ALMA LODGE #523 PARTICIPATES AS JOHNSTOWN REMEMBERS THE 125TH ANNIVERSARY OF THEIR GREAT FLOOD

On May 31st, the city of Johnstown will remember the 125th anniversary of the Johnstown Flood of 1889. The flood, caused by the collapse of the South Fork Dam, sent over 20 million tons of water into the Johnstown area.

Alma Hall holds an important place in the history of Johnstown and the story of the flood. Alma Hall was the tallest building in Johnstown at the time of the flood, and was one of four buildings to survive the flood. In the days following the flood, Alma Hall housed over 200 victims, and was used a headquarters for relief efforts. Heroes emerged in the building, including Dr. W.E. Matthews, who helped those who needed medical attention. Dr. Matthews did this with three cracked

ribs, an injury suffered when he was swept from his home by the wave and swept into his office at Alma Hall. The flood is forever remembered with a plaque on the building, stating that the building survived the flood.

On May 25th , the members of Alma Lodge #523 held a memorial service at Grandview Cemetery in the Westmont section of Johnstown to honor the flood victims and members of the lodge who have passed away in the last year. FROM THE DESK OF THE GRAND MASTER

Fraternal Greetings Pennsylvania! I was hoping to use this article as my final send-off as your Grand Master, but throughout the past month, things have really picked up and I will be conducting visitations until the week of Session. That being said, I will forgo my "swan song" and march forth until my reign is over.

I can not only say it is nice to see the growth within the Jurisdiction, but wish I can show to those struggling Lodges out there how many Lodges this year have reactivated. I'm not talking about becoming front runners in their communities and donating towards every good cause; I'm simply talking about getting quorums out and meeting on a regular basis. Some Lodges I have heard get discouraged because they have to call around to get a quorum out. That is not really a negative thing! This is how my home Encampment started growing again. Before every meeting, we would call around to make sure we can get five. Nine times out of ten we did. Letters were sent three or four times a year, during special occasions, informing the entire membership what was going on with the Encampment. It kept those who didn't and couldn't show up in the loop. Then when the more dormant members started seeing we were meeting on a regular basis, they started showing up again. That is how growth starts; you have to have some bad days in order to experience the good ones.

These Lodges are old, and though the membership might be too, that does not mean they are not useful! How can newer members learn from this Order and from our teachings without those more knowledgeable to teach it to us? That is simply why in our degree the venerable warden is not a young "whipper-snapper." It's someone who has been around the block in Odd Fellowship. We need you there to teach us what Odd Fellowship is. Show us what has worked and what hasn't. Show us how to work with our neighboring Lodges and expand Fraternity.

It is common knowledge if we all work together, we'll progress together. If you have a member in any capacity halting the progress to the point they are breaking the law, and you allow them to continue such actions, you and your Lodge are just as bad as that person, and it could become the death of your Lodge. It's unfortunate that turmoil comes up

in this Organization, but it comes up everywhere — churches, fire companies, other fraternal and civic organizations. When instances like this happen, I always hear the saying (and it drives me nuts), "Where's the Friendship, Love & Truth now?" Brothers and Sisters, those are our teachings, but that does not make it stomping grounds for those who want to abuse them. I refer you to our initiatory degree spoken by the Past Grand: "If a member permits evil influences to control his or her actions and violates any of these laws, he or she must pay the penalty." Notice what it says there. We all took the same oath and we must do what we can to abide by it. We must protect this delicate Order and do what's good by the Lodge, not the individual breaking said laws.

Remember, progress comes from sticking one's neck out. It can be done, any time, anywhere. Don't think your community has given up on you, don't give up on your Lodge. Make it happen and turn the arc around. Look at all businesses, governments and societies; it's not a solid downward arc until it crashes. Organizations are hills and valleys. We must decline before we can increase; turn that declination back around and start working up again. It has been seen throughout the Jurisdiction and if your Lodge is having problems increasing, let me know and I'll do what I can to help turn it around, BUT it starts with you all! You're not too old; you're not too weak of a Lodge. Show that pride and motivation and anything can be done.

I will close with saying, as you see I made June "Make-A-Wish® Month" in Pennsylvania. Please consider supporting this. This is very near and dear to my heart and I have been pushing this project during my travels. It doesn't have to be a large donation, but every bit helps. 
