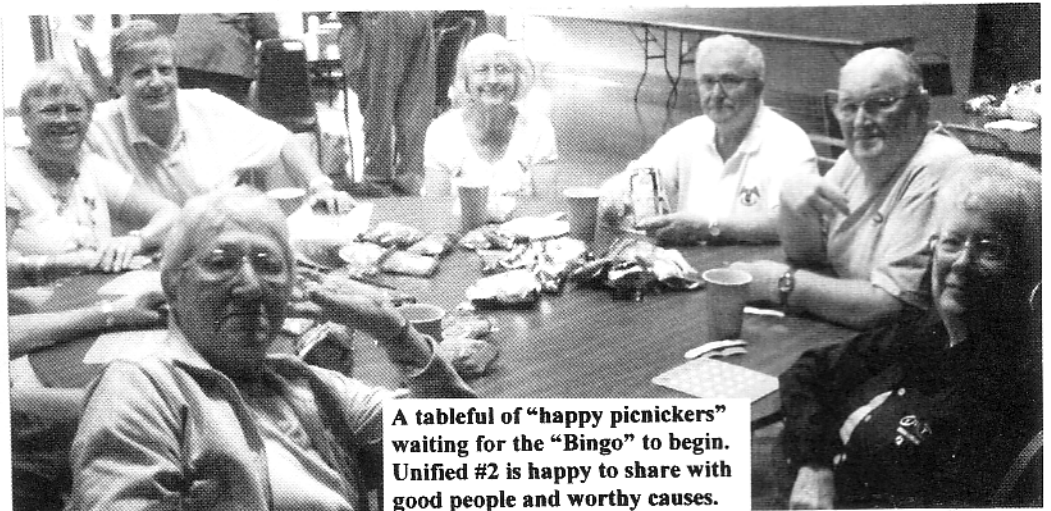

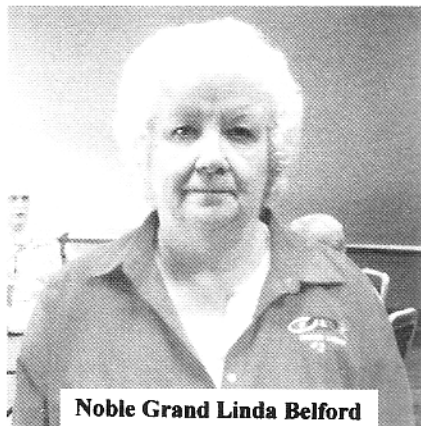
CELEBRATES ANNUAL PICNIC



Bro. Ken Faub, Grand Warden of Grand Lodge, controlled the Bingo game as he rolled the balls and called the lucky numbers.



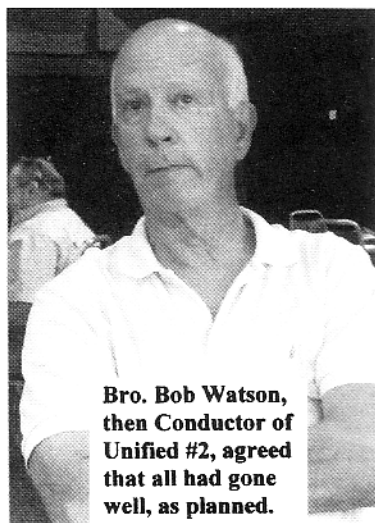
Delicious food in plentiful supply satisfied the palates of everyone who attended the picnic. Walnut Corners catered the event.

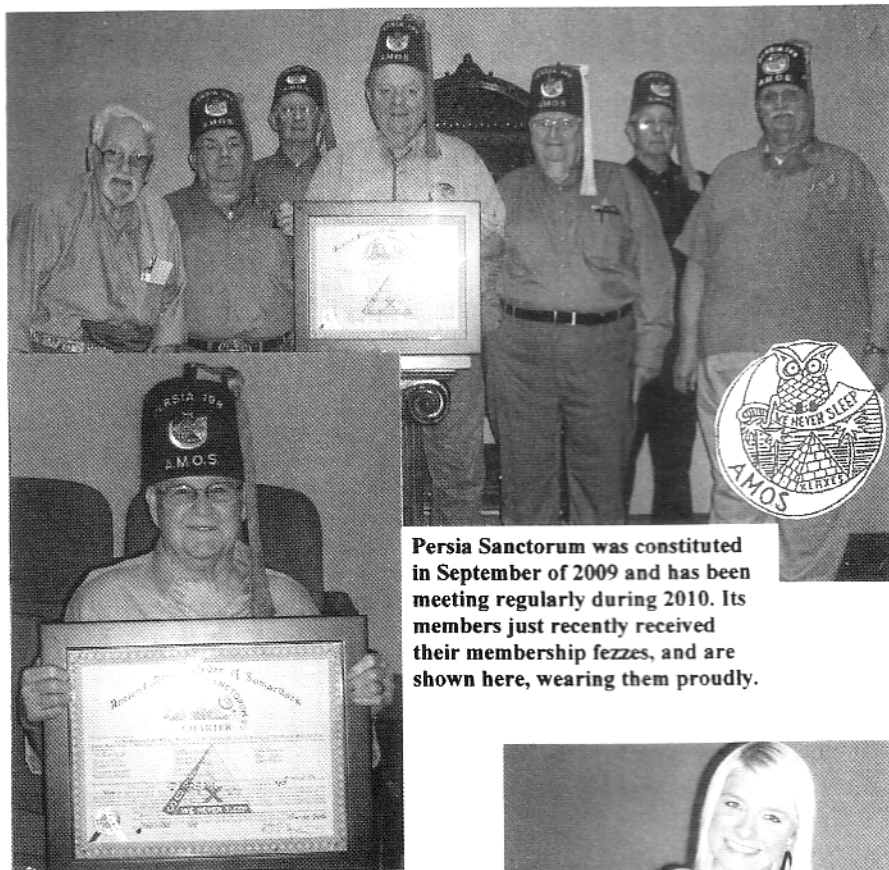

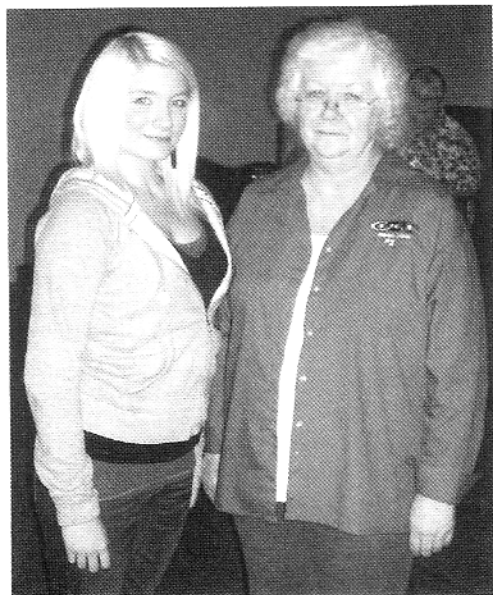

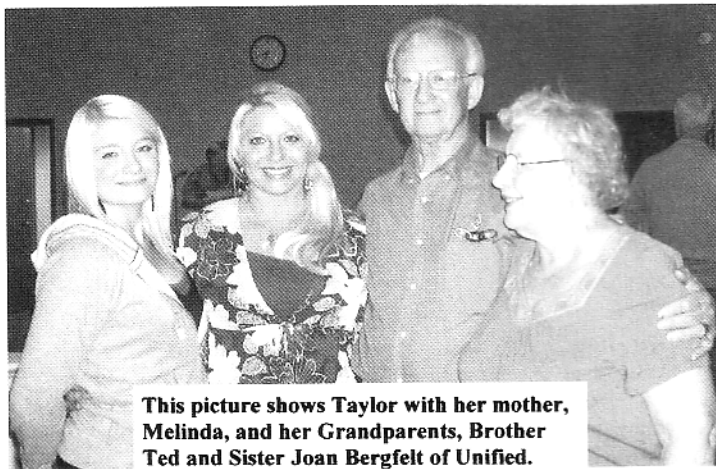

GRAND PATRIARCH VISIT TO GENERAL WORTH ENCAMPMENT #188

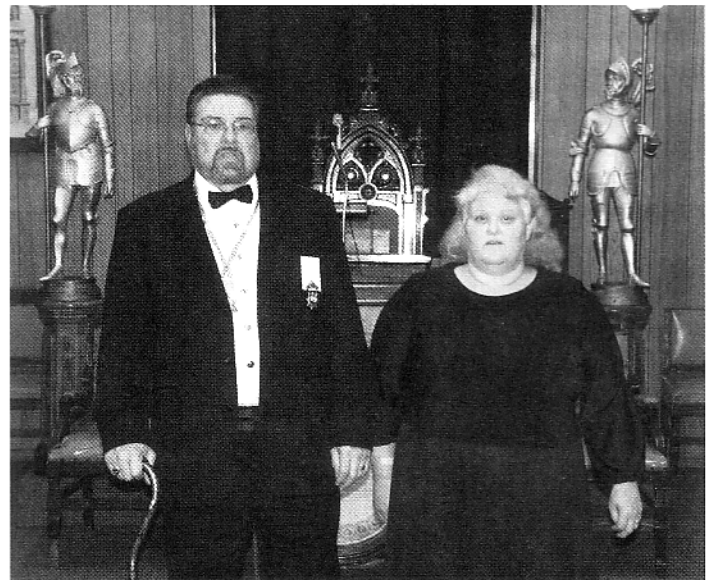

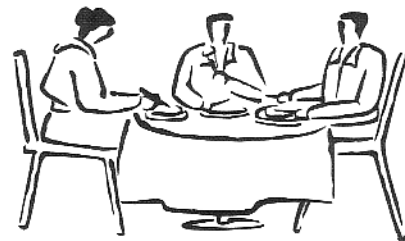

The chorus numbers were very well presented and received the hearty applause of the entire audience. The

Violet Nottingham and Faye Millard served dessert from a fall decorated buffet. Shearer had several readings during the dessert hour.

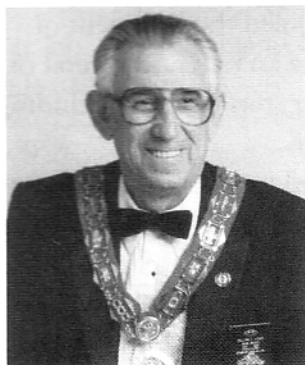

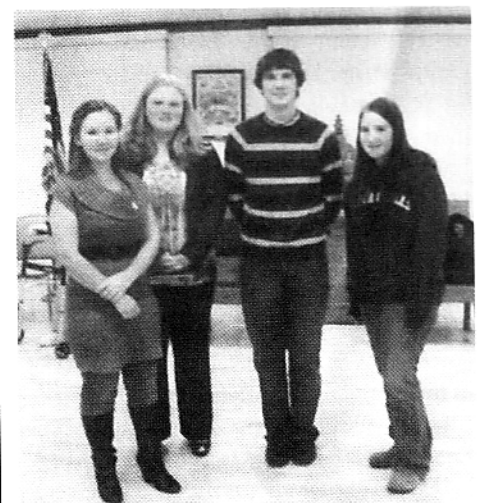

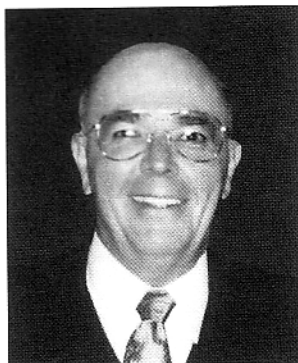
