THE TREASURER'S TALES - AUGUST 2015

August 1920 was a busy month for farming in New Jersey. Barney had to tend to the corn, beans, squash, tomatoes, peppers, cabbage and a variety of other crops. There were a few steers, seven cows to milk, and uncountable chickens, ducks and geese. Barney was torn between being a farmer and being a teacher.

The lodge needed to pull a couple of stumps out and Barney was volunteered to take his tractor down to pull the stumps. The Model T tractor was a better choice than horses. Barney went out to start the tractor and noticed something suspicious on it. There had been a raccoon on the tractor and it had left something for Barney to clean off. It also pulled a couple wires loose. Barney spent the better part of the morning working on his tractor and headed off to pull the stumps.

Now stumps are funny things. They provide a partial shelter and a pathway to build dens for all sorts of animals. Sometimes you have to be careful there isn't a mother bear and cubs around. The first stump came up easy and was moved over to the burn pile within twenty minutes. The second stump was hard to pull. Barney went home and got Thomas, his father, and stopped to pick up a couple more brothers. Between manpower and horse power, they finally got the second stump out.

After the second stump was above ground, they noticed that the ground around the stump hole was getting wet. They moved the second stump over to the burn pile and started looking for the source of the water. Soon they heard the fire siren go off. Brother Clancey was a volunteer fireman and he left for the station in a big hurry.

When Clancey arrived at the station, there was no one running to the pumper or getting ready to go for a ride. They were all assembled shaking their heads. Joe, the fire chief and an Odd Fellow, said they lost all the water pressure on the fire plugs and the water to the fire house was a weak trickle. The nearby lake provided water to a few of the municipal buildings and some of the houses, but most of the people had wells. Joe wondered aloud if the old line to town had finally given way. He thought it had been put in before the turn of the century and it ran almost a mile. Several of the members speculated that it might take a month to find the leak. Clancey thought he could shorten the investigation but he didn't want to stick his foot in his mouth too far.

Clancey started out, "You know water lines are funny things, sometimes trees and other plants grow around them and break the lines. It has been 30 years or more since the water line was put in. We don't have a water company, just a line from the lake. Maybe we should ask the borough road crew if anyone knows who is supposed to repair the lines."

Joe spoke slowly, "Well, the water line is real old and I can't remember who is supposed to fix it if it breaks. We always fix the fire hydrants but I don't remember the line ever causing a problem. We have more than enough men here to fix a small leak, or even a single break. The problem is finding the break."

Clancey responded, "I know where the break is. The Odd Fellows were pulling a stump behind the lodge hall and it was caught on the line. When we got the stump out the line broke."

All the volunteer firemen there were also Odd Fellows. This reduced the problem greatly. The fire crew jumped in the new Seagrave aerial truck and took off. They had to take the aerial truck because the smaller Model T truck wouldn't hold the crew.

Barney was there, shoveling away mud, trying to find the pipeline. Within ten minutes there were more than a dozen men digging for the line. There were a couple of Barney's former students as well as a number of Thomas's students from decades ago. They found the leak was actually three leaks caused by bending the pipe when the stump was pulled. One of the brothers went to the lake to shut the valve, another went to Trenton to get a length of pipe and a third went to get one of the plumbers who belonged to the lodge.

The leak was repaired in less than five hours (but not much less). Teamwork saved the day. There was no central agency to call for the location of utility lines in 1920. The lodge hall had a well, so no one thought here would be a water line. We should learn from this story. There are potential problems out there. There are members in your lodge that can save the day and make things work. Teamwork is the most important thing.

ast spring, Dawn Edgar did not think it was possible to send her 12-year-old daughter, Erin, to summer sleepaway camp. "Erin was finally getting better, but she was still afflicted by the disease and had pain," said Dawn. "Considering her medication schedule and daily needs, a sleepaway camp definitely wasn't in the picture."

But while attending an Arthritis Foundation event, the Edgars met a young woman who told them about her rewarding time at a JA camp, so the family decided to give it a try.

"It turned out to be a wonderful experience for Erin," said Dawn. "She had fun and met other kids her age who understood what it is like to live with arthritis. The medical team is on site so I knew she was taking her medicine and that she wouldn't feel like she was the only one going to the nurse." JA camp is a five- or six-day residential camping experience for kids ages 6-18 who are living with arthritis or other rheumatic diseases that require the care of a rheumatologist.

Our JA camps, based in New York, New Jersey, and central Pennsylvania, offer kids with arthritis a place to have fun, make new friends and learn how to take control of their disease.

Financial assistance is also available. Camp slots fill quickly so be sure to register early.

Metabolic of the counselors understood my disease, like if I needed to rest...and I met other kids my age who know what it is like to live with the pain, the treatments, bloodwork, and ongoing doctor visits that go with arthritis.
