





Refreshments of cookies and punch were served after the ceremony.







THE GRAND LODGE OF EUROPE, ICELAND

The establishment of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows in Iceland in the year of 1897 was a grand gesture by the Danish Oddfellows to the Icelandic nation when they decided to build a Leprosy Hospital in Reykjavik Iceland. After a visit of brother Dr. Ehlers, architect Turen and Dr. Petrus Beyer all from the Danish Order of Odd Fellows, to Iceland, it was obvious that the leprosy disease was a great problem. Dr. Petrus Beyer Grand Sire of Denmark then brought up the idea to build a Leprosy Hospital in Iceland. He then convinced his fellow members of the board of the Danish Odd Fellow jurisdiction to work on this project. When Grand Sire Dr. Petrus Beyer later visited Iceland to decide the building site for the Hospital, five influential Icelandic citizens were impressed and moved by the action of the Danish Order of Odd Fellows, asked him to institute an Odd Fellow Lodge in Reykjavik and to be installed into that Odd Fellow Lodge.

Sunday, August 1st, 1897, gathered at the premises of Reykjavik's Court of Law, Dr. Beyer, Mr. Thuren the Danish architect and designer of the Hospital, Mr Bjorn Jonsson, then editor of the first Newspaper in Iceland, Mr. Guobrandur Finnbogason, Consul for Norway and Sweden, Mr Guomundur Bjornsson, physician and later the National Medical Doctor of Iceland, Mr. Halldor Danielsson, Reykjaviks Magistrate and Mr. Sighvatur Bjarnason, the director for the National Bank of Iceland, the two Danish Oddfellow's installed the Icelanders into the Order, and when they had been given the three degrees, the first Icelandic Lodge, number 1, Ingolfur was instituted.

The nobleminded gift; the Leprosy Hospital which was handed over to the Icelandic nation in 1898 by the Danish Odd Fellows, became an incentive for other Icelanders to participate in the high minded work of the Order. Attendance from day one became so strong that it was insured that the Order was here to be. The growth of the Lodge was steady and on the 10th anniversary of the Lodge number one Ingolfur, the brothers counted 76. In 1971 the second Lodge was instituted in Akureyri, the country's second largest town.

The first Rebekah Lodge Bergpora, was instituted in 1929 in Reykjavik and the same year the first Encampment, Petrus, was instituted, named after the former Grand Sire

of Denmark Dr. Petrus Beyer. Patriarch's Militant, Canton no. 1, Njall was instituted in 1961. Today in the beginning of year 2009, there are in Iceland 23 brother Lodges, 14 Rebekah Lodges, 6 Encampments and one Canton. The brothers are 2.148 and sisters are 1.256 total 3.404 which is more than 1% of the Iceland population. The Icelandic Order has a steady growth of 2-3% a year.

A District Grand Lodge of Iceland was instituted in 1933. In 1948 the Independent Grand Lodge of Iceland was founded.

The Icelandic Order of Odd Fellows has always emphasized charity work in many various fields, such as providing hospitals with instrumentation for cancer treatment, heart diseases, eye diseases, training of handicapped people and the latest big project was building a Hospich, Hospich Chapel and Hospich Day Care Unit.

The Grand Lodge of Iceland wishes Odd Fellows all around the world prosperity and growth.
