Greetings! I will take my "From the Desk of the Grand Master" for this month to explain my pin. Then when you see a member wearing one, you know the significance. I must start out by thanking PGM Thomas J. McHugh for designing my pin; I gave him a sketch of what I wanted it to look like, but with my artistic skills, it looked like my 4 year old son drew it... with his feet. It consists of the three links with the all seeing eye of God. It is common to us Odd Fellows what these symbols teach. Crossing behind these are the axe, the match and the gavel. These are my three tenants for the year, progress (axe), rebirth (match) and pride (gavel). The axe reminds us that we must always progress in our Lodges. I always smirk to myself in the Past Grand's charge of the initiatory degree when they state "Odd Fellowship is progressive." Are we really? How can we be? That doesn't just include bringing members in and getting out into our community. It means welcoming our Brothers and Sisters, reminding them about meetings, cleaning our halls, getting back to more of the fraternal part of our Order and then follow our civic duties. Function as a Lodge first before you embrace your community. Give them something to join! The next emblem is my emblem for the year, the match, along with my motto, "It takes only one spark to ignite a passion." Where does this come from? Think back to the birth of American Odd Fellowship: it did not start with many, but just one person, Thomas Wildey, who put an ad in the local newspaper to start Odd Fellowship. Look what it eventually grew into! With only one person... The third emblem is the gavel, a symbol of respect, of pride, of authority. Be proud to be Odd Fellows, honor the teachings, honor your Officers, International, State & Local. Understand what being an Odd Fellow truly is. I made this pin with no Jurisdictional emblem or year on it so that you can wear this pin ten years from now in California and it still will not show its age.

I hope you follow these tenants, especially the third tenant -- pride. When you wear this pin, you will be helping to make wishes come true for Pennsylvania children with life-threatening medical conditions. The \$3 cost of the pin will benefit Make-A-Wish® Greater Pennsylvania and Susquehanna Valley chapters. For those of you who were at the banquet during the Unified Session, Regional Manager Ann Waltman

came to discuss Make-A-Wish. I hope to grant three or four children's wishes.

I am dedicating this in memory of my cousin, John L. Bailey, who passed away at the age of 15 from Ewing's sarcoma. Johnny came home after treatments at Sloan-Kettering Memorial Medical Cancer Center in New York in hopes to fight off the disease, but it had progressed too far. Make-A-Wish intervened in hopes of bringing Johnny some happiness in his final months. Knowing that Johnny loved college football, the organization arranged for his favorite Pennsylvania college football team coach to give him a call. Touched by Johnny's story, the coach called him on several occasions and had the team sign a yearbook, after explaining to them Johnny's condition. Make-A-Wish never gave up on Johnny. Visiting the sick and relieving the distressed... sounds mighty familiar. He passed on to a greater place in April 1995, leaving behind many broken hearts, but many good memories as well.

I want you to wear this pin in his memory -- of a young child who left this world too soon -- and for your family members who may have faced a battle with cancer as well. Wear it for them, wear it for the Odd Fellowship. Show your pride in who we are and what we're doing to help children in similar situations.

I, along with my officers, will be selling these during my visitations. Several District Deputies also have them. If you cannot make meetings and would like a pin, or would like to donate to this cause. Please email or call me (my information's inside the front cover), and I will be more than glad to work with you. Thank you for your time and I look forward to seeing you all on my travels! YORK SPRINGS LODGE #211 HONOR ITS VETERANS

York Springs Lodge #211 honored the veteran members of their Lodge by laying a wreath at the Memorial Day Services held at Sunnyside Cemetery near the village of York Springs on the 27th of May, 2013. Placing the wreath was Noble Grand, Brian Ecker as the crowd of nearly 300 were told of the first wreath placed by the York Springs Lodge in the year 1866. The Service observed the 150th anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg in the year 1863 and spoke of the happenings that took place 150 years ago as the Southern Troops marched through York Springs on their way to do battle in Gettysburg, 12 miles south of York Springs. The #211 Lodge had 29 members who fought in the Civil War of 1861-1865 of which 4 belonged to Company K, Pa's First Reserves, and fought at Gettysburg.

A National Cemetery was placed in Gettysburg in November 19,1863 a few months after the battle at Gettysburg. A grand procession took place prior to the dedication of that cemetery. It was led by President Abraham Lincoln and included 70 members of York Springs Lodge #211. It was at this dedication that the President delivered the famous Gettysburg Address. To honor that day members of the York Mt Zion Lodge #74 and Bowmansdale Lodge # 1179, joined the York Springs Lodge in this years processional held prior to the Memorial Day Program. — by PG Yolanda Howe
