THE TREASURER'S TALES - SEPTEMBER 2014

A picnic is always a good theme. The Fourth of July is a good (if not ideal) time for a picnic, but so is Labor Day. Labor Day marks the end of summer for most folks. And so it was for Barney Wells. He was returning to a normal life after the horrors of World War I.

Barney got up early on Labor Day. School had started and he was teaching eleventh grade English in the 1919-1920 school year. He gave his classes an assignment that would provoke some thought and creativity over the Labor Day break.

After drinking his second cup of coffee, he thought he should pick some sweet corn for the Odd Fellows picnic that afternoon. Fresh sweet corn was welcomed and anticipated at the Odd Fellows picnic. He pulled a small cart out to the field. Warden accompanied him with tail wagging. After he had picked about two dozen ears of corn, he saw something shiny in one of the ears. Apparently something in the ground had been carried up the stalk with the growing corn.

Barney looked at the battered piece of shiny metal. It was part of a watch fob. Barney could make out the three links, but little more. He cleaned the metal disk as best he could, and stuck it in his pocket. He then finished picking corn, ten dozen ears in all.

Labor Day was Monday, September 1, 1919. Because it was so early, the picnic was planned at the August lodge meetings. Battery Park was built by the Grand Army of the Republic (a Civil War veterans' organization) and was the pride of Grovers Mill. It had all the conveniences available in the early twentieth century. The lodge had reserved it for the Labor Day picnic a year in advance. Barney was the head of the picnic committee. He brought ten dozen ears of corn and twenty pounds of sauerkraut his mother had made the previous fall. He grew cantaloupe and brought four dozen of them, as well. Other members brought the hot dogs, hamburger, beans, potato salad, homemade root beer and several ice cream freezers to make ice cream. The cakes were endless, as were pies and other desserts. The crowd began to arrive at 2:00 p.m. The total was forty-two adults and twentynine children. The children's games took place before the meal at 4:00 p.m. There were baseball games and marbles, as well as skipping rope and hide and seek. Baseball was still the favorite sport, but that would change in a few months with the famous "Black Sox" scandal over the 1919 World Series. The Yankees were the favored team in Grovers Mill, but this was the era when Ruth was still pitching for Boston and New York hadn't become the modern standard for baseball. The kids were their own inspiration.

Barney helped with the cooking and had little rest until the last person was served. He covered a hot dog with sauerkraut, got some potato salad and an ear of corn and sat down to eat.

Before he could get the first bite down, Richard Pipp came over to speak to him. Rich was a newer member of the lodge and he had a son in Barney's English class. It was clear that Rich wanted to help his son get through the class and he asked Barney what he was going to cover that year. Since the content of eleventh grade English was no secret, Barney suggested that Rich have his son read Shakespeare, books by Jack London and Edgar Rice Boroughs. If he thought his son would like a bit heavier reading, he could try Ayn Rand and Bertrand Russell. Barney encouraged reading as the way to succeed in his English classes. Rich was pleased.

After a short break, enough to finish the hot dog, Barney was approached by Jacob Whitter. Jake was a civil war veteran who told stories about his exploits at Gettysburg and Bull Run. The stories changed over time and Jake had promoted himself several times in the years since Barney had started listening to him. Barney figured if Jake lived to 1935 he would outrank General Grant. Jake started by talking about a trip to Barney's farm, the year after the civil war. The farm had been owned by Barney's great-uncle Stanley and his grandfather. His great-uncle and grandfather had both been in the civil war with Jake, but both died while Barney was in the trenches in World War I.

Jake told Barney he had picked corn with Stanley for the first picnic after they returned from the civil war. He always liked sweet corn and appreciated the generosity of the Wells family. Barney stuck his hand in his pocket to pull on his handkerchief and felt the piece of metal he had found earlier that day. He pulled it out and asked Jake if he had ever seen anything like it. Jake's eyesight wasn't too good, but he said it looked like part of the watch fob that Stanley Wells used to carry. Jake said he was with Stanley when he bought the fob in a jewelry shop in the small town of Chambersburg, after the battle of Gettysburg in July 1863. It was in a building next to Columbus Lodge Hall and the jeweler was a member.

Encouraged by his conversation with Jake, Barney searched for his father, Thomas Wells, over by the ice cream freezer. Barney asked if his Uncle Stanley had a watch fob that looked like that. Tom thought a couple minutes and replied it did look like his uncle Stanley's watch fob, but he hadn't seen it since he was very young. Tom had been born in 1859, so he would have been 6 when the Civil War ended. The mystery was now over and Barney had another relic to put in the lodge trophy case.
