
ALOHA TO ALL IOOF MEMBERS FROM HAWAII




PHILADELPHIA HOME FOR ORPHANS MEETING IMPORTANT TIMELY READING

The Philadelphia Home for Orphans held their annual dinner meeting on Saturday March 10, 2012 at Williamsons Restaurant in Horsham, PA. After dinner, President Craig Reinhart extended a warm welcome to all in attendance, especially to Kristin Smedley and her family. Kristin, the guest speaker, gave a presentation on the CRB1 Fund for curing retinal blindness which afflicts her two sons, Michael (12) and Mitchell (8). Opening prayer was offered by Nevin W. Adams and everyone participated in the Pledge of allegiance to the Flag and singing of the National Anthem accompanied by Michael Smedley's music from his keyboard. Robert Raffensberger asked permission to place raffle tickets on the tables, they are \$1.00 for one and 6 for \$5.00, and the proceeds will be donated to Camp JRA Drawings for all the prizes will be held at the Unified Sessions in June.

Kristin Smedley, the guest speaker for the Michael real evening, spoke on her family's fund raiser project - the CRB1 Fund for curing retinal blindness. The mission of the CRB1 Fund is to raise necessary funds to cure the degenerative retinal disease that Kristin's sons, Michael and Mitchell, are affected by. The CRB1 Fund is one of the many charities the Orphanage sponsors and has pledged to sponsor until a cure is found through "gene replacement therapy". Kristin thanked the orphanage for their support and the invitation to come and speak to the group. She also gave thanks for the Orphanage sponsoring a table of eight at the 52nd ASB

Lewis Braille Awards for the blind where her son's were being honored for their fund raising event called "Bike the Basin" which raised over \$22,000. Pictured below is a table which includes the boys Braille teachers, school teachers and principal. At one point, Michael read to the audience using a Braille recorder and gave slide overview of the ASB Award ceremony which included a video of Merrill Reese (the Philadelphia Eagles radio announcer) who introduced the boys at the ceremony.

During Kristin's audio/visual PowerPoint presentation,

she gave a brief background on her sons' blindness and how through gene replacement research a cure can be found. She gave very interesting insight of the current activities in curing blindness including that of research on gene replacement. Kristin stated the CRB1fund is a non-profit group of families in the United States and one in Germany who have children afflicted with the deficient CRB1 gene.

The CRB1 Fund will fund "leading edge research" toward the goal of a cure for her sons' blindness and others afflicted with the similar deficiency of the CRB1 gene. With timely funding, gene replacement therapy will be developed for the CRB1 gene mutation of Leber's Congenital Amaurosis (LCA.) - the medical term for the boy's affliction. It should be noted, *Time is of the essence!* Reports from doctors at the University of Pennsylvania indicate the younger the patient receiving gene therapy, the better the result. This is

mentioned because the "cones and rods" in the eye are dying off and in need of establishing connectivity to the brain to function properly. Basically, the situation is this, the eye can pick up the image but the deficient CRB1 gene is interfering with the ability for the cones and rods to forward the image to the brain.

As an order of magnitude Kristin stated the CRB1 Fund needs to raise just shy of three million dollars to

fund the process for gene replacement therapy stages of: (1) research, (2) FDA approval and (3) clinical trials. Kristin mentioned she found a group in the Netherlands (with limited resources) who started research on the CRB1 gene several years ago and could use additional funding to speed up research. The CRB1 Fund is considering donating to this group because of their present advancement in CRB1 gene research. Kristin also mentioned there is possible partnering with a national organization, "The Foundation Fighting Blindness" who expressed interest in collaborating

to support the research. In addition, Kristin has the attention of a group in Washington DC who could help with the FDA approval process in a timely manner in order to conduct clinical trials in the United States.

In closing, Kristin stated: "words cannot express our gratitude to you all for embracing our family, participating in our dream, and giving us one of the best gifts of all: Hope. The CRB1 Fund Curing Retinal Blindness is so grateful to the IOOF Orphanage for their donations. We know that this incredible organization supports many causes, and we are so humbled that you have given us this amazing support toward our mission to Cure Retinal Blindness. Although the boys have only 10% of the vision that other people have, they live an incredible life and are ready to live a sighted life. We are forever grateful that you have helped them get closer to achieving that dream. We encourage you to keep up to date on our progress at www.crb1.org . Your members and families will be in our prayers of thanks that you all are in our lives."

President Reinhart remarked that Kristin did a remarkable presentation, and hopefully with donations and research this

will not take three years to help her sons. President Craig Reinhart continued the meeting and heard reports from Art Weiler (the Trustees report and the Education Committee Report); Nevin Adams (United Nations Pilgrimage); Nancy Strausser on the Sunshine Committee - cards were passed for signatures to be sent to the sick including Laura Locke to express sincere condolences upon the death of her husband Bill Locke-The Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania.

It was also reported that Clifford Snyder passed away. He was a long time Orphanage board member.

Under Good of the Order, Charlie Shorten motioned that we donate \$1,000 to Alex's Lemon Aid Stand (a national fund that supports cancer for children.) This was approved and placed into the budget by Peter Uhniat as a one-time donation. Also under Good of the Order, Bob Smedley spoke about his email to Grand Master (GM)

Art Moyer stating that given Visual Research is one of the GM's programs, and given that the GM usually sends a communication proclaiming the month of May as "Visual Research Month" he requested that the GM consider including The CRB1 Fund as one of the recipients of donations from all lodges in the jurisdiction of Pennsylvania. Given Odd Fellowship has been a regular contributor to Visual Research in general, there is an excellent opportunity for Odd Fellowship to be on the forefront of donations specifically to The CRB1 Fund-Curing Retinal Blindness. Bob further mentioned that with limited coverage in our Order thus far, donations from lodges in his district (District #3), Perseverance Encampment #135, The IOOF Orphanage of Eastern PA and Brady Lodge (where his Brother Bill Smedley is the Secretary), the CRB1 Fund has raised over \$24,000, with promises of ongoing donations until a cure is found. Bob mentioned that he is looking forward to the time when his two Grandsons would be able to see Niagara Falls while on the UN trip. In closing, President Craig Reinhart asked Nevin Adams to offer a closing

To all Brothers, Sisters and friends of Odd Fellowship, I am Bob Smedley, a 45 year member in Walker Lodge No. 306 in a family that has been in Odd Fellowship well over the century mark. There is a situation in our Order that needs to be brought to your attention for help. Kristin Smedley, my Daughter-in-law and my Son Michael (also a member of the Order) have two blind sons of their three children – the third being a girl with no sight problem.

In this May 2012 issue of the Odd Fellow & Rebekah Magazine, the Grand Master signed the annual "Visual Research Proclamation" requesting donations go to: (1) PA Special Visual Fund – This is used to assist PA members and families who need assistance in the purchase of glasses or for examinations; (2) IOOF Visual Research Fund – 10% of the contributions are forwarded to the SGL. The balance is distributed by the Joint Committee to various Eye-Banks throughout PA; and (3) The CRB-1 Fund Goes towards Curing Retinal Blindness through gene replacement research – which is GM Moyer's Special Project.

Given Odd Fellowship has been a regular contributor to Visual Research, there is an excellent opportunity for Odd Fellowship to be on the forefront of donations to The CRB1 Fund – Curing Retinal Blindness. This fund will provide "leading edge gene replacement research" toward the goal of a cure for my grandson's blindness and others afflicted with the similar deficiency of the CRB1 gene. By your contributions, Odd Fellowship could become a major advocate in seeking the cure this retinal deficiency.

Here's some background on The CRB1 Fund - Curing Retinal Blindness. Twelve years ago the doctors at the University of Penn and Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) gave us the shock of a lifetime when they told us Michael was blind. We were told he had Leber's Congenital Amaurosis (LCA), the most severe form of Retinitis Pigmentosa. They told us our baby could not see. He would never play baseball. He would never read regular print. He would never drive a car. Kristin and Michael were devastated but were lucky to have friends and family to comfort them. They never imagined they'd need more support, when four years later, they got the second shock of a lifetime when they were told Mitchell, their second child, was also blind. In the years since, their family, friends, neighbors and their incredible community, have wrapped their love around Michael (12) and Mitchell (8) and helped lift our family up out of sadness and into greatness. The doctors told us there was some hope that, in 50 years, the medical research may be advanced enough to cure this cause of blindness. We prayed it would accelerate. Kristin searched for doctors all over the world that could help us faster. No one was able to help, so they spent the majority of their time fully accepting blindness and getting on with raising three incredible



kids. But they still read every research paper, every website, and every article that related to LCA.

Recently, technology has advanced enough to finally determine the defective gene that is causing the boys' LCA blindness: CRB1. As luck would have it, around that same time doctors at The University of Pennsylvania (PENN) developed a gene replacement therapy for a different LCA gene. Due to their success, Kristin asked the large organizations that funded that project if they would fund research on our gene. They declined and were left discouraged. And then they found a miracle: Several months ago they called the boys' doctor at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) and asked that if WE provided the money, could he assemble a team to heavily research our gene and develop a therapy for our boys. He said yes! Dr. Eric Pierce and Dr. Jean Bennett (PENN) have agreed to replace the boys' gene that is defective with a new perfect one. With our family funding, gene replacement therapy will be developed for the CRB1 gene mutation of LCA.

Kristin found other families in the United States (and one in Germany) with kids having a defective CRB1 gene and engaged their support and that of a non-profit foundation to manage charitable fundraising efforts of collecting donations for the costly undertaking and time involved process for gene replacement therapy stages of: (1) research, (2) FDA approval and (3) clinical trials. Thus "The CRB1 Fund - Curing Retinal Blindness" was established to receive donations to develop gene replacement of a defective CRB1 gene which my two grandsons and other families' children have. Given this potential cure, we need donations - a lot of them. Right now, our group is working to fund the three major components of gene replacement therapy (1) research, (2) FDA approval and (3) clinical trials at a total cost of well over three million dollars. The reality is that if we raise the money quickly, clinical trials could be just 5 years away. Michael would be in 11th grade and Mitchell in 8th.

Kristin Smedley is a very pro-active individual and as such is very aware, through her medical contacts, that no other institution in the United States is performing or plans to perform Gene Therapy Research on the CRB-1 gene at this time. In fact, she was informed that research at The Wilmer Eye Institute is already years behind Penn and might take years to ramp up to where Penn is presently with gene research.

To substantiate, I contacted Dr. Henry D. Jampel Wilmer M.D., M.H.S., Independent Order of Odd Fellows Professor of Ophthalmology, Wilmer Ophthalmological Institute, at Johns Hopkins Hospital and stated we are interested to know if the Wilmer Eye Institute has a plan to develop clinical trials for gene replacement therapy for the CRB1 gene mutation of LCA and if so, what the timeline is for this. If you have no current plans, would Wilmer be able to contribute toward funding in a cure."

I received a response from Dr. Hendrik Scholl, MD MA, Visiting Professor of Ophthalmology, Wilmer Eye Institute. Dr. Scholl wrote: "I received your request through Dr. Henry

Jampel. Iunderstand your situation and admire your enthusiasm to develop therapy for LCA due to CRB1 gene mutations." Dr. Scholl briefly described the research being performed and planned, but was not able to give a commitment as to when research for curing a defective CRB1 gene might be undertaken; nor was there any mention of their wanting to make any donation from one of their foundations toward our CRB1 Fund-Curing Retinal Blindness" as I had also requested.

Finally, given that Odd Fellowship, both Grand Lodge and the Sovereign Grand Lodge (see chapter 42 of The SGL Code of General Laws on "The Visual Research Foundation"), has Visual Research as a major program, there is an excellent opportunity for Odd Fellowship to be on the forefront of donations to our "leading edge research" toward the goal of a cure to one of our own and others afflicted with deficiency of the CRB1 gene. Please consider being part of the cure by contributing now and in the future! It should be noted. Time is of the essence! Reports from Penn indicate, the younger the patient receiving gene therapy, the better the result.

Please visit the CRB1 Fund - Curing Retinal Blindness web site for information about the fund and how you can be part of the cure. The site is managed by Kristin Smedley and she is

On the site, you'll be able to see the other families she found to partner with for this massive project. Also, please read an article in this issue of the magazine covering the "Philadelphia Home for Orphans Meeting" on March 10th where Kristin was the guest speaker and presented more insight about the CRB1 Fund. Hopefully a video of Kristin's presentation may be shown at the Grand Lodge session in June.

Please pass our story on to everyone you know. If you are unable to contribute financially, we ask that you keep our families and the researchers in your prayers. God listens, we have proof.

75 YEARS AGO (May 1937)
