Michael and Mitchell Smedley, have the CRB1 gene of Leber's Congenital Amaurosis (LCA). LCA is the most severe form of degenerative retinal disease: the cells of the retina die every day until there are no more working cells to send messages from the eyes to the brain. Both of the boys were born with less than 10% of the vision of a typically sighted person and they are likely to be in complete darkness by their late teens/early twenties. Michael just turned 13... the clock is ticking.

These boys are remarkable young guys and rarely let blindness stop them from chasing their dreams. But even with the best adaptations and efforts, many of their dreams are fading as their vision fades: Michael's dream of becoming a pitcher, even just for a little league team, is gone: he can't safely play baseball anymore. Mitchell's dream of being a great soccer goalie on a team with his buddies is gone: he can't safely play on the same field as sighted kids anymore. Driving a car, a dream they both have, is getting further from possible every day that there is no treatment to reverse their vision loss.

It is treatments that the Curing Retinal Blindness Foundation is working toward! The Smedley Family is leading the CRBF a mission to connect funding with CRB1 gene specific research to bring treatments to Michael and Mitchell and the other CRB1 kids. With enough funding, multiple treatments may very well be available before the Smedley boys lose the minimal vision they have, and ultimately, hopefully, the vision lost will be restored so Michael can suit up again for baseball, Mitchell can get back on that soccer field, and they can argue with their parents about driving privileges!

The money raised from BIKE THE BASIN will go directly to retinal research. This research that the Curing Retinal Blindness Foundation is coordinating and funding is not just general research: it is specific to Michael and Mitchell's gene that is causing their blindness. And in order to maximize the money raised, ALL of the families involved in moving this mission forward are volunteers!


