I hope to see you and your Lodge's in my travels.

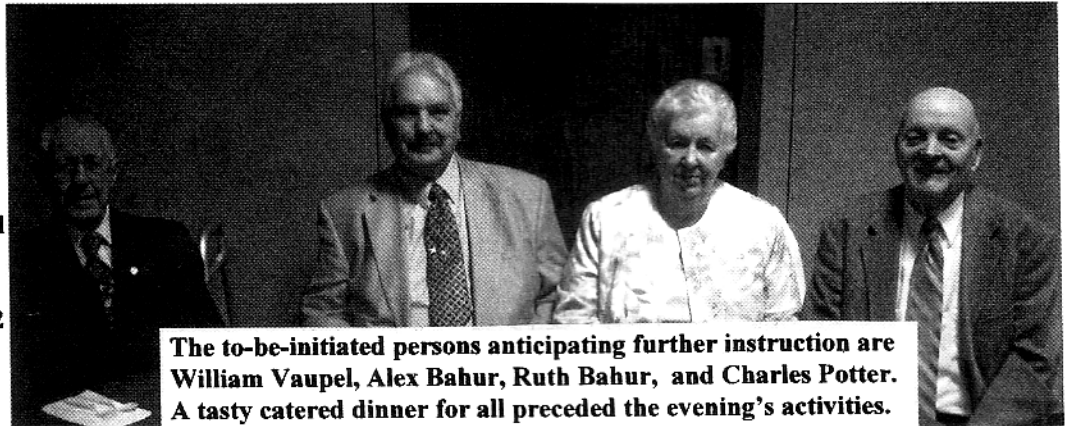

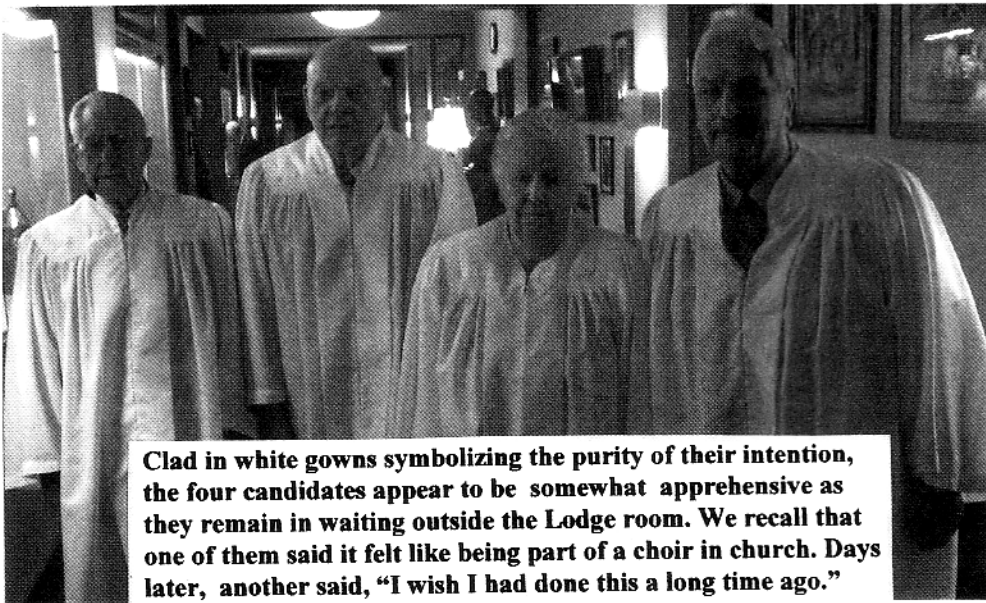

UNIFIED LODGE #2 INITIATES FOUR MORE

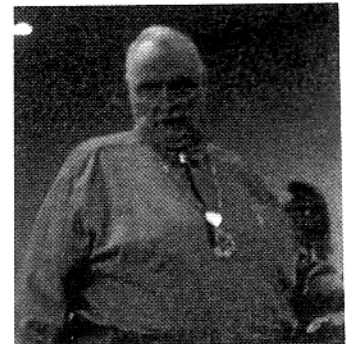

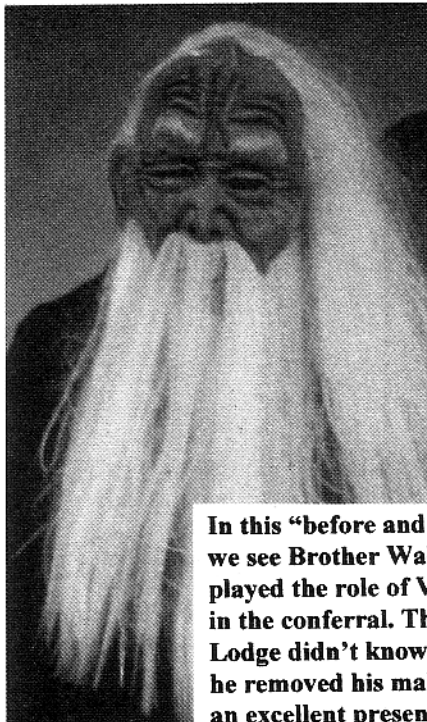

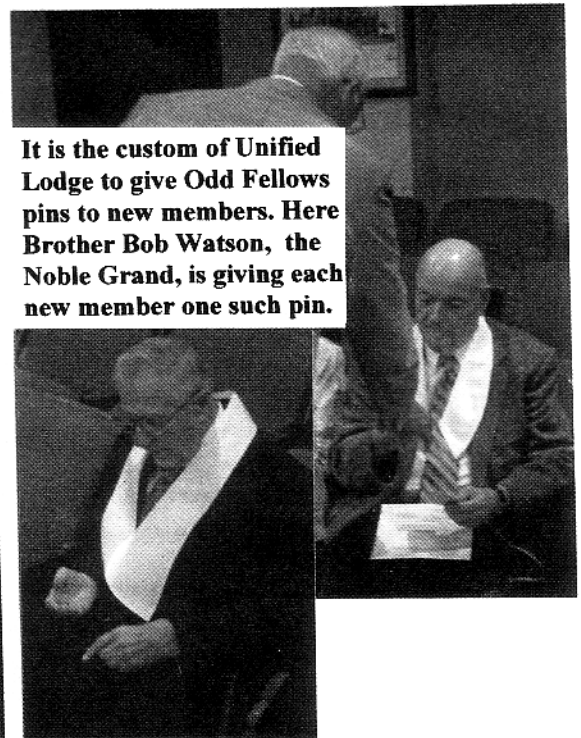

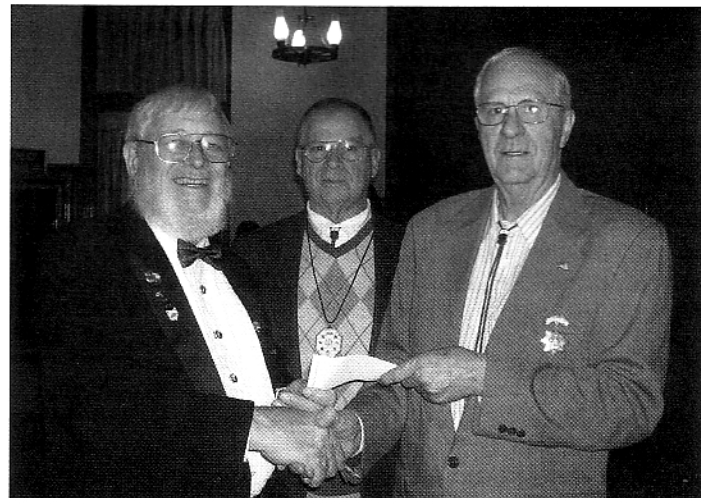
ALMA LODGE #523

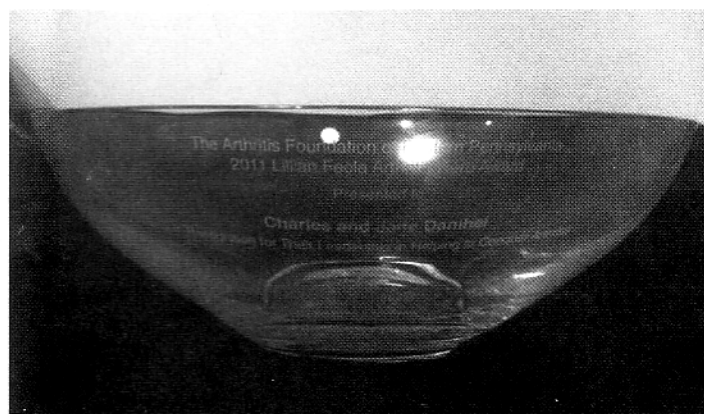
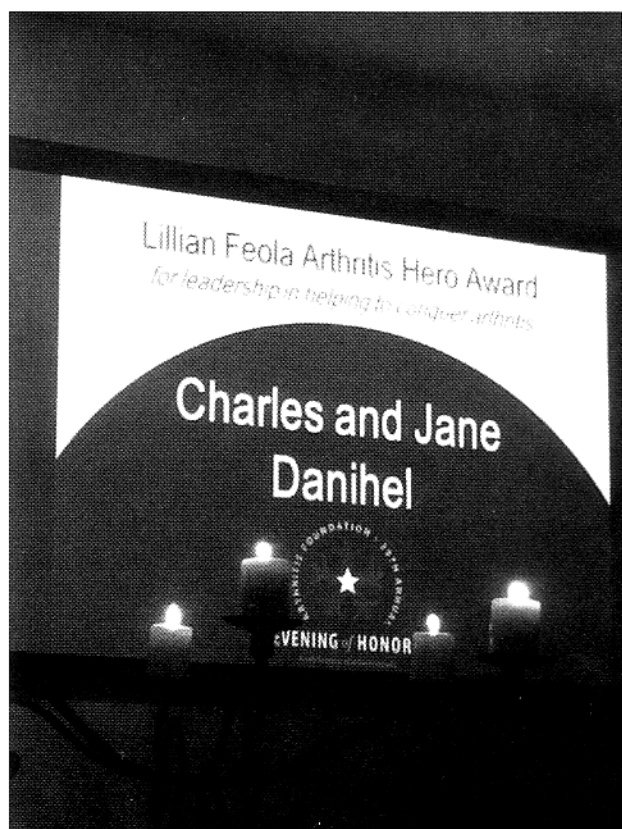

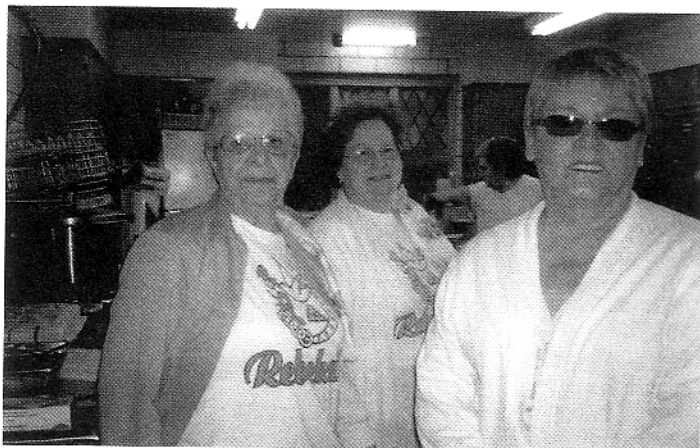

REBEKAHS SPAGHETTI DINNER

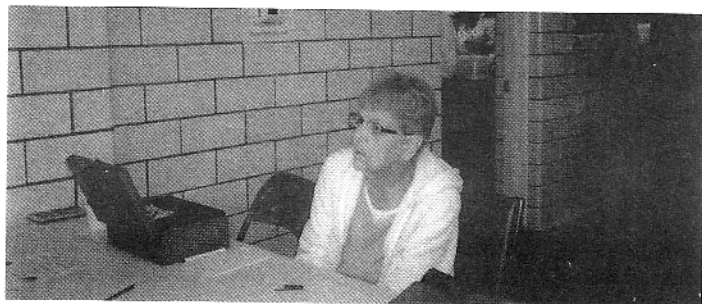

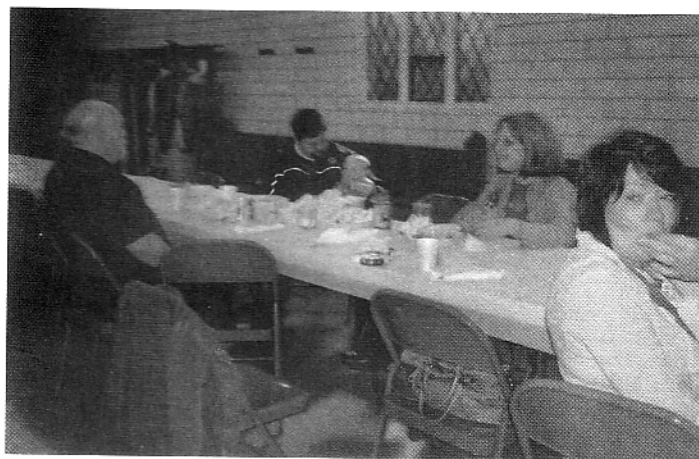

We have become an Order that thinks only of self and the honors we can attain. I only hope that the sound of this alarm is beginning to penetrate deep within the walls of our Lodge Halls.

Like Rip Van-Winkle our members have fallen asleep at their job, letting the world pass them by, as our membership declines and our Halls fall apart. That, which was an Order that inspired Communities in the past, lending a helping hand in Friendship, teaching Truth and Love to all that would listen, has become a memory in the minds of our old-timers. We are unknown to the general public, and when we do discuss our projects and time with others in a vague way they remember that Grandma and Grandpa at one time belonged, or perhaps some other relative. Did you really work to convince your members that your idea was sound and worth considering? Were you persistent and not easily discouraged. Did you make it an idea in which all could be a part of with no one person accepting the credit if it all worked out as you knew it would.

The Grand Master and Rebekah Assembly President with their Officers made a visit recently to a District Meeting, a Rally or a Lodge. You were all happy to see them, however when the evening was over did your Brothers and Sisters look back on that event as one filled with inspiration and instruction, Was it time well spent, and was the message they brought you clean and concise as to the State of our Order? Did you exchange ideas and talk over your problems? Did you work together on membership and find some solutions not only to your problems, and did they ask you for your help in solving some of theirs? GRAND PATRIARCH VISITS ENCAMPMENT NO. 135

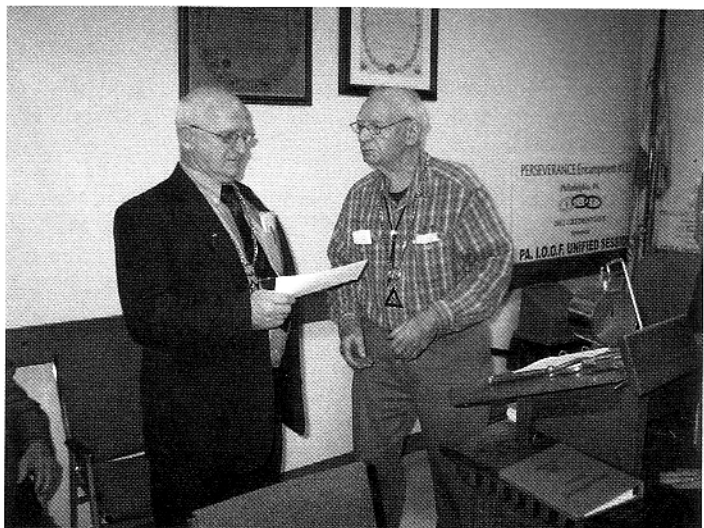

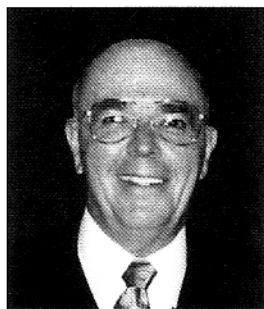

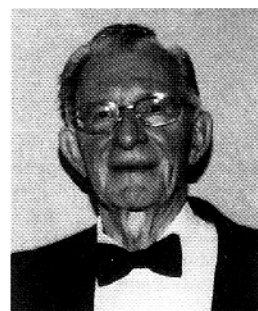
