

Our Food Services Department provided a delicious buffet dinner of meat and vegetarian lasagna, deli sandwiches, soup, salad, and assorted pies for dessert.




Surviving is her husband over 65 years, John A. Kunkleman, one daughter, two grandsons, and two great-grandsons.



future endeavors. A commemorative plaque was presented and honorably accepted by Kristy.





THE GRAND LODGE OF EUROPE, DENMARK

Short presentation of the Danish Jurisdiction

The germ of the formation of the Odd Fellow Order in Denmark was laid already in 1876, when the Danish Julius Meyer returned to Denmark after 11 years stay in America.ln America he quickly became a member of the Odd Fellow Order, and further he was co-founder of and noble grand for a new lodge over there. Upon his return to Denmark he he searched connection with two other Odd Fellows having come home, Carl Fratz and William Meyer, and these three agreed to work on founding an Odd Fellow Lodge in Copenhagen. Contact was established to the Grand Secretary in the German Grand Lodge, Fritz Meyendorf, and after a lot of correspondence of practical character between Denmark, Germany and America "Danmark loge no. 1 af Danmark" was instituted on Saturday the 29th and Sunday the 30th June 1878. The lodge is to work in the German language and as per German rituals, and the institution was carried out by The German Grand Lodge's Grand Sire Praetorius and Grand Secretary Meyendorf, whereafter the new members as well as the elected officers with brother Andreas Holck as Noble Grand were dedicated.

They started in rooms in Kongens Club in 0stergade 15, but already in December the same year they moved to new rooms in St. Kongensgade 52, and hereafter the development went fast, as there were already in December 1881 four lodges in Copenhagen, and in 1884 there was a total of 11 lodges with more than 1200 brothers, 1 encampment and 1 Rebekah lodge.

In 1884 it had come so far that a Charter was obtained for a District Grand Lodge and at the first annual meeting in the Grand Lodge for the Kingdom of Denmark on 21 st April 1884 District Deputy Grand Sire Andreas Holck read the concession from. The Sovereign Grand Lodge to the foundation of the Grand Lodge for the Kingdom of Denmark with address in Copenhagen and with suzerainty over all subordinate lodges in the country. At the following nomination to election of officers the following were elected and installed in their offices:

Grand Master Andreas Holck. Deputy Grand Master J. Rath. Grand Secretary Johs. Hansen. Grand Treasurer L.P.Olsen. Grand Warden Leopold Simmonsen.

On 30th June 1888 the Order in Denmark celebrated the 10th anniversary for its foundation with a great feast in Rosenborg Have, and at that time the Order consisted of 23 lodges spread over the whole country.

The chairman of the feast committee was Noble Grand Petrus Beyer, who on the following year's Grand Lodge meeting was elected Grand Master, and on which meeting Grand Master Andreas Holck had announced his retirement because of failing health.

The first Canton in Denmark was founded on 26th April 1889.

The task of the district grand lodge was mainly to serve as a natural connecting link to the establishment of "The Independent Grand Lodge for the Kingdom of Denmark" and after application for this to The Sovereign Grand Lodge, Charter was received dated 1 st December 1891 in the state of Ohio, upon which "The Independent Grand Lodge for the Kingdom of Denmark I.O.O.F." was instituted at the Grand Lodge meeting on 9th June 1892, and thus began a new chapter of the story of the Danish Odd Fellow Order.

Thanks Brother Ernst von der Recke the Order got new rituals for lodges and encampments in 1893 and 1894, as well as rituals for feast- and memory lodges in Danish.

After the acquisition of Schimmelmann's Palace this was fitted out for order purposes and the palace was under the name of the Odd Fellow Palace installed on 26th April 1901.

In 1924 Petrus Beyer died after 30 years as Grand Sire and was followed by brother Christian Skeel. The Order consisted at that time of 52 brother lodges and 15 Rebekah lodges with totally 7.200 members.

The scientist prize of the Odd Fellow Order is for the first time awarded in April 1969 on the 150 years anniversary of the Order in the Odd Fellow Palace in Copenhagen. The prize is together with other prizes since then awarded every year on the birthday of the Order.

The first Matriarch encampment, no. 1 "Sara", was instituted in Arhus on 27th January 1979, and the same year on 13th October Canton no. 2, "Defence", Arhus, was instituted.

In March 1981 the Order had 9596 brothers and 5007 sisters.

On 7th April 1992 the Odd Fellow Palace in Copenhagen was ravaged by a huge fire, where many irreplaceable values were lost, amongst others many objects of art, the library and the big concert hall. On the Grand Lodge meeting in 2008 Lars Jürgensen was elected new Grand Sire after Hans Pedersen, who had held this office since 1993.

At this date, April 2009, the Danish jurisdiction counts totally 109 brother lodges in Denmark, 1 on the Faroe Islands, 3 in the Czech Republic and 1 in Spain. There are 90 sister lodges in Denmark and 1 in Spain. In addition there are 15 Patriarch encampments, 13 Matriarch encampments to which shall be added 6 Cantons Patriarch/Matriarch militant - in total comprising app. 15.000 members.

Lloyd is living in the suburbs of Atlanta and with a friend is building a Catering Business.

Popeye said he wanted to stay on the river but after getting jobs with two companies that went bankrupt, he has gone into the landscape and lawn care business.

Captain Williams is gardening at home. He did work for a time for BP cleaning up beaches in Florida.


Captain Chengary is working directing transportation for his church food bank, and his wife, Cindy, is working full time as director of special projects at her church.

Jazzou continues his various musical activities in Maine. He and Bob Stevens have been keeping me up to date on the boat and its personnel.




Brother John Kunkleman, left, is welcomed to a reunion on the Steamboat Delta Queen, by Capt. Mike Williams and his wife, Myra.

The Mississippi Queen has been stripped and gutted prepared for salvage. The American Queen is pared in a boat yard looking for a buyer.


There have been reports a group of people are trying to raise money to get all boats back in service.
