Brother Herman L. Schlott Jr., 59, of Finleyville, PA was initiated an Odd Fellow into Peter Fritz Lodge #486, Pittsburgh, on March 28, 1990. He then transferred to Nucleus Lodge #377, Finleyville, on November 14, 1991 where he became a Past Grand and received his Grand Lodge Degree June 22, 1992. He also held membership several years at Old Monongahela Lodge #209, Elizabeth. He held the position of District Deputy Grand Master from 1992-1993 and 1994-1996. He was Grand Herald to Past Grand Master Dale Binkley from 1992-1993. He then excelled through the ranks of the Grand Lodge to become our Grand Master from 2003-2004.

He was also a Patriarch of Monongahela Encampment #109, Elizabeth, having also served as Grand Patriarch of the Grand Encampment from 1999-2000. He was a Brigadier General Retired of Canton Pittsburgh #5, where he held the rank of Department Commander to the Department Council from 2000-2002. He will be most remembered in his ability to exemplify the degrees by memory in all branches in which he belonged.

He was a U.S. Marine Corps Veteran having received an honorable discharge and a member of the Castle Shannon Methodist Church, Pittsburgh.






SISTER CALHOON PARTICIPATES IN WORTHY PROGRAM FOR 6 YEARS




