DONALD R. TRULICK, GRAND REPRESENTATIVE / GE, DEPUTY DEPARTMENT COMMANDER

Called Home

November 14, 2013

Brother Donald R. Trulick, 65, of Bellefonte, PA was initiated an Odd Fellow in Port Matilda Lodge No. 733, on the 3rd day of February, 1984. He became a Past Grand on October 6, 1989 and received his Grand Lodge degree on May 19, 1990. He held the position of Secretary for many years. He was also a Past District Deputy Grand Master, having served several years. He served under PGM Charles Bailey as Grand Herald from 96-97, PGM Nevin Adams as Grand Conductor from 99-01 and PGM William Ramsey Jr as Grand Chaplain from 08-09. He also held associate memberships in Centre Lodge #153, Bellefonte, since 2007 and State College Lodge #1032. He was instrumental in organizing the Centre County Degree Team.

On June 2, 1984, he became a Patriarch of Bellefonte Encampment #72, and excelled through the chairs, receiving his Grand Encampment Degree on November 14, 1987. He served many years as District Deputy Grand Patriarch and served as Grand Marshal for PGP William Locke from 96-97 and Grand Inside Sentinel for PGP Craig Reinhart from 05-06. In 2006, PGP Reinhart appointed Brother Trulick to the office of Grand Representative to the Sovereign Grand Lodge from the Grand Encampment of Pennsylvania to fill a vacancy. He was serving that capacity at the time of his death. He was most likely known on an Encampment level for conferring the Chief Patriarch's parts by memory in the three degrees for the Rallies.

Brother Trulick became a Chevalier of Canton Ridgely #8, State College, on September 15, 1984, holding the rank of Colonel and served

as Chief of Staff for more than a decade. At the time of his death, he was the Deputy Department Commander/ Vice President for the Department Council of Pennsylvania, Patriarchs Militant.

He was also an active Rebekah, having joined November 8, 1984 into Lady Emily Rebekah Lodge #452, State College. He was active on the PA-5 Drill Team, and on many committees throughout the various branches, namely the Joint Youth Committee and a former co-chair of the UN

Pilgrimage Committee in which was served as a POP. He was a charter member of Centaur Sanctum #259, State College. He was a regular attendee of Unified Sessions, having representation in many of the Branches and rarely missed an Encampment or Canton Rally.

Though he never went through the chairs of any branch, he was nominated many times, always declining and choosing to work to strengthen the backbone of our Order instead, in which he dearly loved. He was quiet, caring and always had the best interest of the Order in his mind and really put to heart the degrees in which he taught.

Surviving is his wife, the former Ella Lee Stine, brothers and sisters, nieces and nephews, and his mother in law, Edith, both her and Ella Lee being active members of Lady Emily Rebekah Lodge #452.

Odd Fellow services were conducted by his Odd Fellow and Rebekah Lodge with all Grand Bodies present and burial was held in Williams Cemetery, Huston Twp, PA.

FROM THE DESK OF THE GRAND MASTER

Fraternal Greetings Brothers and Sisters!

I had a topic I wanted to talk about. Just a random membership topic concerning business plans. That was initially my idea. In this office, and in your Lodges, plans are made to keep the wheel of Odd Fellowship turning to the best of our abilities. Too often we can get caught up in those tracks and get a touch of tunnel vision. Most of the time, that is completely innocent and harm free. Once in awhile, the wheel hits a tack that can throw your whole world of Odd Fellowship upside down. We are taught in the Odd Fellows' initiatory degree a lesson of mortality. It is common in the magazine, common in our Lodges. Death is in the world, death is inevitable. We just pick up the pieces, try our best to fill the void and move on in our Lodges and in our lives. Very rarely does a death occur in where the leaders of our beloved Order hang their heads and say, "How do we move on from here?"

Brothers, Sisters, friends, that has happened as you can see, and a very well loved driving force for our Lodges has been ripped from amongst us, Donald Trulick. As all organizations, churches, non-profits, fire companies, etc, have politics, this Order is no different. Donnie has somehow always managed to stay out of the politics and become a friend to all. His words were always soft and well thought out and he always had a positive outlook on everything, even with our declining numbers. When he spoke, everyone listened. I enjoy going to Session and listening to my Dad and other "has beens" speaking about the "old greats" in our Order - Those who

were known for being true, rounded Odd Fellows, not only with their actions, but with their flawless degree work. I have been blessed to know Donnie, and my heart swells with pride to know that I have become friends with one of the "greats," one of the last true Odd Fellows in the present day Order. In my degree work, I do not hold a match to what he knew. He saved many groups, and my heart goes out

to those left behind to carry on his legacy.

I tried sorting out in my head how to accept his death on a Lodge level and came up with the following: In the Army, we had guide-ons for each battery/company. That flag is under which we fought, and some of my fellow soldiers died for that guide-on. One night in Kuwait, someone stole our guide-on. The fury and rage that came from us built up, and unfortunately, we never found it. Let's take a look at our Charters - Lodge, Encampment, Canton. Think of those departed who lived for these. Think of the age of the paper behind the glass; if these charters can talk, what they've seen, the memories and thoughts of a future they held. When a member passes, that charter gets a little heavier and becomes harder and harder to keep up. What will it take to hold this charter up on the 100+ years of Brothers and Sisters living and dying under it? Strong shoulders and back, motivation and pride. We are shrinking in size; we need that motivation and the help of neighboring Lodges to keep these Charters up for the sake of those departed members.

I know Port Matilda Lodge #733, Bellefonte Encampment #72 and Canton Ridgely #8's charters got a lot heavier, along with the charters of the Grand Lodge, Grand Encampment and Department Council. I cannot do it alone, neither can Jim Sellers or Jim Keller. One or two single members cannot do it alone. We need to work together so Donnie's works within our Order can remain perpetuated and not done in vain. Going back to my opening remarks of getting caught up in standard items, the last time I saw Donnie was November 9th at the PM/LAPM Rally. There were seven Chevaliers for the rally.... Seven. We fortunately had three candidates, but had to do the degree in its lecture form instead. Donnie lead the lecture, always willing to help in degree work. There were many that had valid excuses not to make it, but how many would've been able to, but found something better to do, or just didn't feel like driving down to York. It sparks my curiosity to know how many Chevaliers would have made it to that rally if they knew it was the last time they would have seen him. Remember, when a Jurisdictional event, or even a Lodge function is going on, do your best to attend. You don't know when someone else's or your number comes up and you get called to a higher level. During a funeral last month I was at for a departed Brother who died suddenly, I got to speak to a fellow member who seen him at their last Lodge meeting. He said to me, "I just seen him. You get used to seeing the same people every two weeks. It's going to be so different without him." We have to keep that spark lit in their memory and just look forward to the time where we can meet them again. Rest in Peace Donnie, well done!

Unfortunately with the declining membership and lack of interest from within the community, Letterkenny Lodge #663 will consolidate with Newburg #562 at the end of January, ending Odd Fellowship in Franklin County after 172 years of continuous Fraternal support. A FAMILY HISTORY OF ODD FELLOWSHIP FOR 123 YEARS

In about 1891 my Grandfather Albert A. Lorah became a member of the Odd Fellow lodge in Hillsgrove, PA. He passed away in 1908 at age 38. Although I never knew my Grandfather I was assured by my Grandmother, Father, Aunts and Uncles that he was a good Odd Fellow and Father.

My father John Lorah age 11 along with his 5 siblings entered the IOOF orphanage at Sunbury, PA when my Grandfather died. My Grandmother Laura was also employed at the home until her last child left and then she settled in Harrisburg, PA. My Father always said his experience was very positive while a resident at the home. He bragged about having over 300 brothers and sisters while living at the orphanage.

In 1915 John left the home after graduating from high school and moved to Harrisburg and joined IOOF Lodge No. 160. This lodge later merged with No. 1120. His 3 brothers were also members of IOOF. My Father was active in the Lodges until his passing at age 91 in 1989. He was a member and PG in 3 lodges: 160, 1120 and Harrisburg 68. I remember he attended "orphanage reunions" in Sunbury for

many years. He was always grateful to have the Odd Fellow's orphanage where he and his siblings had a good home. Also my Father was also always proud of being an Odd Fellow.

When John's 3 sons Jim, John and Bob became of age we all joined the Odd Fellows. My brother John is a PG and currently a member of the Allentown lodge and also a was a member of 1120 and 68 for a total of over 65 years.

I am currently a member of Lodge 307 in Middletown. Unfortunately living in Florida I am not able to be active at the present time. When living in Harrisburg I was very active becoming a PG in 1120. When 1120 merged with 68 and later with 307 I kept my membership. I have been a member of the Odd Fellows for over 60 years.

The Lorah family is very proud of over 123 years association with Odd Fellowship. It gave Laura employment and her children a place to be raised together as part of a much larger "family".

PORT MATILDA ODD FELLOW & REBEKAHS CELEBRATE MILESTONE ANNIVERSARIES

PORT MATILDA LODGE #733 TURNS 125

In the early part of the summer of 1888, a few Brother Odd Fellows conceived the idea that a lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows (IOOF) would be of great benefit in the building and promotion of a spirit of brotherly love and affection in Port Matilda and vicinity.

These Brothers proceeded to canvass the vicinity for men of the required age and good character who might be interested in a lodge this kind. When they had the pledge of the required number they proceeded to arrange to have them initiated into the Mysteries of Odd Fellowship. On the night of July 7, 1888, fourteen men drove to Milesburg and received their Initiatory degree from Bald Eagle Lodge #410, IOOF.

In addition to these fourteen, three men received their initiations in Tyrone and four at Half Moon Lodge. With the addition of the initial men who conceived the idea, a total of twenty-four petitioners sought a charter from the Grand Lodge. The Charter was granted on October 22, 1888. A special session of Grand Lodge was then called to institute the new lodge.

One hundred and twenty-five years ago today, on the afternoon of December 6, 1888 at the Knights of the Golden Eagle (KGE) Hall, the special session of Grand Lodge was opened in the Third Degree for the purpose of Instituting Port Matilda Lodge #733. Grand Master James P. Robbins presided. Those who were not in possession of the First, Second and Third Degrees were presented to the Grand Master who obligated them and conferred the Degrees upon them. The Grand Master then declared the Port Matilda Lodge #733, IOOF instituted in due form.

The Lodge proceeded to elect officers for the ensuing term with Brother W.M. Conister becoming the first Noble Grand. The officers were duly installed into their respective offices after which Grand Master Robbins declared the Special Session of the Grand Lodge closed.

The first session of Port Matilda Lodge #733 convened at 8 o'clock P.M. in the KGE Hall on that same date: December 6, 1888. Several Brothers received their degrees that night.

Meetings were held at the KGE Hall until 1899, when the Lodge voted to rent the room above Brother Adam Cowher's blacksmith shop at the corner of Plank Rd. and High St. The members volunteered their time and talents to plaster, paint and otherwise put the room in condition to use as their Lodge Hall. On May 19, 1904, the Lodge purchased the property from Brother Cowher. Then in 1907, the Lodge decided to build a new building with a large store room on the ground floor. The contract was given to Brother D.G.A. Harshberger to move back the old building and build the new one in front. The work was completed in 1908 and the store room was rented out to Brother Eller. The old lodge room was fixed up for social and other uses. Some time later, the lodge built a small room to the side for a Barber Shop and an additional room to that which remained a steady source of income for many years.

Membership in the lodge reached its peak in 1929. Hard times for the nation and Port Matilda were reflected in reduced lodge membership, but the lodge soldiered on maintaining a steady membership and activity in the decades that followed. The years were less kind to the Lodges that helped in the founding of this Lodge and all have faded into history, with Half Moon Lodge and Tyrone Lodge eventually merging into Port Matilda Lodge. With the cost of maintaining the old Lodge Hall becoming prohibitive, it was sold to Brother Sam Lykens and it continues to serve the community in the form of well-maintained affordable housing.

In the past decade, this Lodge has seen a rebirth in membership and community activity but much more remains to be done to ensure that 125 years from now future members of Port Matilda Lodge meet to celebrate Odd Fellowship as we do today.

LADY EMILY REBEKAH #452 TURNS 100

On February 14, 1914 the institution of Lady Emily Rebekah Lodge #452 Port Matilda, PA took place with Virgie Mull, Acting President. Out of town folks came by train and stayed all night at local members' homes and had breakfast with them. This special day had deep snow and cold weather. There were 27 charter members of Lady Emily #452. The charter for Lady Emily 3452 was issued May 21, 1914. It was signed and sealed by Fred C. Henninger, Grand Master and Usher A. Hall Grand Secretary.

The first meeting of Lady Emily was held February 18, 1914 at 7:30 p.m. Our second meeting was held on March 4, 1914 an order for \$2.00 was drawn to pay for cash and minutes books. Dues and initiation fees collected that evening were \$4.00 from 5 people.

Lady Emily #452 met in the I.O.O.F. Hall until it was sold. After that Lady Emily held it's meeting in various places in Port Matilda.

We have had two Presidents of the Rebekah Assembly from Lady Emily. PP Mary E. Walker, 1966-1967 and PP Jean C. Woods, 1985-1986. One Grand Master was from Lady Emily, Calvin Conklin, 1983-1984. Various members of Lady Emily have held appointed positions for the Presidents of the Rebekah Assembly and the Grand Lodge. Certificates of Perfection are held by some of our members in past years: Marie Alexander, PP Mary E. Walker, PP Jean C. Woods, Walter E. Stine, and Donald R. Trulick. Many of our members have been awarded the Decoration of Chivalry.

Jessie Lykens formed the Centre County Degree Team in 1947. For many years this was the only Degree Team in Centre County. In 1961 the Assembly Planning committee held a Rally in State College. There being no active Degree Team 22 Past District Deputies of Centre County formed a team and did the Degree Work that day. The team at this time was made up of only Past District Deputy Presidents. When PDDPs did not show up for practice any members of the County Lodges were then asked to participate. On August 1, 1988 the 80th birthday of our Degree Captain Marie Alexander new pink and green capes were completed as the old ones were worn out. Sister Marie was very excited about this.

Our 75th Anniversary was held on November 11, 1989 at the Bald Eagle Grand Hall, Sister Edith Stine was Chairman and we had 90 members and guests in attendance. PP Leola Marrale was the President of the Rebekah Assembly at that time and was in attendance at this celebration. The above

are excerpts from the History of Lady Emily #452 written by Jessie Lykens and presented at the 75th Anniversary.

Briefly to bring things up to date from 1989 on: Lady Emily has had many of our members as District Deputy Presidents, as appointed/elected officers of the Rebekah Assembly and as committee members of the Rebekah Assembly over the years. We also had another Grand Master from Lady Emily. In 2011-2012 Arthur Moyer served as Grand Master of Grand Lodge. We are very, very proud of our heritage.

On May 22, 2006 Crystal Spring Rebekah Lodge #25 consolidated with Lady Emily, on September 11, 2006 Tussey Rebekah Lodge #66 consolidated with Lady Emily and on December 12, 2011 Aster Rebekah Lodge #177 consolidated with Lady Emily. Currently Lady Emily Rebekah Lodge #452 is the only Lodge left in Centre County.

Over the years Lady Emily has held various fund raising activities: Bake sales, dinners, candy sales at Nittany Mall, Bake/craft sales at Bald Eagle Area high School, etc. We raised \$1,000.00 for the Women's Resource Center in State College under a project from Sovereign Grand Lodge. As you can see Lady Emily is still a very active lodge. Our membership certainly has dwindled over the years but we are still a very strong Lodge.

Lady Emily was asked by Brothers Ken Kulp and PGM Art Moyer to move to State College to hold our meetings after their new hall was completed. The invitation was accepted at a lovely dinner provided to us by State College Lodge #1032. Since that time Lady Emily has held all meeting in Windemere Hall in State College and we have appreciated everything #1032 has done for us giving Lady Emily a beautiful hall to meet in. **BUT** Lady Emily's roots are still in Port Matilda and this celebration of our 100th Anniversary with the brothers of Port Matilda Lodge #733 celebrating their 125th Anniversary is greatly appreciated. A Huge Thank You to the members of Port Matilda Lodge #733 for inviting us to join with you in celebrating these amazing accomplishments. We had in attendance approximately 40-50 Odd Fellows, Rebekahs, and friends to help celebrate. (It turned out to be a snowy night.) Our Grand Master Justin Bailey and our President Mary Landes along with family and companion were in attendance with us and enjoyed the evening. **December 6, 2013** will be remembered by all in attendance tonight as a wonderful accomplishment of Lady Emily Rebekah Lodge #452 for 100 years and Port Matilda Lodge #733 for 125 years of Rebekah/Odd Fellowship service to the community.
