A history was read by PNG Laura Bailey which started a time lineage starting from October 1843 with the institution of the original Harmony Lodge, even though there was a short gap when they consolidated, Patriarchal & Rebekah Odd Fellowship remained until Harmony reinstituted. Today, 170 years later we still have an Odd Fellow, two Rebekah, one Encampment and a 37 acre Cemetery (which turned 150 years old in
