The **Hilton Alexandria Mark Center** is the headquarters hotel for the 2015 Independent Order of Odd Fellows Pilgrimage to the Tomb of the Unknowns. To receive the special rate of \$114.00 plus hotel tax, available for the nights of May 1-3, reservations must be made **no later than March 27, 2015**. You <u>must</u> mention the "**ODD FELLOWS PILGRIMAGE**" when making your reservation in order to receive this rate and to obtain the specially reduced parking rate. The hotel will accept reservations **on a space available** basis after March 27, 2015, but not at this reduced price. Only telephone reservations are accepted 1-703-845-1010 or 1-800-HILTONS (1-800-445-8667).

It is imperative that reservations are made as early as possible. Although the deadline to place a reservation is March 27, 2015, occasionally in past years the hotel has sold all the rooms set aside for the IOOF Pilgrimage at the reduced rate BEFORE the deadline. So, although a person may call to place a reservation before March 27, if there are no more rooms available AT THAT RATE, the person will be faced with a choice of reserving a room at a higher rate, if any are available, or seeking a room at another hotel. TREASURER'S TALES - FEBRUARY 2015

We have been following Barney's exploits on a month by month basis and we are now at February 1920. The big thing in February is St. Valentine's Day. Grover's Mill, like all good high schools, had a Valentine's Day Dance. The teachers who were lowest on the seniority list, were assigned the job of chaperone. Barney was in his first year, so he was stuck. He was in charge of monitoring the ninth graders, also because of his lack of seniority.

The dance was somewhat boring for the chaperones. Aside from guarding the punch bowl and trying to discourage the students from getting too friendly, he just wandered around the gym. Every fifteen minutes, he had to look in the boys room to make sure there weren't any smokers in there. He didn't know any of the other teachers very well since he was new and had only half a year under his belt.

While watching the punch bowl, to make sure one of the students didn't pour liquor in it, he saw a familiar face on the other side of the room. George Baker taught biology at the same high school, but Barney didn't know how long. George had received his initiatory degree in October and finally got all three degrees by Christmas. Barney didn't know George any better than any of the other teachers, but he thought he would do better in striking up a conversation.

Barney walked over and began, "I believe you are Brother Baker."

George looked thoughtfully at Barney and replied, "Are you looking for me?" grasping his lapel.

Barney was taken aback and began laughing, "You have been well indoctrinated. I should have stuck to the rules better. How did you get so lucky as to pull this assignment?"

George replied, "I am in my first year teaching. The old hands won't do it and I assume you don't have much seniority either."

Barney said he was a newcomer as well. He taught English and farmed a little on the side. His father was a teacher and farmer and the family seemed to stay in the same groove.

George went on, "I was lucky enough to go to Princeton, because my father taught there. I was planning on going to dental school, but I got side-tracked by the war. After a tour in France, I decided I didn't want to pull teeth or see any more blood than necessary, so I got this job teaching."

Barney was surprised and quite pleased. He replied, "I was in the war too. I was in France and saw action in the Argonne forest campaign."

George became a bit fidgety, "I was in the Argonne forest. I was in the 77th division. I was part of the unit known as the lost battalion."

Barney thought for a moment, he knew about the lost battalion, that was cut off from the remainder of the American forces, based on poor information. Two-thirds had been killed or taken prisoner before they were relieved. He went on to ask George, "Weren't most of the men in the unit from New York City?"

George replied, "I was from New Jersey, just like you. I graduated from college and a friend of mine, who went to Columbia, asked me to enlist with him. We were both platoon leaders. The last I saw him was in the Argonne forest. I think he was killed, but no one knows."

Barney said he thought that the fighting was rough for men who were cut off without supplies and stranded in a spot where their own artillery was hitting them. George agreed and the night seemed to pass very quickly. As the First World War was getting a replay, Barney caught something in the corner of his eye, a girl had pulled a small bottle from her handbag and was about to pour it in the punch. Barney and George ran over and stopped her. She was sent to the office for a stern lecture from Barney while George kept alert to other would-be mixologists.

That dance began a lot of things that would stick with Barney and George. A few years later, George would marry the girl who tried to spike the punch. Barney and George would both serve on the same Grand Encampment staff. The two would become charter members of the Grover's Mill post of the American Legion. And for all the good that came from it, February 1920 would be the last time Barney and George would be compelled to be chaperones, they both volunteered until they retired.


