EAST BRUNSWICK LODGE #802 HONORS MEMBERS





All proceeds from the tournament will be donated to Camp JRA (Juniors Reaching Achievement). The camp is a six day residential camping experience for campers ages 8 to 18 who suffer from arthritis and rheumatic diseases. Campers learn how to cope with their disease and form bonds with other campers who face the same challenges. These bonds will last a lifetime. TREASURER'S TALES - MAY 2017

We continue to follow Barney's exploits on a month by month basis and we are now at May 1922. The most important holiday in May is Memorial Day. Memorial Day celebration began after the Civil War, see https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Memorial_Day. In baseball in May 1922, Jesse Barnes of the New York Giants pitched a 6-0 no-hitter against the Philadelphia Phillies at the Polo Grounds. He faced the minimum twenty-seven batters possible, but gave up a fifth-inning walk that was erased by a double play.

Bridal showers began in the 1890's and are gift-giving parties held for a bride-to-be in anticipation of her wedding. Since Elizabeth and Barney are going to marry in June 1922, the shower was set for May. It was set for Sunday afternoon May 21 at the lodge hall. It was hosted by Elizabeth's Rebekah Lodge and was centered around fun and games, gifts and refreshments.

The usual fun and games for bridal showers would be much different in 1922 from those of today. The general mood was more conservative and technology hadn't quite arrived in Grover's Mill. As you are probably guessing, Sunday afternoon is not a busy time in a rural community. The weather was beautiful, the birds were singing, the bees were buzzing and the raccoons, well that will come later.

Elizabeth had just completed her two-year training to become a teacher and arrived back in New Jersey on May 10, 1922. She did not bother looking for a teaching job, since she was going to marry Barney next month and married women did not work in 1922. She was almost 20 years old. Barney was 27, had a teaching job, operated a farm with his father and was working on a novel. Publication of the novel would be years off.

Elizabeth had plenty of free time to plan the wedding. Her father, Vic, was the only veterinarian in the county, so she could always spend a little time working at the animal hospital. She was always caring for strays, for which she would find homes. Vic liked the idea, every stray dog or cat she placed in a loving home was a potential customer. The care, feeding and training of raccoons, however, only amused the Odd Fellows.

The party started at 3:00 p.m. with a game of guessing the number of beans in a jar. There was a peanut hunt, which worked like an Easter egg hunt. Each guest was to bring a favorite recipe

on cloth paper and they were sewn together to form a booklet for Elizabeth. These were the roaring twenties and there were three theaters in the area, showing modern life in motion pictures. Even the Rebekahs had one or two members who carried a flask in her purse. Ouija boards had become popular and there was a board there with the most common question being, "Who will be the next girl after Elizabeth to get married?"

An Edison Amberola was brought and there were a half dozen different disks, including the Charleston, the Black Bottom and the Raccoon. The Raccoon was a dance, you can hear it here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TufVEF50d7U. It was popularized by the fad of wearing raccoon coats. Rebekah and Melchizedek were not in favor of people wearing raccoon coats, they should be reserved for the raccoons.

Well, as you might guess, all the noise inside the lodge hall made Rebekah (the mother raccoon of previous stories) a little agitated. The day was warm and the windows were open. One of the younger girls, Mary, went outside to soothe her with a couple apples. This seemed to work, but Melchizedek heard his mother chattering and emerged from the woods. Mary was not alert enough to see Melchizedek follow her back inside. He decided he could dance to the music as well as the Rebekahs and you can see a video of him dancing here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=DeQ1DN7n2Eg, he has a few friends with him in this scene.

By six o'clock the party was starting to wind down when Barney came to join them for refreshments. The wedding had been completely planned and the Ouija board predicted the next to marry (and it turned out to be accurate). Oh yes, when Barney arrived, Elizabeth had been saving two tea sandwiches for him in the kitchen, they disappeared. Any guesses on what happened to them? Think of a name starting with M.

Next month Barney and Elizabeth get married. The wedding will be attended by many Odd Fellows and Rebekahs. The world is still peaceful in 1922.

He made a concerted effort to recruit Odd Fellows in daily life, particularly from his church and was a welcoming force, often the first one to introduce himself, and others, whether it was to members at other Lodges in his district at installation, at session, or to members at Lodges that consolidated with Alma.

Burial was held in Grandview Cemetery, Johnstown, PA.

ODD FELLOWS AND REBEKAHS ASSOCIATION OF WESTERN PA 2017 SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The Odd Fellows and Rebekahs Association of Western Pennsylvania will continue offering \$3,000 scholarship awards to a maximum of four (4) students who fulfill the specified requirements of the Award. This will be the 12th consecutive year of the Award since its inauguration back in 2006. The committee also asks that the public be made aware of our Award by informing schools, colleges, newspapers, churches, etc. in your respective areas. Your cooperation and assistance in relaying this information will be very much appreciated. Hopefully, we will once again be honored in announcing the Awards to four qualified and worthy recipients this coming October.

The Awards, of course are being made to not only defray some of the cost associated with higher education, but also to help increase public awareness of the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs, and in turn, hopefully receiving petitions for membership to promote our great Order.

FYI....

To avoid any confusion or misunderstanding, the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs Association of Western Pennsylvania now offers two (2) <u>different</u> scholarship awards annually:

The original Scholarship Award is presented to four (4) recipients attending an accredited college/university to assist them financially in attaining an undergraduate degree in music, education, or any health related field. The applicant, or a living family relative, must be a member of the IOOF or Rebekahs of W. PA. An application and "Rules" for this Award are sent to all the lodges, encampments, and cantons in Western PA around mid/late May of each year. Notification of this award is also submitted to our monthly magazine, *The Odd Fellow and Rebekah Magazine*. The deadline for submission of the application is usually around the end of July of the same year. The recipients are then notified before or at the beginning of the fall semester.

The new "Graduate Scholarship" is presented to two (2) recipients attending (full/part-time) a graduate program in an accredited college/university to assist them financially in securing a degree in music, education, or any health related field beyond the undergraduate (4 yrs.) college level. Again, the applicant, or a living family relative, must be a member of the IOOF or Rebekahs of W. PA. Notification of the award will be submitted for publication in the Nov. and/or Dec. issue(s) of *The Odd Fellow and Rebekah Magazine*. An application and "Rules" for this award may be requested online or by mail at the address which will be given in the magazine article(s). The deadline for submission of the application will be around the end of January. The recipients are then notified around the end of February.

ODD FELLOWS AND REBEKAHS ASSOCIATION OF WESTERN PA 2017 GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The Odd Fellows and Rebekahs Association of Western Pennsylvania announced the recipients of the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs 2017 Graduate Scholarship Awards at their February 18, 2017 meting.
