

Burial was held in Dellville United Methodist Cemetery.


## THE ORIGIN OF PRESIDENT'S DAY

The origin of Presidents' Day lies in the 1880s, when the birthday of George Washington—commander of the Continental Army during the American Revolution and the first president of the United States—was first celebrated as a federal holiday. In 1968 Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Bill, which moved a number of federal holidays to Mondays. The change was designed to schedule certain holidays so that workers had a number of long weekends throughout the year, but it has been opposed by those who believe that those holidays should be celebrated on the dates they actually commemorate. During debate on the bill, it was proposed

that Washington's Birthday be renamed Presidents' Day to honor the birthdays of both Washington (February 22) and Abraham Lincoln (February 12); although Lincoln's birthday was celebrated in many states, it was never an official federal holiday. Following much discussion, Congress rejected the name change. After the bill went into effect in 1971, however, Presidents' Day became the commonly accepted name, due in part to retailers' use of that name to promote sales and the holiday's proximity to Lincoln's birthday. Presidents' Day is usually marked by public ceremonies in Washington, D.C., and throughout the country.

## **CHRISTMAS**

The week after the children returned to school after the Christmas recess. My oldest son came home from school and said that the kids in school told him that Santa Clause was your father. Well now, my wife and I had decided early on that we would not buy toy guns for our children. My son was ten years old, so that for nine Christmases he didn't get a toy gun to play with. But that year my mother-in-law yelled at me that if I don't buy them toy guns they will want real ones, too soon. So I broke down and bought toy guns that year. So when my oldest son spoke up and said Santa was your father, I looked at him and with all the sincerity I could muster said, "I went out and bought you a gun." "Well," he said, "Maybe they were mistaken."

Well now, I look around and watch people rush around shopping for things to give on Christmas. But today, it appears to me that, Christmas is one day. We tell people that we love them only one day a year by buying expensive things that we really can't afford. When I was a kid, the late 1930's and early 1940's, Christmas was a season. It went from from Thanksgiving to Christmas Day. We, my family, were very lucky. We had a floor model radio. The music at Christmas time of year was just beautiful. We all sang along with it. Four Jews sitting around the radio singing "Come All Ye Faithful". Well, it was a little confusing to say the least.

I remember hearing Mr. Donahue, our next door neighbor, complain to my father that the Christmas tree cost the Donahue family three dollars this year. "It is just outrageous!" I learned all the Christmas Carols in school. We all had little song books provided by the John Hancock Insurance Company. No one sang "I had a little dradle" For the past several years I've heard people say, "Put Christ back in Christmas!" Well, who took him out in the first place?

Actually, Christmas is a season. It goes from Christmas day to January fifth. It was a time when families are supposed to gather to celebrate themselves. It was a time to say, "I'm sorry for saying or doing hurtful things to you. Please forgive me!" That is where the promise of Peace on earth and Good Will to Men comes from. It seems to me that people are too busy cursing the darkness then to take the time to light a candle.

In those days if you got a present for Christmas, it was probably a pair of mittens that your grandmother knit for you. Your presents, were the hugs that you got from unbelieving aunts. They couldn't believe that, that dolt of a father of yours could not produce such gorgeous children. If you lived up north, the sled that you used was a hand-me-down from someone who had out grown it and you had to share it. There was no money for frivolity The OPA dictated how much one could earn and how much your employer could pay. The OPA dictated what you could buy and how much you had to pay if you could find it. The war was on and we all had relatives in the service.

I was in the second or third grade when Christmas came. In my class we all drew names and we were expected to buy a present for the person who's name we drew. That present was not to exceed a cost of fifty cents. Please understand that East Manchester, NH, where I lived was like a closed society. Everyone, adults, knew, went to school with, or worked in the mills with everyone else in that little community.

My mother took one look at the name of the girl who's name I drew and purchased a game that cost about Two dollars and fifty cents.

Mom knew the family. She also knew that this girl had five siblings in many of the grades in school with her as well as two more still at home too young to go to school. There would be no toys. It would be wonderful for that family to have meat enough for everyone in the family for Christmas dinner. I can't tell you how many children left school to get a job in the mills because there wasn't enough of anything. Children were still allowed to work in the mills at that time.

Yet Christmas came and we all got to see the decorations that people with money displayed in and around their houses. Chanukah came and I just loved the potato pancakes that were part of that celebration.

As many as my mother could make, there was never enough of those tasty delights.

When I grew up and married, We had four children. I was working for SENAK co. The company sold house hold things, a dollar down and a dollar a week until it was paid. My youngest was just learning to walk. It was the 24th of December and I was home early as no one had money to pay me on the day before Christmas. My wife gave me the last ten dollars she had in her purse and said, "Go to Milagins Hardware Store and see what you can do for our kids." Milagins was one of those places; if you can't find it any where else, you can find it at Milagins. The full name of the store was Milagin and Currier. Milagin died years ago and by the time I got to the store that afternoon, only Mr. Currier was on duty having sent his employees home early. He watched me as I looked over the left over toys and calculated what I could afford. The first thing that struck me was a small stuffed doll. It stood maybe five or six inches tall.

Finally, Mr Currier came over to me and asked what I was looking for. I explained my situation and he selected three more toys that probably added up to about twelve dollars. I was no stranger to this man. I had been in his store through all of my growing years and even after I got married. He took my ten bucks wrapped the four things and wished me a Merry Christmas.

I don't remember the other three toys, but the little doll I gave to our youngest. She kept it for years, and she rescued it from the trash on many occasion asking, "fix it please." The seams had to be stitched several times and cotton batting stuffed in to replace what had been lost. A pair of pants had to be made for it as the seams and fabric didn't hold any more.

We didn't celebrate Christmas, but how could I tell my children that there is no Santa Clause when he is pictured every where and seen in most stores and even some restaurants. That was the toughest holiday my wife and I ever had. But that doll remains in my memory as a symbol of love, caring and an indomitable spirit.

## PHILADELPHIA HOME FOR ORPHANS


