

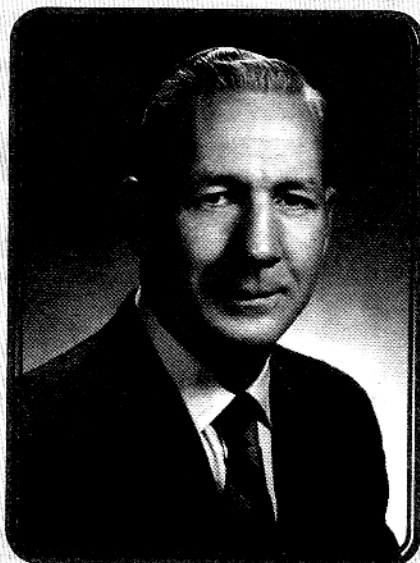

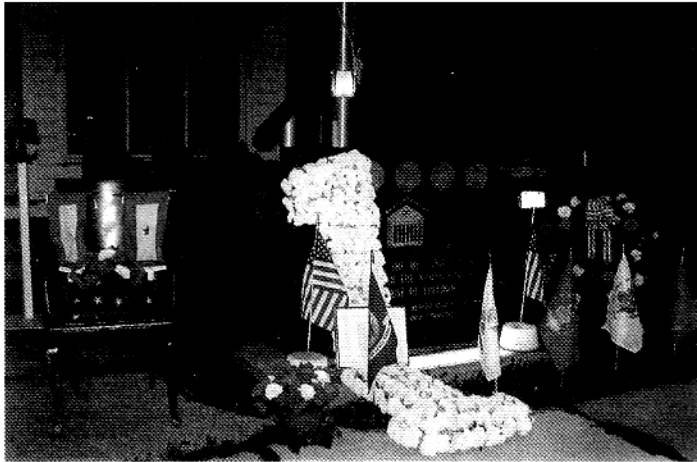

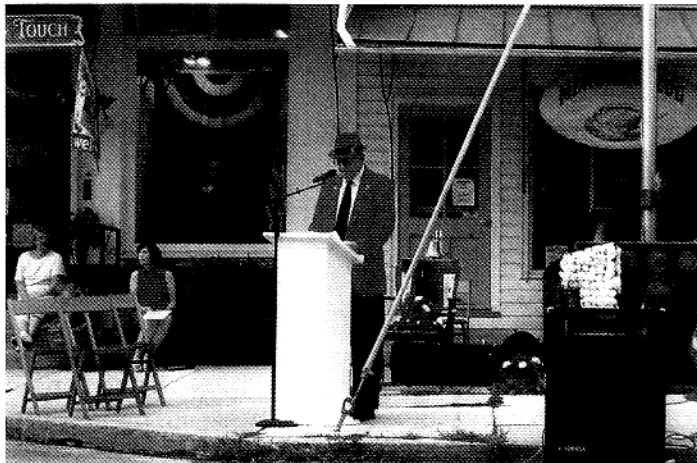
STRASBURG IOOF #361 LODGE

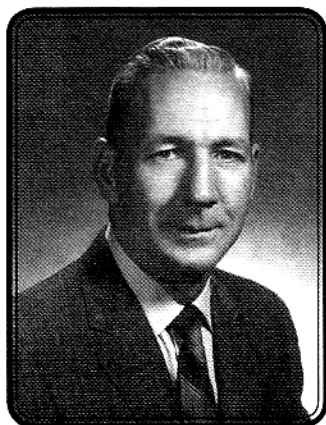

Barger, 85, of Monongahela, PA, was initiated an Odd Fellow into Nucleus Lodge #377, Gastonville, on March 28, 1973 where he became a Past Grand and received his Grand Lodge Degree on November 2, 1974. He then became active with the Grand Lodge, serving as Grand Herald to PGM Robert Gumbert from 1976-1977, Grand Marshal to PGM Fred See

from 1980-1982 and Grand Conductor to PGM Calvin Conklin from 1986-1987. He then went on to lead the Jurisdiction as our Grand Master from 1991-1992 alongside his wife as President of the Rebekah Assembly, Carolyn. He has served many committees and many years as Rep/ Alternate Rep to Grand Lodge and Grand Encampment.

He also held membership in Mon Valley Rebekah Lodge #82, Gastonville, having joined on April 10, 1976 and was a Past Captain of Canton Pittsburgh #5.

He was a Past Chief Patriarch of Monongahela Encampment #109, Elizabeth, having served as SGR to the Sovereign Grand Lodge for several years from the Grand Encampment.

Brother Clyde was a WWII U.S. Army Veteran, belonging

to the VFW Post 167 of Charleroi and a member of the Speers United Methodist Church.

Born in Charleroi, PA, he was one of six brothers. Surviving is his wife of 51 years, Carolyn, PPRA, two daughters, Debra and husband David Young, also a PG of Nucleus #377 and Sandra and husband Glyn Ellis, two grandchildren, Ashley and David Young and one brother.

Odd Fellow services were conducted by the Grand Lodge and burial was in the Maple Creek Cemetery, Charleroi.

We look back upon our departed Brother's acceptance speech as he became Grand Master that he stressed to all in attendance that we need to rededicate ourselves to this great Order. He stated we need to get back to having Odd Fellow Lodges instead of Social Lodges which included meeting around a table instead of in the Lodge room and taking shortcuts through the opening and closing. If we as not only fellow Brothers and Sisters to Clyde, but as friends, rededicate ourselves to the Order in his memory, Odd Fellowship will flourish again.

This Chapter in Clyde's life will close with his saying on the night he became our Grand Master:

"I've never made a fortune, and I'll never make one now. But it really doesn't matter 'cause I'm happy anyhow. As I go along my journey, I'm reaping better than I've sowed. I'm drinking from the saucer 'cause my cup has overflowed. I don't have a lot of riches, and sometimes the going's tough, but while I've got my family and friends to love me, I think I'm rich enough.

I'll just thank God for the blessings that his mercy has bestowed. If you give me strength and courage when the way grows steep and rough, I'll not ask for other blessings, I'm already blessed enough.

May I never be too busy to help bear another's load. Then I'll be drinking from the saucer, cause my cup has overflowed."

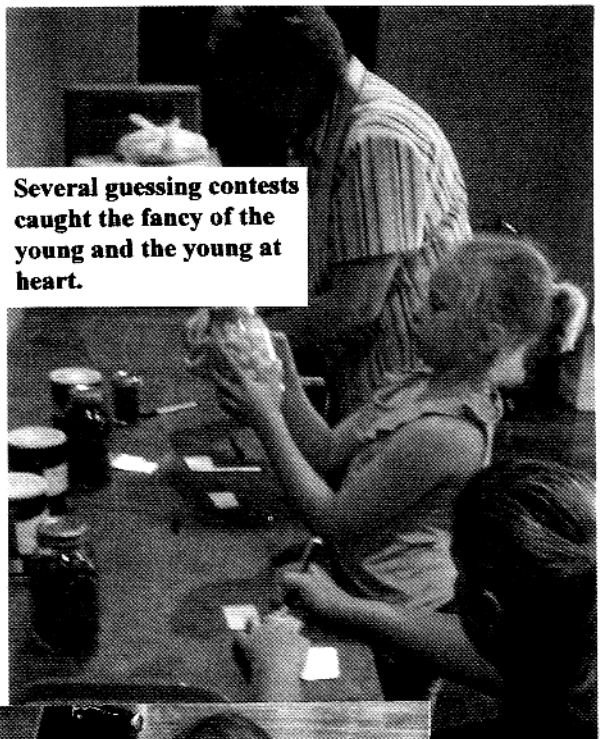

Several guessing contests caught the fancy of the young and the young at heart.



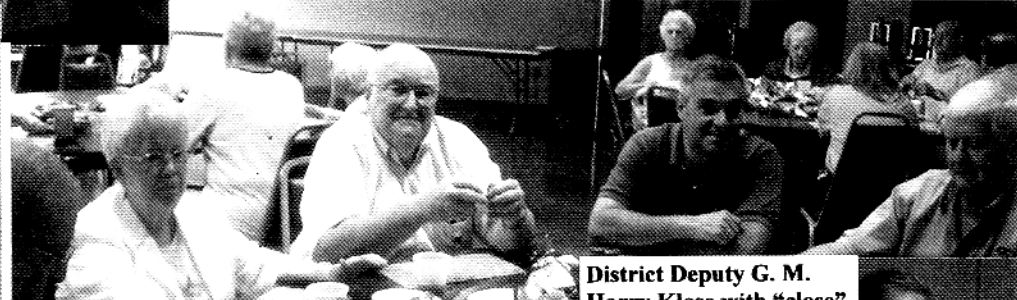
Sr. Donna Faub, Financial Secretary, had engineered a delightful picnic for all.

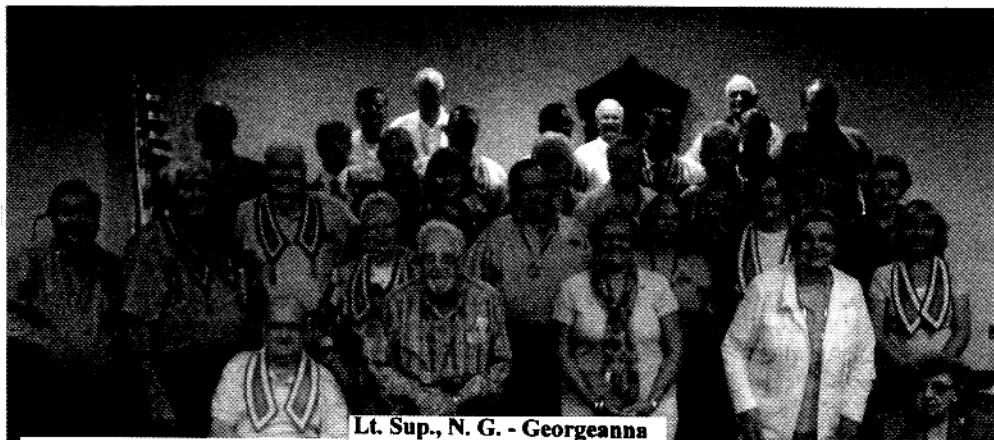

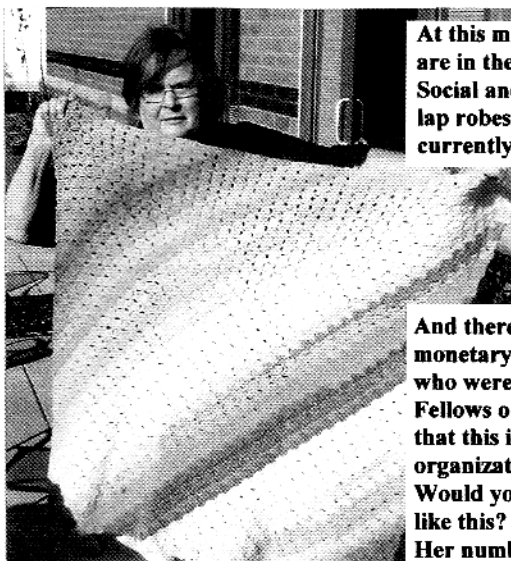
THE RENAISSANCE OF UNIFIED LODGE

In retrospect, you need to know that it was just about 8 years ago when Unified Lodge had been meeting in the Woods Run area of the North Side, just barely holding things together, with only 5 or 6 or fewer members in attendance most evenings.
