TREASURER'S TALES - JUNE 2018

We have been following Barney's exploits on a month by month basis and we are now at June 1923. The big event in June 1923, was Harry Houdini freeing himself from a strait jacket while hanging upside down 40 feet in the air. The month began and ended, more or less, with the Phillies participating in baseball mega-events. On June 1 the Giants defeated the Phillies 22 to 5, with the Giants scoring in every inning. On June 28 the Dodgers held a 7 to 0 lead over the Phillies going into the bottom of the ninth, when the Phillies scored 8 runs in the bottom of the ninth to win the game. June 14, 1923 was flag day and it fell on Thursday. To make things work for most, the parade in Grover's Mill was held on Saturday, June 16, 1923. The youngest resident, Schuyler Colfax Wells, was unable to go to the parade, let alone participate. After the parade there was a picnic in the park, and the sleeping Schuyler made an appearance at the picnic. Everyone wanted to see the baby. It was the greatest diversion ever for a Flag Day picnic.

While everyone wanted to see the baby, our recurrent anti-hero, the mischievous Melchizedek observed the events from the top of an oak tree. Although the baby had replaced him as the center of attention, this created an opportunity. Melchizedek inspected the food tables from the tree tops. He waited and waited, till he saw an opening. As the crowd was split between the baby and a baseball game, he saw his opening. Melchizedek ran down, the tree, across a small opening, onto the picnic table, grabbed two pieces of chicken and ran back up the tree.

When the crowd made its way back to the table to begin the meal, the missing chicken made no impression. A large plate of fried chicken could easily hide the pilfering. Those dining at the picnic table with the chicken were blessed with remarks from the Grand Master of New Jersey, a frequent guest at lodge picnics. He rambled on throughout the meal, with few breaks to take a bite or two. He was in full form, explaining how he had done as much as Thomas Wildey to spread the Order in New Jersey, when a thigh bone fell from the tree above and hit him on the head.

This caused him to pause, but did not stop him. He contin-

ued to speak, unaware of the source of the interruption, since the bone fell onto his plate, to join several other chicken bones. Several people noticed the bone fall but did not react, they were in a haze from the droning of the speaker. Ten minutes later, the bony remains of a chicken breast fell from the tree, hitting the Grand Master's glass of lemonade and splattering four people in the area. This disclosed the source of the bombardment, with the lodge members becoming aroused by the wily raccoon.

The question became one of remediation. How could we evict Melchizedek from his lofty perch? There were two theories. The first was to chase him away. The second was to lure him down the tree and out to the woods. One slightly excitable brother even suggested shooting him out of the tree. His suggestion was not taken seriously.

Vic was the only animal behavior expert. He suggested it would be easier to vacate the table temporarily and make a trail of apple slices or some other sweet treat, leading the raccoon from the tree to the woods. There weren't very many apples, so the trail was to be made of grapes. Vic threw a grape up to Melchizedek, and started the trail to the woods. The plan seemed to be working, until some children at a distant table, decided they wanted to play with the raccoon. They started throwing popcorn and bits of cookies at Melchizedek. The chocolate chip cookies prevailed over the grapes. Vic didn't know what to do. He decided the youth from the other table would need to take responsibility for the raccoon, after all that table was populated by members of the Junior Order of United American Mechanics. Vic returned to his table and the meal played out as expected. The long, boring speeches finally ended and the picnic broke up after a fireworks display at 9:00 p.m.

The fireworks display was the engine of justice. The raccoon went up a tree by the cookie givers. Melchizedek was perched over the auto of one of the guilty parties. When the first skyrocket exploded, the raccoon, who was ill from too many cookies, lost his dinner. The car would take several hours of hard work to clean the canvas roof.

PAST GRAND MILES E. WEIDMAN HONORED FOR SERVICE TO HIS LODGE

At the Allentown Rally on April 7th, after receiving his Grand Lodge Degree 67 years after becoming a Past Grand, Brother Miles E. Weidman was honored by his Lodge with a 70 year jewel and pin, presented by Grand Master Sherman F. Wooden. A long name: Montgomery-Curtis-Norris Lodge #57, Miles is the last surviving member of the Lodge to have joined one of these three Lodges before their consolidation in 1954. Miles joined Montgomery Lodge No. 57, of Norris-



town, on April 5, 1948, and became a Past Grand October 2nd, 1950. Editor's note: Brother Miles actually brought his original Past Grand certificate from 1950 signed by Grand Secretary Frank Shannon. Back then the certificates were much larger than they are now. Back then, Lodges met once a week, so this is how he advanced so quickly. He has been an active member and is very valuable to the Lodge. At 90 years old, it was great for him to come to the rally and he was accorded a standing ovation for this efforts brought to the Odd Fellows.
