## BOB BOSWELL AWARD

Brother Bob Boswell grew up in NE Philly and attended Lincoln High School. The day after graduating, he enlisted in the US Marines and served 2 tours in Vietnam. After his duty for his country he came back and settled in California. With major medical problems from his tour in Vietnam, he returned to Philly and came to work with Brother Don Lapinson, his best friend since they were 13 years old and Don introduced him to Odd Fellowship and Variety Lodge #37.

Bob had been a 32 degree Mason but soon became a true Odd Fellow in every way. Going through the chairs of Variety Lodge and becoming a Past Grand, then became our Chaplain until his passing. He also headed our charity committee and was instrumental in setting up our different charities as we still have today. Active in Vietnam Veterans motorcycle group, he was revered by many of his friends.

Passing at an early age from the Agent Orange he was exposed to in the Vietnam War. We all miss his friendship and guidance along with his deep bass voice when we are singing our opening and closing songs. We present this award to honor his memory to a member who has been committed to the charity principles Bob had devoted himself to.

## VARIETY LODGE #37 ANNOUNCES RECIPIENT OF THE FIRST ANNUAL ROBERT C. BOSWELL AWARD

The first annual Robert C. Boswell Memorial Award was presented to Brother Lanny Blyweiss (pictured left), for his tireless efforts in promoting the newly formed "Good Works Committee". Since, April 16th, 2013, the "Good Works" committee of Variety Lodge # 37 under the leadership of Brother Blyweiss, has performed a community volunteer effort by preparing 160 dinners, one evening every month, that are part of the over 1000 meals served to community Senior shut-ins each month, by the "Cook for a Friend" program run by the Klein branch of the Philadelphia area JCC'S. These meals are delivered to seniors who are not able to get out of their homes for a hot meal, and are not capable of preparing their own meals. The lodge members were surprised that they were able to



prepare the total dinner from scratch to final packaged meal in two hours. The staff members help make the task easy and enjoyable. The committee's efforts include creating a meal of meat or fish and two sides, filling aluminum platters with the finished product, followed by sealing, bagging and storing the 160 finished meals for freezing until delivery by other volunteers. Each month, the menu changes. As of September 3rd, 2014, we have prepared over 2800 meals for the shut-ins. Each month, Brother Blyweiss calls, emails and cajoles lodge members to show up for the evening's work. It is a daunting task that has, thankfully, brought recognition to the Odd Fellows organization. Many of the seniors receiving the meals prepared by the Brothers of Variety Lodge; request that their future meals be made specifically by the Lodge volunteers. The director of the Program, John Eskate, has lauded Brother Blyweiss' efforts in organizing and maintaining participation in the monthly event. He states that the members bring a positive energy to the activity, and that he looks forward to their time in the kitchen, each month.

The Boswell Award will be presented each year to the Lodge member who performs outstanding service to Variety Lodge and upholds the highest of the noble values of Benevolence and Charity. The award is funded by Brother Don Lapinson, in memory of his lifelong friend and Variety Lodge Brother, Bob Boswell; who is remembered for his many charitable efforts on behalf of Odd Fellowship. In accepting the award, Brother Blyweiss stated that the award belonged to all of the volunteers who have participated in the Good works committee.

### THE TREASURER'S TALES - NOVEMBER 2014

Breeding turkeys was a hard thing in captivity. Between the lack of a successful method of artificial insemination (Toms are bashful about mating in captivity) and the lack of antibiotics to combat diseases that reside in chickens, but do not harm them, while they kill turkeys. The late 1930's marked the end for both problems. In 1919, it was still rough to raise a turkey. Barney's father and uncle were on the board of the Odd Fellows Home for New Jersey and had decided they would obtain turkeys for the 1919 Thanksgiving dinner. Since Barney was young and energetic, they drafted him into helping them.

Barney learned from his recent experiences in World War I, that planning is essential. In early June he was assigned the task of ordering turkeys for the Home for Thanksgiving. With just under 100 residents, he estimated a dozen turkeys would be needed. He scoured all the breeders in Eastern Pennsylvania and New Jersey, found the best deal and had the turkeys ordered by the fourth of July. Barney had been in too many actions that turned out poorly because of lack of planning, or so he thought.

The Friday before Thanksgiving, Barney assigned a paper to his English classes. Eleventh grade English was when students were to blossom. After all, high school had only been a four-year experience for a few years and the expanded time allowed for the students to experience literature and complex writing methods. Barney found that the opportunities opened for him to shape the minds of our youth were as disturbing as the opportunities given him through advancement at the conclusion of World War I.

November 1918 was the month of the great Armistice. Barney had been called into battalion headquarters on November 12, 1918. They were promoting him to captain and making him company commander. He would only have to serve till spring and then he would be sent home. It was a great responsibility. The company commander had been sent home early because of important affairs. Barney felt honored. He celebrated the evening of November 12, 1918 with the other Odd Fellows he could locate. The tragic weight of promotion fell on his shoulders squarely on November 13, 1918. The company first sergeant brought in a box of files and identification tags; as Company Commander, Barney had to write letters to the families of those killed in action. It was the worst November Barney would ever have. 1919 would come in second.

Barney thought he should have the students write a paper on Thanksgiving and submit it the day before the Thanksgiving recess. He received numerous papers. All were somewhat less than he expected. Barney believed that his turkeys arrived early, he was not so lucky. On Tuesday he came home from school and left a pile of papers on his desk. He was on vacation.

The first thing Wednesday morning, he got a call from the IOOF Home, no turkeys had been delivered. In 1898 the Nelson Act had expanded and codified federal bankruptcy procedures. The packing house that agreed to sell the turkeys to the IOOF Home had read this Act and was well into the process. Barney was more than upset. He knew there was no way he could find a dozen turkeys in one day. Barney's father called a special meeting of the Home Board. It was decided the residents would have to

settle on chicken for Thanksgiving, but it would take at least three dozen chickens. No butcher in Grover's Mill would be able to meet the order. Barney remembered the Vice Grand of a lodge he had visited in Pennsylvania was a chicken farmer named Ed Mooney. He climbed in to his Model T truck and drove to Pennsylvania with his father. The farmer didn't have a telephone and he needed help immediately. He got to the farm shortly before noon. His friend Ed was cleaning a wagon to move hay. The air was crisp, on Wednesday, November 27, 1918. The high that day was 44° so not much ice would be needed to transport chickens. Ed had lots of chickens. He could butcher them and have them ready in a short time but he did not have enough help to pluck them. Barney decided he would take the chickens back, live. He asked Ed where the closest phone was. Ed told him at the drug store, a mile and a half away. While Ed and Barney's father got the chickens ready, Barney went back to the drug store and called his uncle. "We are bringing back the chickens, live. Can you get the Board of the Odd Fellows Home together? We need to have a chicken plucking party." Barney's uncle agreed and by the time Barney and his father were back in Grover's Mill, a dozen Odd Fellows were waiting. They all shared the same expression his student's had when he assigned the pre-Thanksgiving paper. Barney had the same look he had when he started to read the papers.

Barney's father went home and brought the hard cider left from Halloween, Barney killed the chickens. The feathers were flying and the cider was being drunk for the next two hours. Thanksgiving wasn't what they hoped, but a fine dinner was still presented to all the Home residents. Barney awakened Thanksgiving morn with a disdain for poultry, that would only partly subside by evening. The St. Louis World's Fair of 1904 had given birth to, or inspired, many things. Chief among these was the hamburger sandwich. Despite the availability of a wonderful dinner prepared by Barney's mother, he made himself a hamburger sandwich for dinner. He tasted the roast chicken his mother prepared, shortly before retiring later that evening. What started as a grand plan to celebrate the holiday had been a bust.

Barney looked at his stack of papers. He began the task of grading. He prepared a model to compare the individual efforts. This was impossible. As he sat in his chair, he fell into a deep sleep. He was walking in the woods and a turkey came out of the brush. It was ten feet tall and began to chase Barney. He was running for his life when his chair fell over and he awakened. Barney put the papers back in his brief case and decided he should have the same break as the students. They would grade the papers in class the following Monday.
