On the tables were also several pamphlets showing what Odd Fellowship is all about along with our own poster made up of what the Lodges in town have been supporting. Making cotton candy and grilling soft pretzels only takes two or three people to run the equipment, and makes a nice profit. Consider doing something like this during your town festival.
