On September 23, only days after the idea formed, over one hundred units formed to march in this Patriotic Parade. We formed in a field on a hot day, with units from Fire Companies, American Legions, Veterans groups, High School Bands, Motorcycle Clubs, other fraternal groups, National Guard Units, and oh so many more. Many of these units had a color guard, and of those that didn't, they usually carried a flag or dressed in red, white and blue. There were hundreds and hundreds of people who marched, and hundreds of volunteers who helped get it all organized. Patriotic Pride flowed everywhere. The time came, and off we marched. At the beginning of the parade hundreds lined the route, and many were waving flags, I remember that near the beginning of the parade, there was a little girls sitting on the curb, and as we approached she jumped up, waved her flag and said "stand up mommy, here comes another flag." My chest pumped up, and my shoulders got straighter. As we rounded the corner to the Main Street of town, I could see thousands of people, lining the street, waving thousands of flags. My shoulders got a little more straight. We had a long hot march for the next mile, uphill. I remember one Chevalier getting red from the heat and looking as if he might not make it to the finish. Someone yelled for him to drop out and he replied with a

loud "NO". My eyes went forward, my chest pumped up, and the feeling of "Love of Country" was the strongest it had ever been. One Chevalier, who had trouble walking, struggled through the entire route, but he also refused to quit. I glanced sideways and saw the same feeling in very Chevalier. We all walked proud and tall, and we all looked as if we were doing something great.

I was but one participant of many in our Unit, and we were just one Unit of many in the entire Parade. I realized later that we were just one parade of many that occurred across this wide country, but still we felt that we had done something good that day, and I for one will always remember.

Services are being planned at Orchard Manor

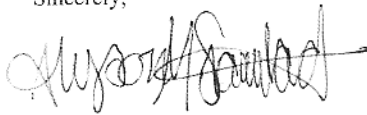

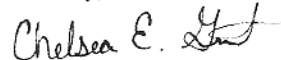

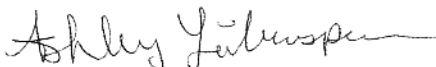

Please read these descriptions... and be on your guard:

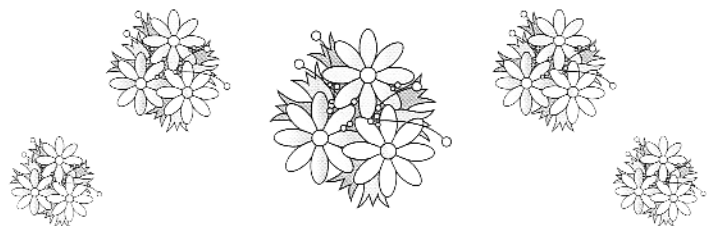

These three members can usually be found in mirrors, they have rather sour looks on their faces. Be on your guard and don't let them enter your home.



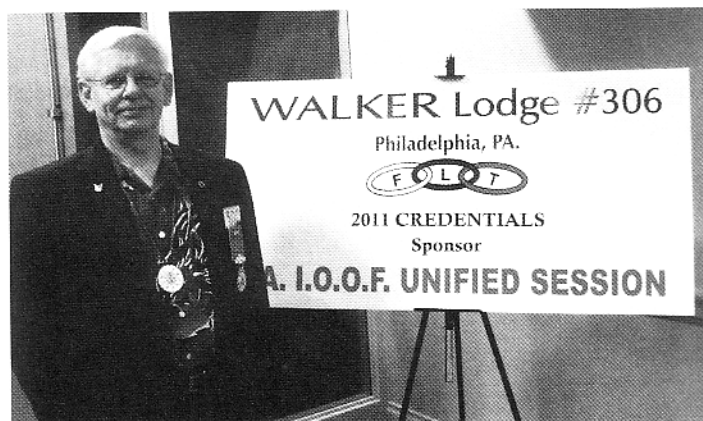
40TH ANNUAL UNIFIED SESSION HELD IN HARRISBURG

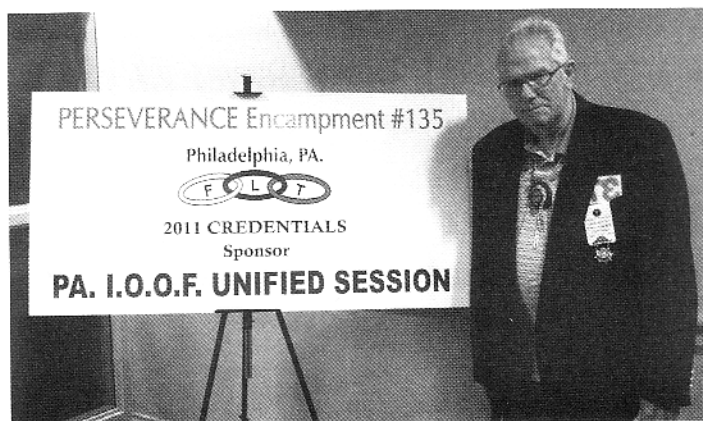

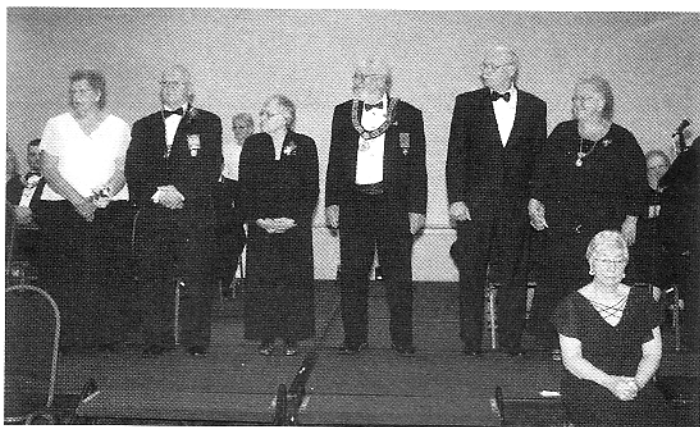

GRAND LODGES IN EUROPE - SWEDEN

History of the Swiss Jurisdiction

In 1999 the Swiss Odd Fellows have celebrated the 125th anniversary of their Grand Lodge. Initial cause was the "Helvetia" Lodge No.1 in Zurich which 1871 got initiated by two American Brothers together with the Grand Master of the State California Professor John Morse as a very dedicated delegate of the SGL. This lodge was under the gavel of Reverent Karl Grob, who later became Minister in the Canton of Zurich, grew fast also towards a first Swiss Grand Lodge.

It was a very exciting time in Europe when Napoleon the 3rd got defeated by the German Chancellor Bismarck in the French/German war (1870/71) and Wilhelm the 1st got crowned as German Emperor in the Mirror Room in Versailles near Paris. Switzerland at that time was also in turmoil due to the transformation from a strict federal into a con-federal constitution. Industrializing and growing mobility due to the railway construction allowed for a new liberal experience.

On April 22, 1874 the Grand-Lodge of Switzerland got initiated by the German Grossmeister (Grand-Sire) Ostheim, however as subordinate unit of the Sovereign Grand-Lodge, represented by a Special Deputy Grand-Sire for Europe. Within 3 years six new Lodges were started. Today only two of them, the St Jakobs-Lodge No.6 in Basel and the Rheinfall-Lodge No.9 in Schaffhausen are operational.

After years of difficulties, some typical for new growing organizations, the Grand Lodge of Switzerland got finally chartered as an Independent Grand Lodge by the Sovereign Grand-Lodge in February 1892. With enthusiasm the constitution and the rituals got adjusted to traditional customary values.

1888 the first Encampment got initiated. Up to the beginning of the first world war in 1914 seven lodges were at work. Another 10 lodges followed under the motivation for humaneness after the disastrous experience of the 1st war.

1920 the Swiss Jurisdiction accepted the responsibility from the Sovereign Grand-Lodge to care for the expansion work in France. The former German "Wasgau"-Lodge in Strassbourg (Alsace) became Loge "Louis Pasteur" No.1 in conjunction with the peace treaty in 1918 in which the former German Alsace became part of France.

For some 80 years the Swiss Jurisdiction tried to grow Odd Fellowship to a functional body in France until 2004, when it concluded that all efforts were wasted because of the impossibility to bring harmony into existing French (Latin) Brotherhood. By 1926 the shadow of an upcoming political turbulence in

Germany became effect also in Switzerland. Despite this danger Switzerland grew up to 12 Lodges totalizing 1850 brothers by 1931.

Motivated by the Nazi-thrust a political initiative banning all philanthropic Institutions got strongly refused by the people in 1934. However this trend intimidated many Lodge-members so that the order lost many of them. The following years some 600 members (1/3) were lost. Up to 1954 the Order grew again up to 14 Lodges even into the French speaking part of Switzerland. In 1971 some 2000 Swiss Odd Fellows organized in 21 Lodges, could celebrate the 100th birthday of the Swiss Grand Lodge, called now the Order of the Swiss Odd Fellows.

Also the women got attracted by the Odd Fellowship. In April 1971 the first Rebekah-Lodge "Anna Seiler" got started in Bern. 1972 and 1973 the two Sister-Lodges got started in Schaffhausen and Basel. From the 70's up to 1990 the Order continuously grew along in the positive mood of these years up to the maximum of 2400 members, organized in 33 Brother and 6 Sister Lodges. The messages calling for a social effort to help the distressed and human respect was confirmed cause for the attractivity.

The recent 20 years the development of the Order in Switzerland was governed by continuous growth of wealth with institutionalized social assistance with the negative effect on individual social engagement as backside of the medal. Hedonism became an important part of life and the Odd Fellow values tended to mutate to importance of the past. Although natural losses of members got compensated the order growingly developed difficulties in getting and keeping young members.

It seems rather difficult to find enough leading competence in lodges, which is to make lodge meetings valuable enough for the future. 5 Sister Lodges with one Encampment and 30 Brother-Lodges with 3 Encampments are making up the Odd Fellows Order in Switzerland (OSOF) of today with total 1720 members. The actual Grand Sire Peter Senn and Assembly President Susi Bachmann with their assisting brothers and sisters are working hard in changing the communicative behaviors of the Order into a suitable form for carrying the OF-values into the future. All efforts since 2000 are to bring the Swiss Odd Fellows back to an attractive offer for women and men who are seeking to live a valuable life in the "modern" society of today.

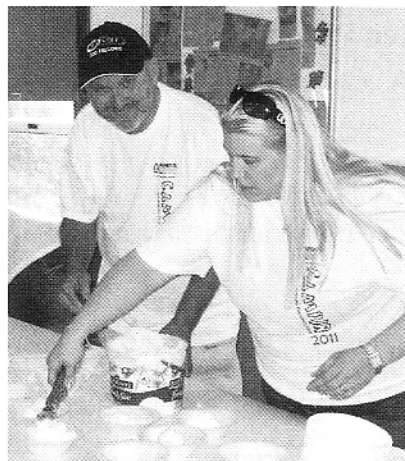

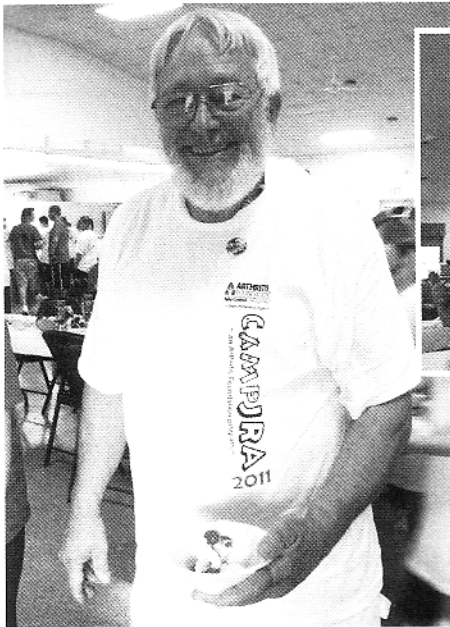

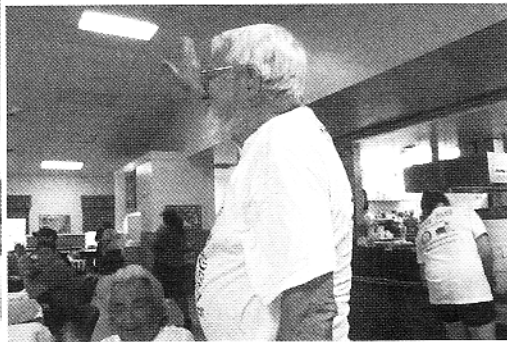

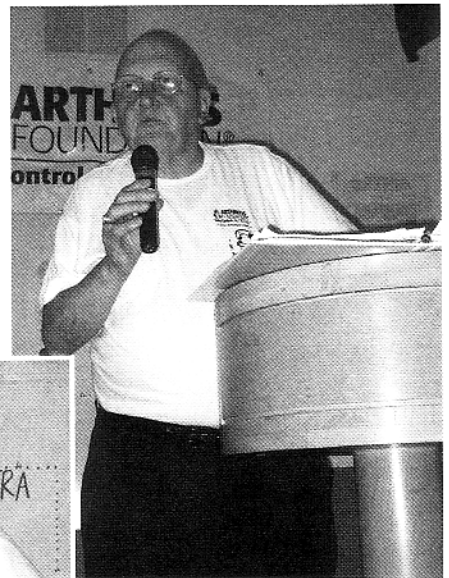

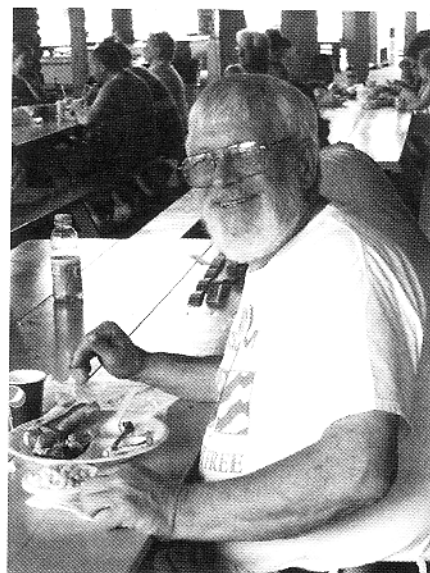

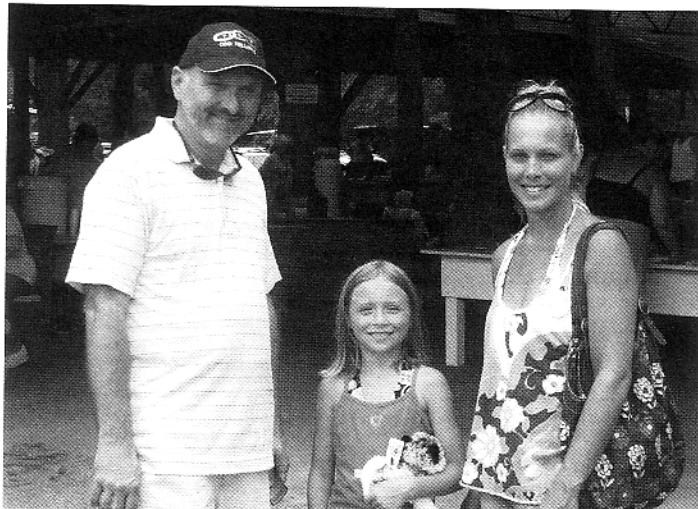
