# FROM THE DESK OF THE GRAND SECRETARY

Fraternal greetings! I would like to take this time to remind everyone, the time has come to make your reservations for our Sessions in June. We can't encourage enough that this is the time to voice your concerns, express your ideas and make necessary changes for securing our future.

Referring to changes, a big one for both the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs, in the past you had to be a Past Grand or Past Noble Grand to attend Session. That is no longer needed. For the Rebekahs you can attend by just belonging, all you need is a current dues card, the password and sign of the Rebekah Degree. For the Odd Fellows, the same, with the exception of the sign of the third degree. For both sides members may sit in Session and watch and learn how business is conducted. The only time you would be asked to leave is when the Assembly or Grand Lodge Degree is conferred. PLEASE REFER TO LAST MONTHS ISSUES FOR DETAILS ON SESSION AND DEADLINES. Grand Lodge has been notified our visitor this year from Sovereign Grand Lodge will be our Deputy Sovereign Grand Master Jimmy C. Humphrey hailing from Savannah, Georgia.

Final thoughts to ponder, we still are having problems with Lodges not legally collecting enough dues and it does create problems and sometimes even hard feelings. If you are an Odd Fellow and not paying a minimum of \$57.50 or a Rebekah not paying a minimum of \$52.50 your Lodge is in violation of Grand Lodge and Sovereign Grand Lodge law. Many feel that using the Lodge funds to pay the dues for the Grand bodies is legal, it is not. It is your responsibility as a member to pay your obligations. Some have even taken a more dangerous step in stating they have fund raisers to pay their dues, that is in definite violation of the IRS as a non-profit organization unless when you are selling or soliciting you are letting people know it is for the members benefit. Because as I said previously, it is not your Lodges obligations to meet the per capita, it is vours.

# Odd Fellows and Rebekahs Association of Western Pennsylvania 2014 Scholarship Award

This will be the 9th consecutive year of the Award since the inception back in 2006. Award committee chairman, Robert Grant, wants to remind those considering potential applicants of three requirements in particular:

- 1) The applicant or a family relative must be a member of the I.O.O.F. or Rebekahs of Western Pennsylvania.
- 2) The applicant must be a full-time student majoring in one of the three eligible areas: music, education, or health related.
- 3) The applicant must have completed at least one year of college.

The Awards, of course are being made to not only defray some of the cost associated with higher education, but also to help increase public awareness of Odd Fellowship and in turn, hopefully receiving petitions for membership to perpetuate our great Order.

As in previous years, a copy of the "Rules" and an "Award Application" are sent to all the lodges representing the Western District in early/mid-May. The deadline date for submitting applications will be July 19, 2014. # FROM THE DESK OF THE GRAND MASTER

Fraternal Greetings! I hope this article is finding you all in good health. Well Brothers and Sisters, the light is being seen at the end of the tunnel and things should start to be winding down...SHOULD BE. However, this is not the case for me; I do not want to jinx it, but it looks like before my year is up, a Lodge will be reinstituted with all new members. It's an exciting time for Odd Fellowship and you should all be proud to be part of it. Fraternity is really increasing throughout the Jurisdiction.

I have placed several articles in the magazine throughout the year where I hope you learned something. So this month, I just want to summarize some things I have seen during my travels that I want to touch on again, because I am still seeing them. I will begin with saying I am not pointing a finger at one or two Lodges; I have seen this in many Lodges and if you do fall in one of these categories, please adjust your standard operating procedures to abide by the Code of Laws:

- 1. Charter drapes are NOT a clever way of keeping dust off the charter. The only time you should drape your charter is upon notification of death of one of your Members, or if Grand Lodge or SGL require you to. This is supposed to be done for 30 days.
- 2. Your meeting hall's windows must have curtains and be covered during meeting times. Blinds/curtains should not remain open during a meeting; no one should be able to see in.
- 3. The five Offices you must have to hold a legal meeting are: NG, VG, Warden, Secretary and Inside Guardian. You might have to move people around, but this is how it must be held. Your VG, or Right Supporter to the VG cannot hold the office of Guard. Each member should only have one office for the meeting.

- 4. Keep your SGL and GL Code of Laws updated. Many Lodges I ask to see them, and either they don't know where they are anymore, or they show me their Code with the updates stacked neatly next to the code. Your Lodge gets these for free. Make sure they stay updated.
- 5. If you do degree work, or have a meeting on an "off meeting night," a dispensation must be granted in order for it to be legal. If you have a picnic in lieu of a meeting, also get a dispensation in case your DDGM drops by your Lodge hall that night.
- 6. If you have gone through the chairs in an Odd Fellow Lodge, you are considered a Past Grand. If you went through the chairs in a Rebekah Lodge, you are considered a Past Noble Grand.

Other than that, this is a great year. In March, as you see, I helped in three initiatory degrees. Congratulations to all these teams for stepping up and working together to accomplish what we all hope to be life changing experiences for these new Brothers and Sisters. Remember, even if you do not have a full slate of officers for the degree, conduct it with dignity and pride! The degrees are not to be taken for as jokes. When your Lodge sells it as that, what is it conveying to the candidate??? Yes you can have fun, but there's time to be serious, and our lessons should be conducted appropriately.

I am a proud Odd Fellow. I am proud to have seen such a rebirth among the Jurisdiction. Remember, Session is quickly approaching. Is your Lodge part of it? Does your Representative attend? What is your Lodge missing out on by not having a Representative there? Keep up the good work Pennsylvania and see you on the road of Odd Fellowship!


